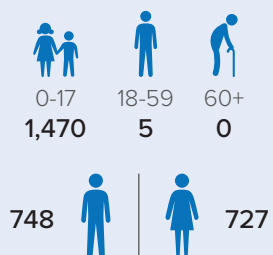

### Breakdown by Age & Gender



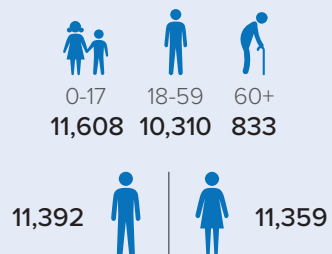

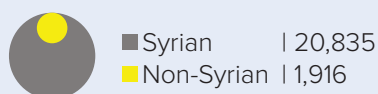

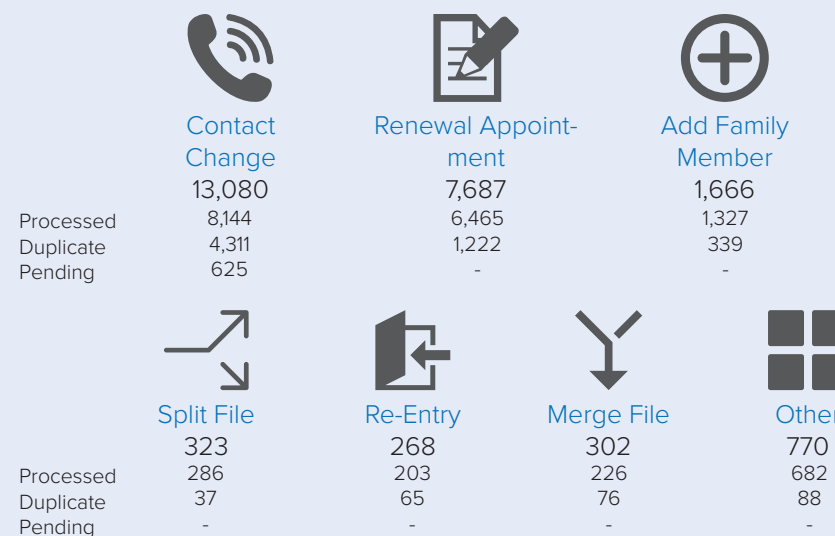
### Breakdown of Referrals by Nationality

The Registration Unit developed a country-wide backlog clearance plan which aimed at scaling up the remote renewal and data update activities to ensure that refugees will have valid documents after the expiration of the grace period afforded by the Government of Jordan.

Poor quality of the documents shared by refugees via Signal and WhatsApp and lack of the provision of all pages of documents remained a challenge.

While the new referral management system specific for changing/updating contact number has improved the reachability rate, reaching Persons of Concern remains a challenge particularly among those whose Asylum Seeker Certificates expired before 2019.

The Registration Unit and the Community Based Protection team were exploring the possibility to deliver the Asylum Seeker Certificates to Persons of Concern residing in Southern Province.
