


### ACHIEVEMENTS

- 8,013** new arrivals from South Sudan registered in Nguenyiel camp
- 8,760** babies added to their parents' households
- 673** absentees from 2019/20 verification reactivated
- 1,854** emergency shelters (for **9,270** individuals) provided to newly relocated
- 172** transitional shelters provided, with **57%** of refugees accommodated
- 5.47** km of access roads maintained; **1.3km** of new roads constructed and 9 concrete drainage culverts installed
- 106** individuals (**26** households) submitted for resettlement to: France (**45** persons/**11** HHs), Sweden (**25** persons/**7** HHs) and USA (**36** persons/**8** HHs)
- Emergency WASH services provided to over **8,000** newly arrived; average of **17.8** liters of safe water provided per person/day

- 13,205** identified children at risk (100%) benefited from case management services through best interest procedures
- 811** refugee youth benefited from tertiary education scholarships
- 250,138** Outpatient Department (OPD) consultations conducted (including 16% from host community)
- 110,492** refugees vaccinated against COVID-19
- 18** nutrition centres in **7** refugee camps established, providing comprehensive nutrition services for approximately **60,000** children below 5 years and **15,000** pregnant and lactating women
- Global acute malnutrition prevalence (**10.6%**) well below the critical threshold defined by WHO (**15%**).
- 9,641** refugees achieved agricultural inputs, self-employment opportunities and financial services
- 45** Village Saving and Loans associations set up, consisting of **1,037** members (**688** females), organized in 6 refugee camps



### MAIN CHALLENGES AND GAPS

- Fuel shortage impacting ability of partners to access camps and implement activities;
- Continuous food reduction - currently at 50% - compounded with intermittent security incidents across Gambella region;
- Procurement and delivery of goods and services extremely slow due to inflation;
- Only 23.8% of secondary school age children and youth enrolled in secondary education; percentage even lower for girls - 10.8%;
- Child-at-risk to caseworker ratio is 46:1 (standard 25:1);
- 93% of working age refugees have no access to livelihood opportunities
