

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs reached a new high, increasing from 265,700 last week to 273,600 this week.

This is mainly due to the deterioration of the security situation in Kyaukkyi Township, Bago Region (East). In addition to some 12,700 people who were verified two weeks ago, partners managed to confirm the presence of an additional 5,000 IDPs in Kyaukkyi Township, 1400 in Taungoo Township and 400 in Htantabin Township. In addition, 86 people from Kyaukkyi Township were displaced to Thandaung town in Thandaungyi township, Kayin State. Verification is ongoing but impeded by access and security restrictions.

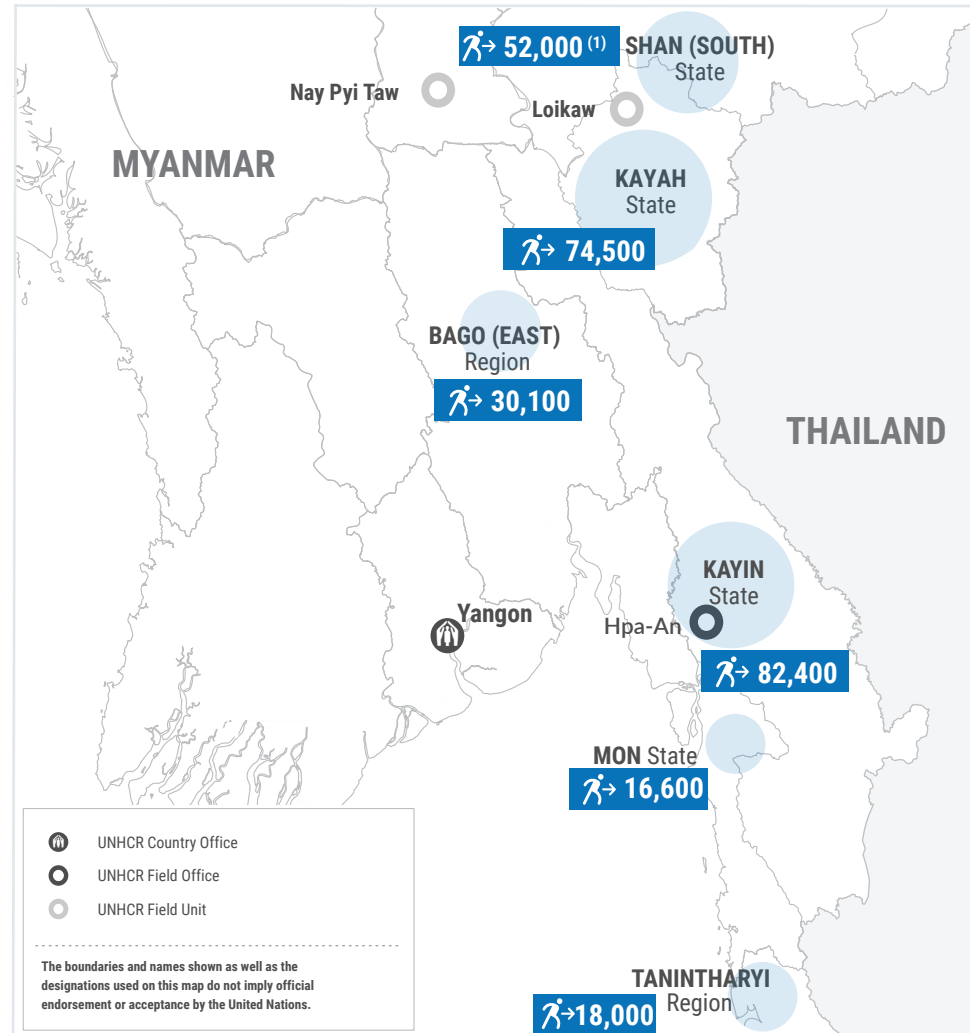
In Kayin State, the deterioration of the security situation resulted in over 800 people displaced within Myawaddy Township. Over 600 people in Hpapun Township sought safety in Hlaingbwe Township. However, some 500 people returned to Myawaddy Township from Thailand's Tak Province.

In Shan State (South), displacement remains very fluid with new displacements and returns reported by partners. Clashes in some parts of Pekon Township resulted in the forced displacement of over 900 people within the township and towards Pinlaung Township.

In parallel, some 500 IDPs from Pekon Township returned to their place of origin while about 600 IDPs returned to their places of origin in Loikaw Township in Kayah State.

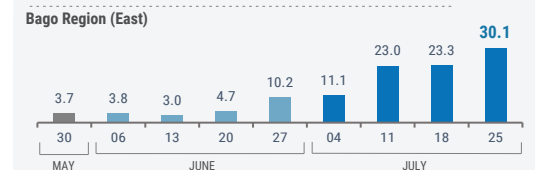
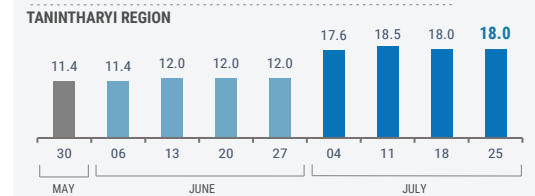
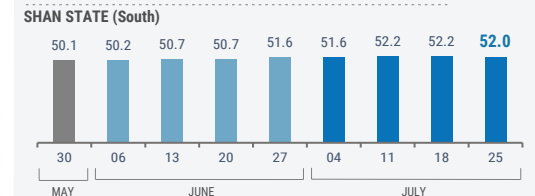
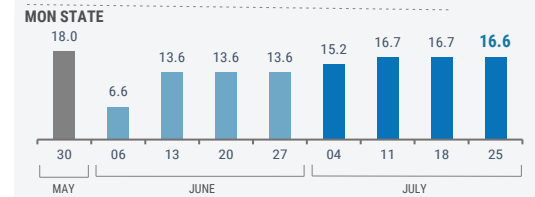
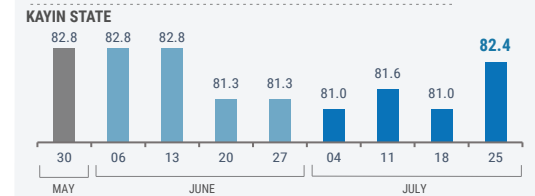
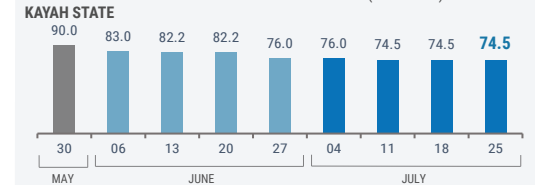
