

### UNHCR continues to receive new arrivals in East Sudan, largely from Eritrea. The Commission of Refugees (COR) receives and assists asylum-seekers at the border where they are temporarily hosted in reception centres.

Within 1-2 weeks they are transported to Shagarab camps where they undergo screening, registration, and Refugee Status Determination (RSD) while receiving life-saving services and shelter.








### Eritrean Refugees and Asylum-seekers Per State




## Un-registered Age-gender Breakdown<sup>3</sup>






### New Arrivals Trends (2018 - 2021)
