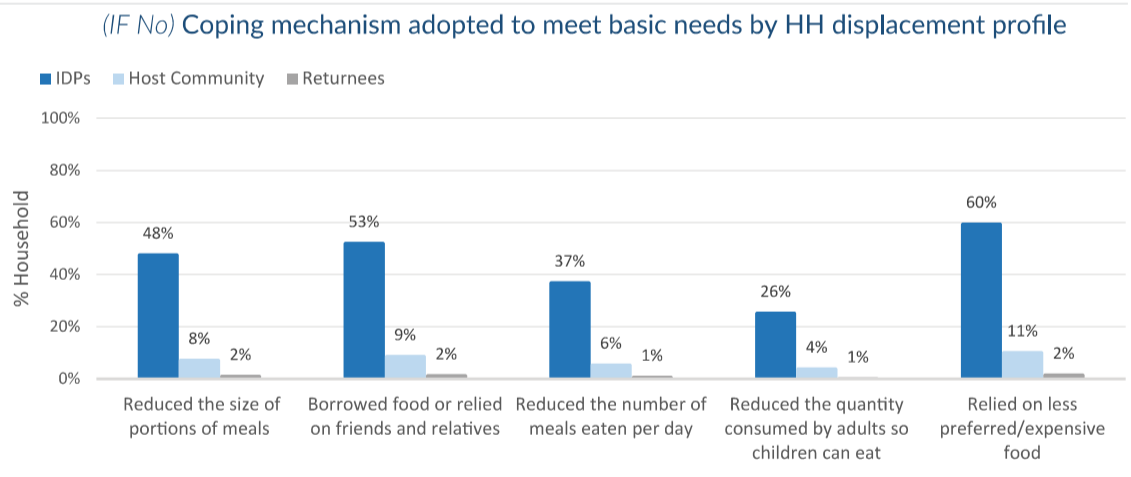
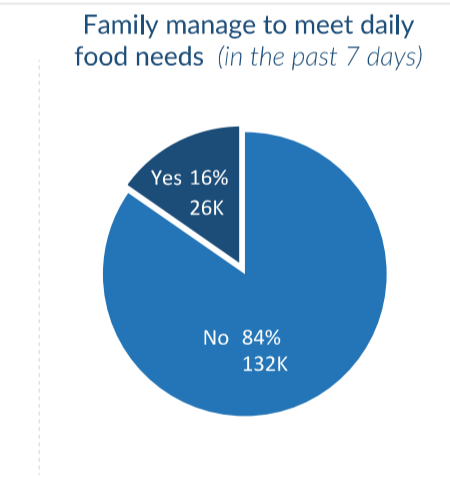
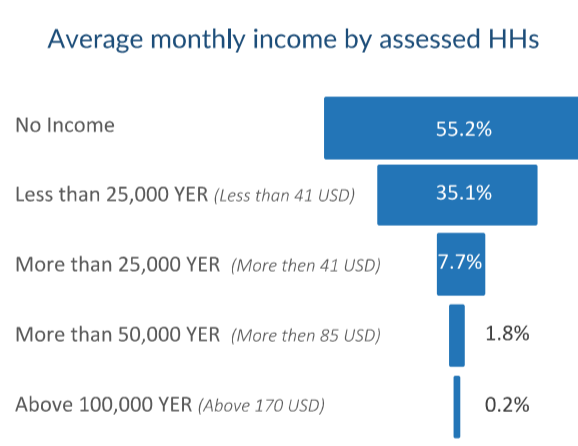
Breakdown of assessed households



