 Total 28,969 calls to toll-free helpline during December 2021, out of which 12,046 calls were 	

 received during office hours. 9,244 calls handled by helpline agents and 4,058 calls abandoned due to busy queues. 42 Total 4,831 entries captured in the FRRM system during the month (2,686 new queries, 2,142 follow up entries), with 42% decrease from November. 1,749 queries resolved at helpline level, 941 referrals sent to UNHCR and partners. 376 referrals received in the month remained unopened at close of month. Locations with highest number of calls were Kampala (777), Nakivale (389), Kyaka (351) and Kyangwali (223) Of the new queries, Category 2 calls (i.e. queries resolved at helpline level based on FAQs) accounted for the majority of calls, at 65%, while Category 3 (i.e. queries or requests for assistance referred to UNHCR or partner focal points) comprised 34%. Outbound activities by FRRM call centre in2021: South Sudanese intention to return survey, participatory assessment data collection, support to CBI, quarterly post-distribution monitoring of soap and menstrual hygiene management kits

 Request for partner monthly reports to be shared in the first half of the following month. High number of calls from Kampala – since COVID-19 lockdown and cash assistance to urban refugees in 2020. Reason may be higher mobile phone possession and more stable phone network in Kampala Need for more community sensitization particularly in regions where uptake is low (i.e. West Nile region). Settlement level FRRM coordination groups have also been useful in dissemination.
