The portable material is more discrete and will assist refugees in knowing where to ask for help and when.</p> <p>The Pocket-Cards will be ready to be printed and distributed to refugees by partners, and contractors in the following days. Ideally before the next PSEA TF meeting on 29 August. They will be available in Romanian, Russian, and English.</p>

Additional information such as locations, target partners requiring training, etc., are very important and should be provided. The PSEA TF can adjust material and learning objectives as needed. <p>A survey was conducted to analyze the trainings and improve them moving forward. The following comments are several participant’s feedback from the previous training.</p> <p>"I learned to distinguish between sexual abuse/exploitation and harassment. I understood again how important it is to report and do not be indifferent. To be more aware of what's happening around and to pay more attention."</p> <p>"Learning to be more conscious about PSEAH. Feeling more comfortable with the culture of reporting. Clarification of the method of reporting"</p> <p>"You have to report sexual abuse situations."</p> <p>"How to behave with a person who was sexually abused."</p> <p>"To whom we should report."</p>
