

COVID-19 RESPONSE (as of end of December)

- 12,690 refugees vaccinated (at least one dose)
- ◆ 17,236 refugees registered on the MoH platform to be vaccinated
- ◆ 1,532 confirmed cases of COVID-19 since the start of the outbreak
- ◆ 15 active cases, 1,498 recovered cases
- In-camp vaccination centre operating as of 15 March 2021
- Enhanced communication, awareness raising and community outreach on the vaccination programme
- Continuous surveillance, monitoring and tracing of positive cases

KEY FACTS & FIGURES

- ◆ 12,029 children currently enrolled in education (76% of children)
 - 12,029 children from KG2 to Grad 12 (49% female) enrolled in formal education
 - 349 children (48% female) enroled in MOE- accredited non-formal education
 - 5,080 children benefitting from integrated learning support offered by UNICEF Makani centers
- ◆ 15 schools and 8 KGs
- ◆ 4,178 work permits (appx. 30% of Azraq's working-age population), including 1,183 female
- ◆ 1,887 refugees, including 43% female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Voluneer (IBV) scheme
- ◆ 5,391 average weekly health consultations
- ◆ 497 shelters were repaired and maintained in December



- 26,789 refugees vaccinated (at least one dose)
- ◆ 27,203 refugees registered on the MoH platform to be vaccinated
- ◆ 2,789 confirmed COVID-19 cases since the start of the outbreak
- ◆ 34 active cases, 2,724 recovered cases
- Two in-camp vaccination centres operating as of 15 March 2021
- Enhanced communication, awareness raising and community outreach on the vaccination programme
- Continuous surveillance, monitoring and tracing of positive cases

- ◆ 21,906 children currently enrolled in education (76% of children)
 21,375 children from KG2 to Grad 12 (49% female) enrolled in formal education
 531 children (42% female) enrolled in MOE- accredited non-formal education
 8,178 children (51% female) registered in LSS 21 of whome with disability
- ◆ 32 schools, 7 KGs and 58 community centres
- ◆ 14,470 work permits (appx. 41% of Zaatari's working-age population), including 21.8% female
- ◆ 3,933 refugees, including 38% female, engaged in the Incentive-Based Voluneer (IBV) scheme
- ◆ 6,592 average weekly health consultations
- 2,007 shelters have been repaired and maintained
