

## Market update, 15-31 July 2020

Because the COVID-19 pandemic and the mitigation measures put in place to reduce transmission and curb the spread of the virus may disrupt the functioning of markets in Uganda, WFP increased the coverage and intensity of its remote market monitoring system to collect near-real-time data on prices of food commodities in Karamoja, refugee areas and selected markets in the rest of the country to better inform decision making.

For markets in Karamoja and the rest of the country, prices of key national staples including maize, beans, and sorghum are monitored. In Karamoja, the price of goats is also monitored. For refugee settlement markets, the price of the food commodities that constitute the WFP General Food Assistance (GFA) food basket<sup>1</sup> (maize grain, beans, vegetable oil and salt) are monitored and the price of the GFA food basket is compared with the GFA cash transfer value to gauge the purchasing power of refugees that receive the GFA as cash.

## Key Highlights

### 1. Refugee Settlement Markets

- Overall, the market price of the WFP GFA food basket increased marginally by 2 percent from the first half to the second half of July 2020. In the South West, the average market price of the food basket decreased by 3 percent whereas, in West Nile settlements, the average cost of the GFA food basket increased by 4 percent.
- Even with an increase in the price of the GFA food basket in the second half of July 2020, overall, the WFP transfer value could cover 100 percent of the cost of the reduced (70%) WFP GFA food basket. At the regional level, the WFP cash transfer value could cover 142 percent and 99 percent of the cost of the food basket in South West and West Nile regions respectively.
- Except in Lobule, Adjumani, Palabek and Rhino Camp settlements, the WFP cash transfer value was enough to meet the cost of the GFA food basket in all the other refugee settlements in the country.
- In the second half of July 2020, the GFA food basket was most expensive in Lobule, Adjumani and Palabek, where the WFP cash transfer value could only cover 81 percent, 88 percent and 92 percent of the cost of the food basket respectively.
- In Rhino Camp, Adjumani and Lobule, the price of the WFP GFA food basket has been consistently higher than the WFP transfer value for the past 3 months.
- The average price of maize grain, vegetable oil and salt remained stable from the first to the second half of July 2020. The average price of beans increased by 8 percent during the same period.

### 2. Karamoja Markets

- Across all reference markets in Karamoja, the average price of maize grain remained stable from the first half to the second half of July 2020, after a decrease of 7 percent from June to the first half of July 2020.
- From the first to the second half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum grain decreased by 5 percent, after registering a 9 percent decrease from June to the first half of July 2020.
- The average price of beans in the second half of July 2020 decreased by 8 percent compared to the first half of July 2020. From June to the first half of July 2020, the price of beans reduced by 6 percent after declining by 9 percent from May to June 2020.

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<sup>1</sup> Starting April 2020, WFP implemented a 30 percent ration cut for refugees, reducing by the same proportion the food quantities in the in-kind food basket and the cash transfer value for beneficiaries receiving the assistance in cash. To accurately portray the current situation, this bulletin tracks the cost of the reduced food basket against the reduced cash transfer value.

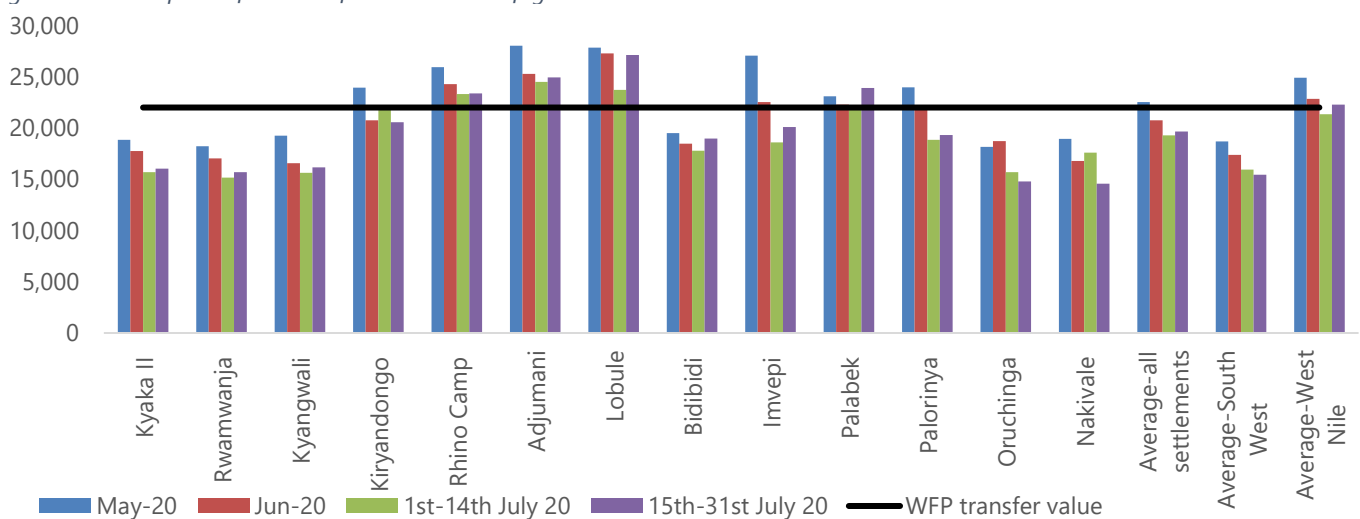
### 3. Key Markets in the Rest of the Country

