### COVID-19 RESPONSE (as of end of September)

- ◆ **7,643** refugees vaccinated (at least one dose)
- ◆ **14,899** refugees registered on the MoH platform to be vaccinated
- ◆ **1,297** confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak
- ◆ **9** active cases, **1,269** recovered cases
- ◆ In-camp vaccination centre operating as of 15 March 2021
- ◆ Enhanced communication, awareness raising and community outreach on the vaccination programme
- ◆ Continuous surveillance, monitoring and tracing of positive cases

### KEY FACTS & FIGURES

- ◆ **73%** of school-aged children currently enrolled in education
  - 12,029 children from KG2 to Grade 12 (**49%** female) enrolled in formal education
  - 293 children (**54%** female) enrolled in MoE-recognized non-formal education (as of August 2021)
- ◆ **4,140** work permits registered in the database, including **1,173** females
- ◆ **1,876** refugees, including **46%** female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Volunteer (IBV) scheme
- ◆ **375** formal shops owned by refugees and host community
- ◆ **5,726** average weekly health consultations per week

- ◆ **24,858** refugees registered on the MoH platform to be vaccinated
- ◆ **2,350** confirmed COVID-19 cases since the start of the outbreak
- ◆ **14** active cases, **2,311** recovered cases
- ◆ Two in-camp vaccination centres operating as of 15 March 2021
- ◆ Enhanced communication, awareness raising and community outreach on the vaccination programme
- ◆ Continuous surveillance, monitoring and tracing of positive cases

### KEY FACTS & FIGURES

- ◆ **21,375** children currently enrolled in education (MOE-EMIS 2020-2021)
  - 91 KG2 classrooms benefitting **2,048** children | non-formal education benefitting **452** students
  - 6,015** children benefitting from integrated learning support offered by UNICEF Makani centres
- ◆ **32** schools and **58** community centres
- ◆ **14,466** work permits (appx. **41%** of Zaatari's working-age population), including **22%** female
- ◆ **3,670** refugees, including **39%** female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Volunteer (IBV) scheme
- ◆ **7,614** average weekly health consultations, **96** referrals per week
- ◆ **2,000** households will be eligible for shelter repair project in 2021, **1,430** caravans have been repaired
