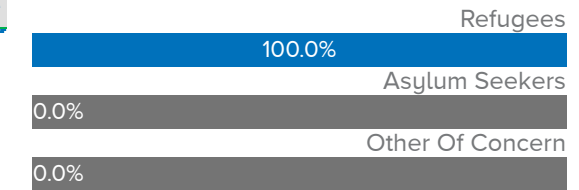

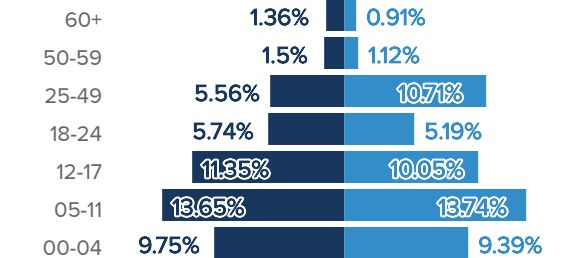

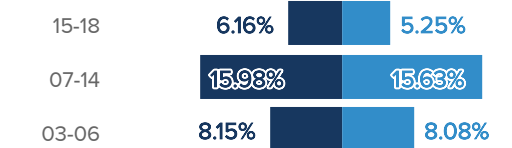
POPULATION BY STATUS