- The average price of maize grain remained stable from the first half (UGX 1,035/kg) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 1,010/kg), after decreasing by 11 percent from June to the first half of July 2020.
- The average price of beans remained stable from the first half (UGX 3,518/kg) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 3,514/kg), after declining by 4 percent from June to the first half of July 2020.
- In the second half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum decreased marginally by 2 percent from the first half of July 2020, after decreasing by 9 percent from June to the first half of July 2020.

### Market Price of the GFA Food Basket in Refugee Settlement Markets

- In almost all settlements, the market price of the GFA food basket in the second half of July was higher than that of the first half of July 2020. Overall, the market price of the WFP GFA food basket increased marginally by 2 percent from UGX 19,276 in the first half of July to UGX 19,655 in the second half of July 2020 (Figure 1).
- Even with an increase in the price of the GFA food basket, when averaged for all settlements, the WFP transfer value could cover 100 percent of the cost of the reduced (70%) WFP GFA food basket during the second half of July 2020.
- The average cost of the food basket in the second half of July 2020 decreased by 5 percent and 13 percent respectively compared to June and May 2020.
- In South West settlements<sup>2</sup>, the average market price of the food basket decreased by 3 percent from UGX 15,954 in the first half of July to UGX 15,443 in the second half of July 2020. The WFP transfer value was enough to cover the cost of the WFP food basket in all settlements in the Southwest.
- In West Nile settlements<sup>3</sup>, the average market price of the GFA food basket increased by 4 percent from UGX 21,353 in the first half of July to UGX 22,289 in the second half of July 2020. The WFP transfer value could thus cover only 98 percent of the cost of the GFA food basket during the second half of July 2020.
- Except in Lobule, Adjumani, Palabek and Rhino Camp settlements, the WFP cash transfer value was enough to meet the cost of the GFA food basket in all the other refugee settlements in the country.
- In the second half of July 2020, the GFA food basket was most expensive in Lobule (UGX 27,126), Adjumani (UGX 24,924) and Palabek (UGX 23,901). In these settlements, the WFP cash transfer value could only cover 81 percent, 88 percent and 92 percent of the cost of the food basket respectively.
- For the current reference period, the food basket was least expensive in Nakivale (UGX 14,568), Oruchinga (UGX 14,782) and Rwamwanja (UGX 15,682) settlements where the WFP cash transfer value could cover 151 percent, 149 percent and 140 percent of the cost of the GFA basket respectively.

