

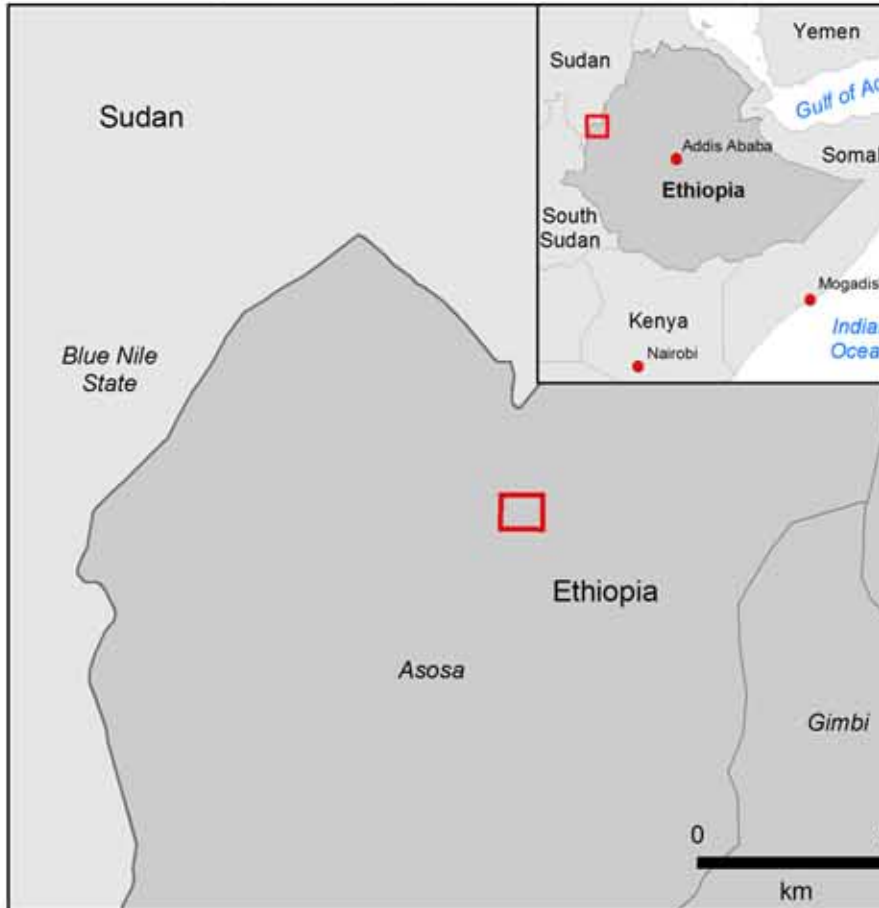

Interpretation

Adimazin Transit Camp in Ethiopia was established in October 2011 after thousands of civilians have started fleeing from fighting in Blue Nile State of Sudan. The camp is located in Ethiopia about 20 km away from the Sudanese border and has reached a population of 3,132 Sudanese refugees in November 2011. UNHCR provides protection and monitors the delivery of services.

This map shows the structure of Adimazin Camp based on analysis of a WorldView-2 satellite image of November 7, 2011.

All visually interpreted features are captured with best effort but in some cases may not be complete.
