





MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION CLUSTER

- In April 2021, 635 protection incidents were recorded by the protection monitoring system, 223 more incidents than in March. The region of Mopti remains the most affected by these incidents (58%) followed by Timbuktu (18%), and Gao (11%).
- On 26 April, the Protection Cluster shared the infographic on the protection situation for the period January March 2021. It highlights key data for analysing the protection environment.
- From 18 March to 14 April, the Protection Cluster Coordinatio and NGOs AMSODE and AVS, with the support of UNHCR, conducted sensitization sessions on the Kampala Convention, in relation to the protection and assistance to internally displaced persons in Bamako sites (Nimana, Senou, Faladiè, Mabilé center). The objective of the session was to exchange with the IDPs on the content of the Kampala Convention and the drafting of the draft law in Mali. 16 sessions were held and 240 IDPs were reached by these sessions and radio spots were broadcast on these sessions.

PROTECTION

Mixed Movements:

- In April, 1,204 persons on the move were identified in mixed flows, including 560 across Gao, Menaka, and Kidal, 409 in Mopti and Segou, and 235 in Timbuktu. Among them, 44 persons, from Mali, Guinea and Niger, returned from Algeria. No unaccompanied or separated children or persons seeking asylum in Mali were identified during the period in question.
- UNHCR conducted 42 sensitization sessions on various themes related to mixed movements, reaching a total of 665
 persons on the move, including 475 men and 190 women.

Gender-Based Violence:

- In Mopti, AMSS and ACEF, UNHCR's partners, led two sensitization sessions on GBV, "forced and / or early marriage", reaching 55 people including 32 women, ten men, six girls and seven boys.
- In Wallirde, Mopti region, UNHCR and its partners conducted sensitization on GBV, reaching 51 people, including 26 men and boys, aged 16 to 61, and 25 women and girls aged 13 to 46.
- UNHCR and its partners distributed dignity kits to 50 women and teenage girls.
- In Timbuktu, UNHCR, through its partner AMSS, conducted two sensitization sessions on early marriage, reaching 52 people including 27 women, 15 girls, 10 boys.
- UNHCR and its partners conducted three sensitization sessions on GBV prevention, reaching 50 people, including 42 women, 4 girls and 4 men.
- 12 radio messages in three languages on GBV and its consequences were broadcasted.

Child Protection:

 In Ansongo and Menaka, two recreational sessions were conducted on peace themes, with educational games, poems, and sketches.

Reception and Orientation:

 In April, UNHCR received and oriented three refugees, including two men and a woman. Their requests focused on documentation, asylum, resettlement, and WASH needs. They were provided with the necessary information and guidance.

Self-reliance and inclusion

On 6 April, the monthly meeting was held with partners and urban refugees in Bamako, on income-generating activities (IGA). It was the opportunity to present to the refugees the results of a study conducted by AMSODE on promising sectors, with a view to orienting future requests. The new IGA management strategy, which relies on more comprehensive support for beneficiaries, was also explained and was well received by the representatives of the refugees.

Durable Solutions:

On 8 April, UNHCR submitted its 2022 annual chapter on the resettlement needs for Mali. It mentions the target
populations and the planned figures, to allow advocacy for resettlement quotas in resettlement countries.

WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

 From January to April 2021, UNHCR implemented one successful drilled borehole equipped with an Improved Rural Hydraulic System (SHVA) of Solar pumping potable water in a Djidara school, Gao region.

SHELTER AND NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs)


- From January to April 2021, 70 IDP households were dwelled in emergency shelters, in Sokolo and Dougouba, Segou region.
- From January to April 2021, 1,020 IDP families, in Mopti, were provided with NFI kits, containing kitchen sets, mosquito nets, jerricans, buckets, mattresses, blankets and solar lamps. Furthermore 800 emergency shelters and NFI kits were provided to 794 IDP households in Mopti.
- From January to April 2021, 170 refugee returnee, 86 Refugee and 281 IDP households; of respectively 755, 499 and 1,450 persons were provided with 537 emergency shelters (family tents). Additionally, 231 households; of 1,287 people (499 refugees and 788 IDPs), were supported with NFI kits, in Gao region.

Financial Information

UNHCR is grateful for the critical support provided by donors who have contributed to this operation as well as those who have contributed to UNHCR programs with unearmarked and broadly earmarked funds.

Total recorded contributions for the operation amount to some US\$ 7,562,544 million.