Figure 1: Market price of the GFA food basket in refugee settlements



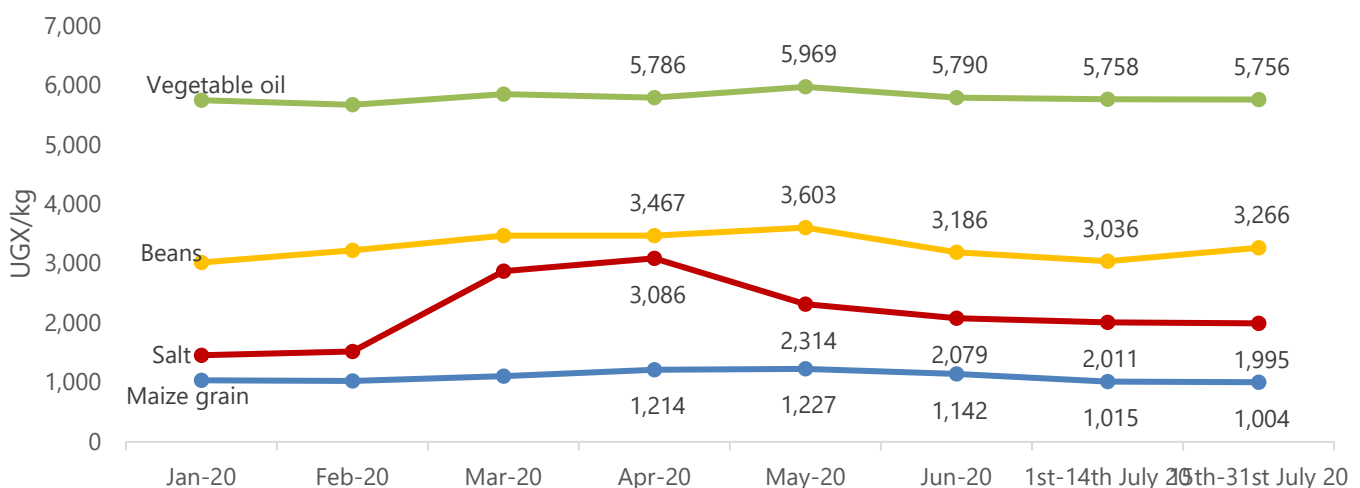

## Price Trend of GFA Food Basket Commodities in Refugee Settlement Markets

- Average maize grain price across all the settlements remained stable from the first half of July (UGX 1,015/kg) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 1,004/kg), after decreasing by 11 percent from June 2020 to the first half of July 2020 (.). The first season harvest of maize grain increased the availability of maize grain in the market and consequently led to a price decline.
- In all settlements except Lobule, the average price of maize grain in the second half of July 2020 was lower than that of July 2019. Average maize grain in the second half of July 2020 was 31 percent lower than that of July 2019.
- The average price of beans increased by 8 percent from UGX 3,036 in the first half of July to UGX 3,266 in the second half of July 2020. The average price of beans had declined by 5 percent from June to the first half of July 2020, and by 12 percent from May to June 2020. The first season harvest of beans continued to cause a decline in the average price of beans in the refugee settlement markets.
- The average price of beans across all settlements in the second half of July 2020 was higher than that of July 2019 by 8 percent. In Rhino camp and Imvepi settlement markets, the average price of beans in the second half of July 2020 was substantially higher than that of July 2019 by 38 percent and 24 percent respectively. However, in Nakivale settlement, the average price of beans in the second half of July 2020 was 25 percent higher than that of July 2019.
- The average price of vegetable oil remained stable from the first half to the second half of July 2020 but was 7 percent higher than that of July 2019. The average price of salt was stable from the first half to the second half of July 2020 but was 31 percent higher than that of July 2019 (figure 2).

