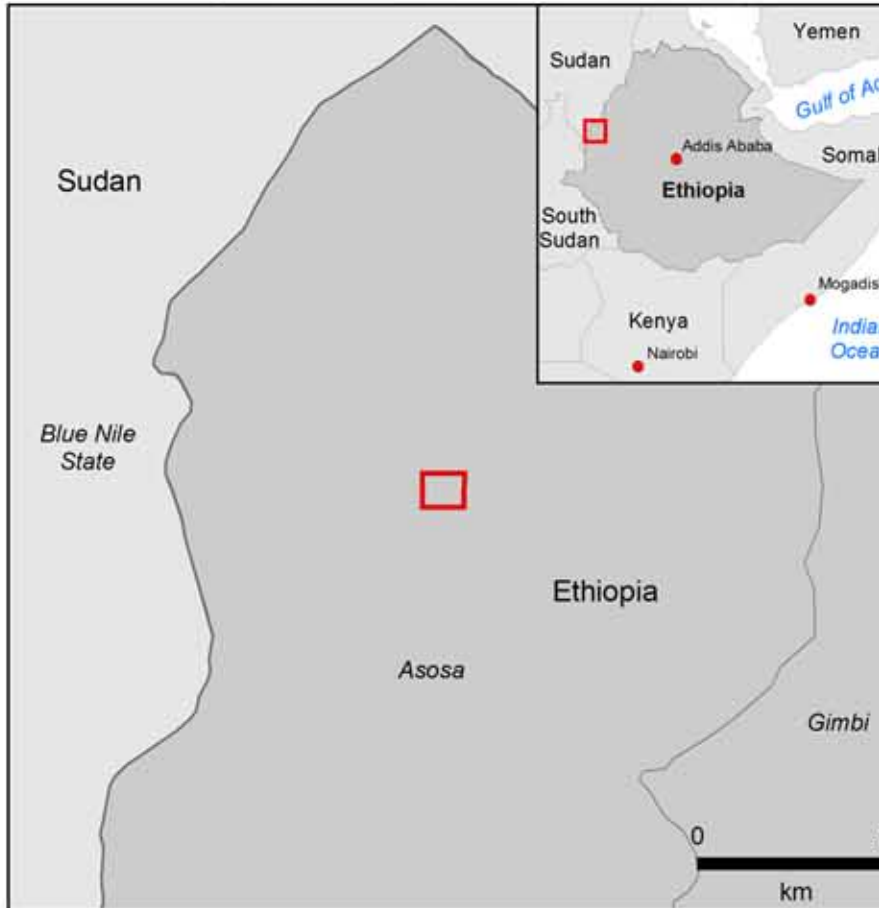

Interpretation

Sherkole Camp in Ethiopia was opened in October 1997 and has been home to about 4,000 Sudanese refugees after the end of Sudan's civil war in 2005. Since September 2011 thousands of civilians have fled the fighting in Blue Nile state of Sudan and Sherkole Refugee Camp has reached a population of 8,891 in November 2011. UNHCR provides protection and monitors the delivery of services, while camp management is done by ARRA (Ethiopia's Administration for Refugee and Returnee Affairs) with support from UNHCR. This map shows the structure of Sherkole Camp, based on analysis of a World View-2 satellite image of November 7, 2011.

All visually interpreted features are captured with best effort but in some cases may not be complete.