Figure 2: Average prices of commodities in refugee settlement markets

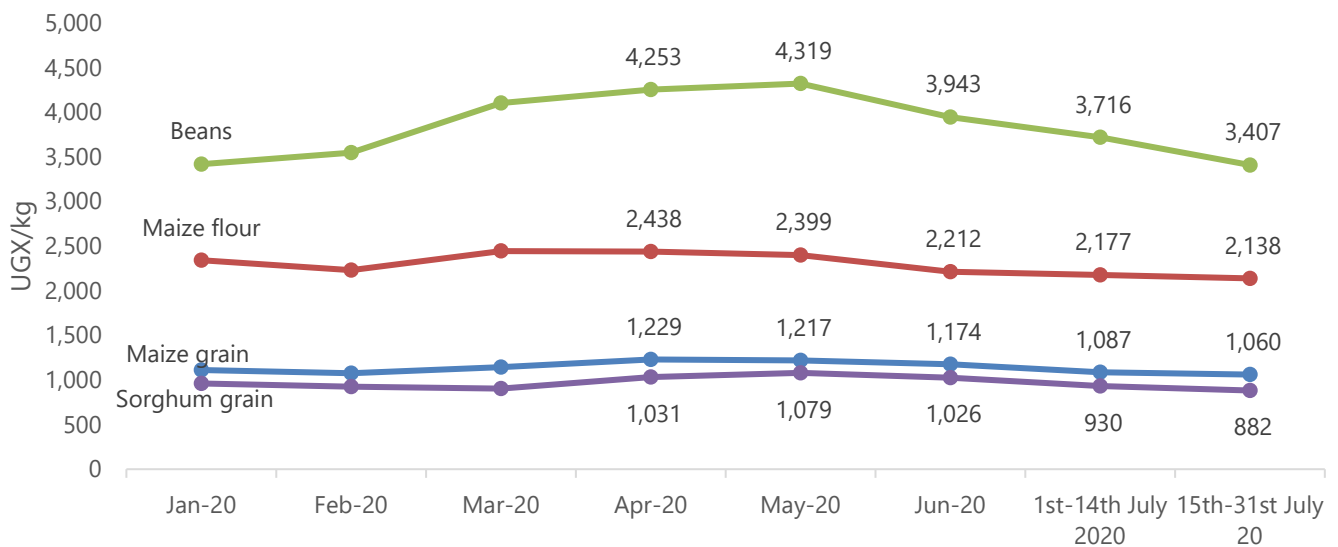


## Price Trend of Key Staples in Karamoja Markets

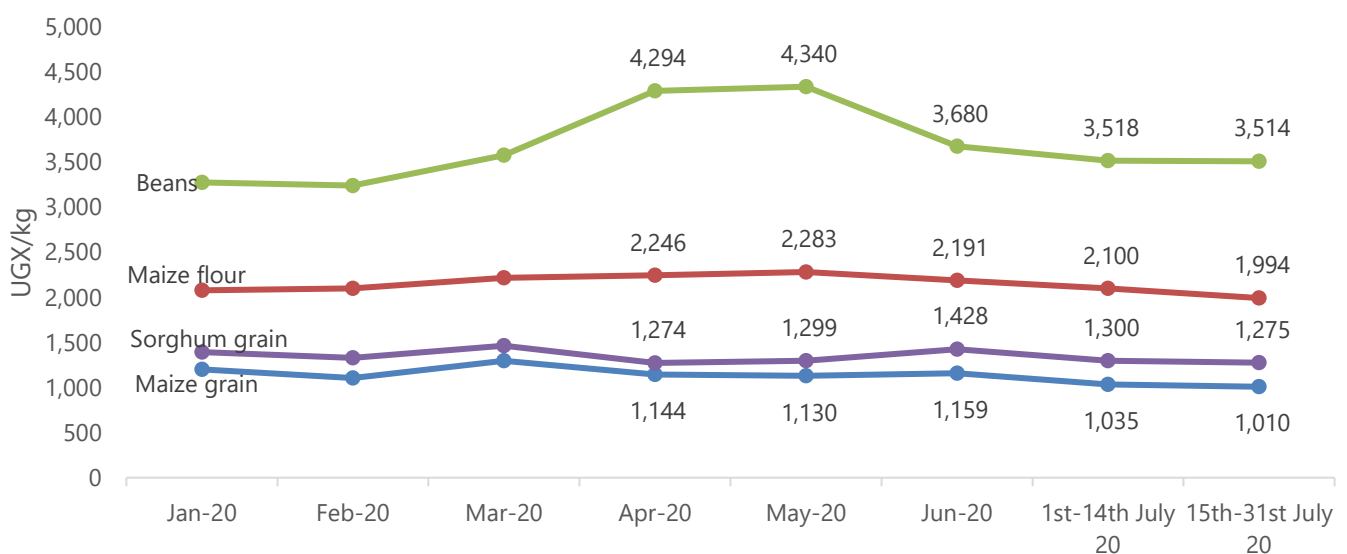
Figure 3: Average prices of key commodities in Karamoja

- Across all reference markets in Karamoja, the average price of maize grain remained stable from the first half of July (UGX 1,087/kg) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 1,060/kg), after a decrease of 7 percent from June to the first half of July 2020, and a 3 percent decrease from May to June 2020 (Figure 3). The average price of maize grain is expected to continue to decline as supply from the first season harvest in most parts of the country increases.
- The average price of maize grain across all reference markets in the second half of July 2020 was 21 percent lower than that of July 2019. In Kaabong and Napak, the average price of maize in the second half of July 2020 was lower than that of July 2019 by 33 percent and 31 percent respectively.
- From the first to the second half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum grain decreased by 5 percent, after registering a 9 percent decrease from June to the first half of July 2020. The average price of sorghum across reference markets was 31 percent lower than that of July 2019.
- The average price of beans in the second half of July 2020 across all reference markets in Karamoja decreased by 8 percent compared to the first half of July 2020. From June to the first half of July 2020, the price of beans reduced by 6 percent after declining by 9 percent from May to June 2020. The first season harvest of 2020 continues to cause a decline in the average price

of beans, whose price had consistently increased from January to May 2020. In all reference markets, the average price of beans in the first half of July 2020 was either lower or equal to that of June 2020. However, compared to July 2019, the average price of beans was 4 percent lower.

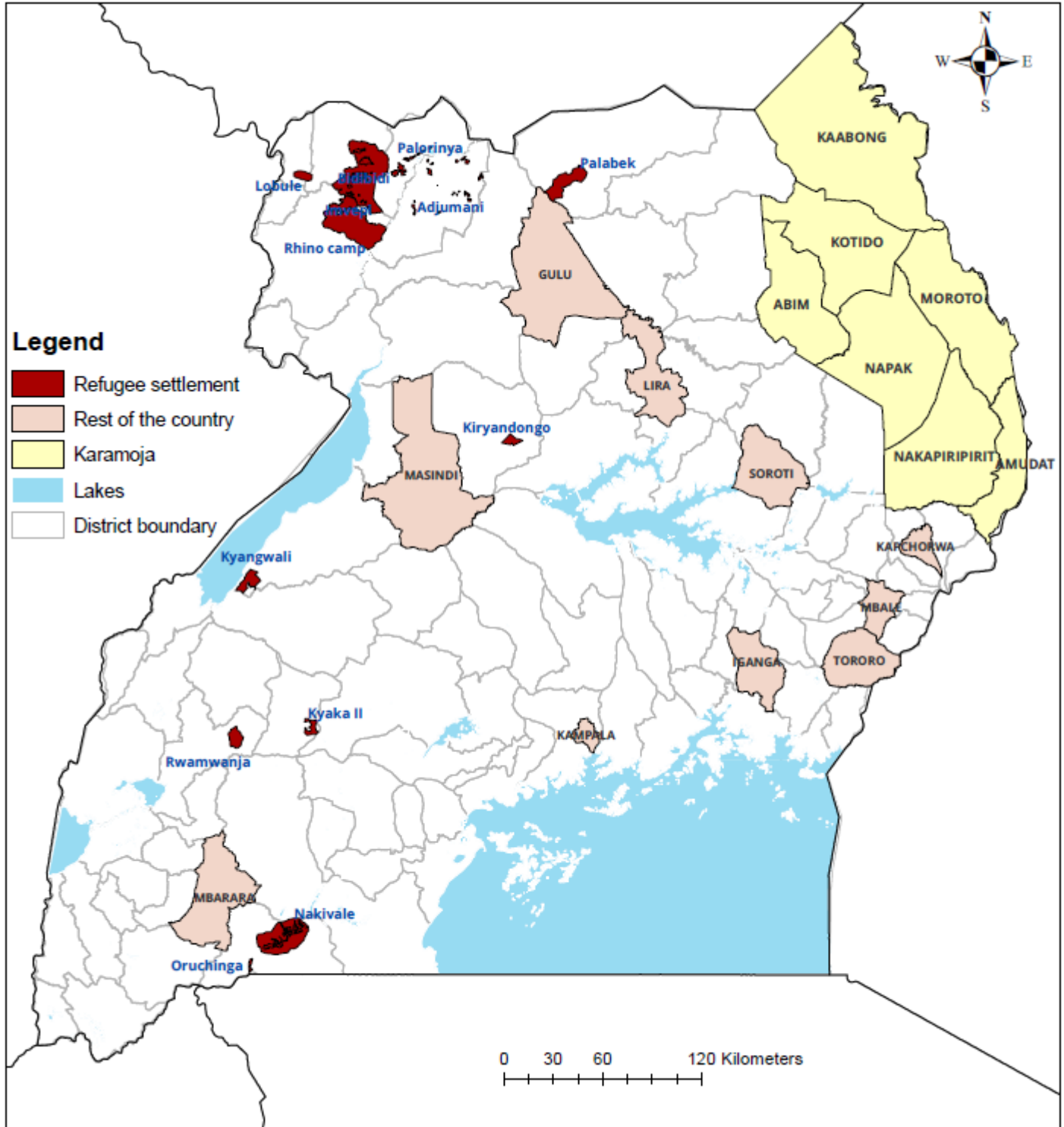
### Price Trend of Key Staples in Key Markets in the Rest of the Country

- The average price of maize grain remained stable from the first half (UGX 1,035) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 1,010), after decreasing by 11 percent from June to the first half of July 2020 (Figure 4). The average price of maize grain in the second half of July 2020 was 33 percent lower than that of July 2019.
- In the second half of July 2020, the average price of sorghum decreased marginally by 2 percent from the first half of July 2020, after decreasing by 9 percent from June to the first half of July 2020. Average sorghum prices had remained stable from April to May 2020 and increased by 10 percent from May to June 2020. The average price of sorghum in the second half of July 2020 was 18 percent higher than that of 2019 (Figure 4).
- The average price of beans remained stable from the first half (UGX 3,518) to the second half of July 2020 (UGX 3,514), after declining by 4 percent from June to the first half of July 2020. The average price of beans had registered a 15 percent decline from May to June 2020.