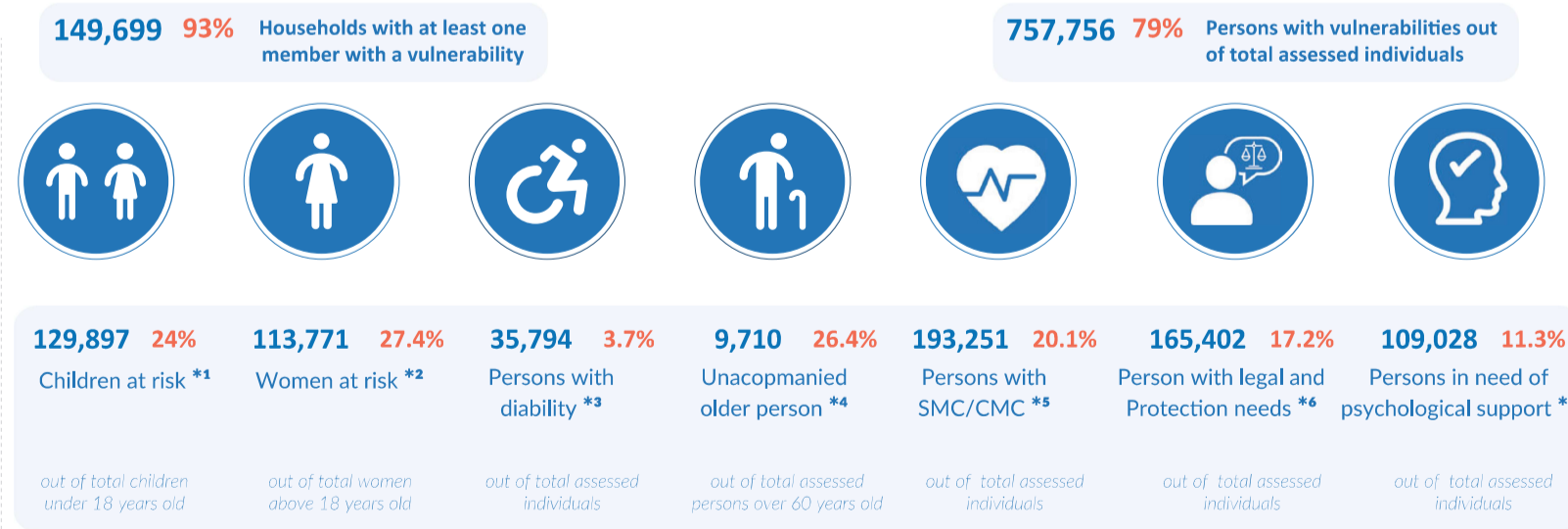
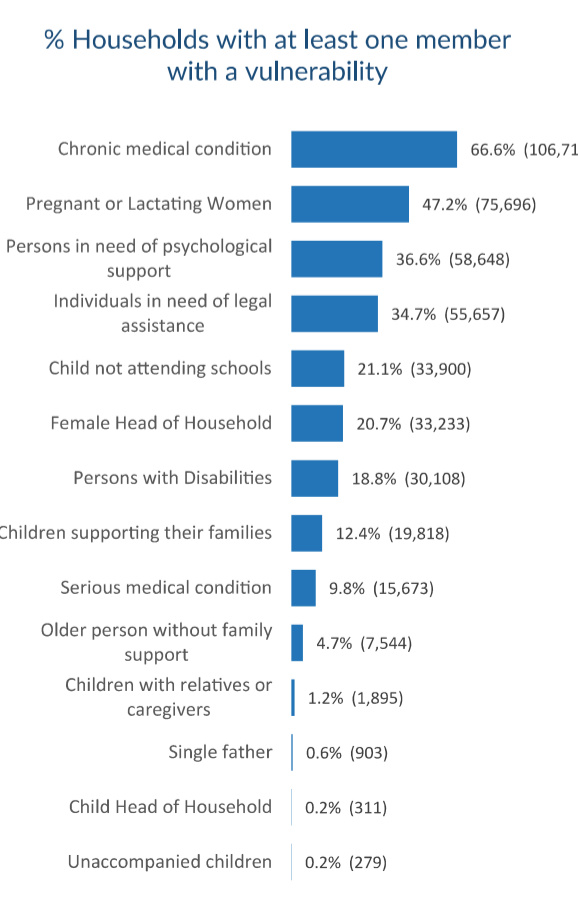

HHs received notification of eviction from their current shelter (last 6 months)

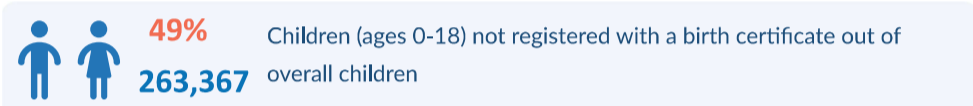
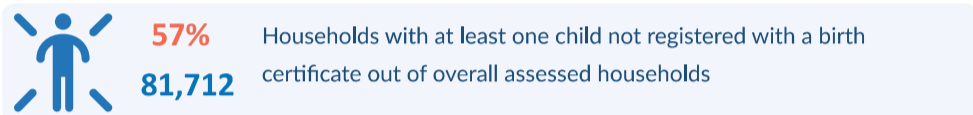

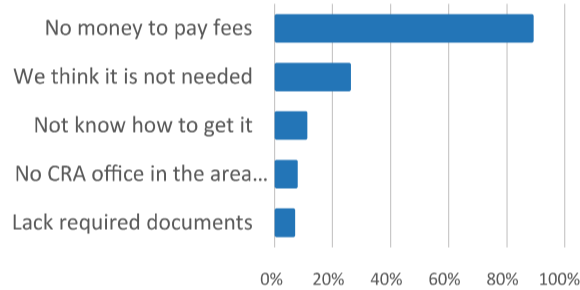

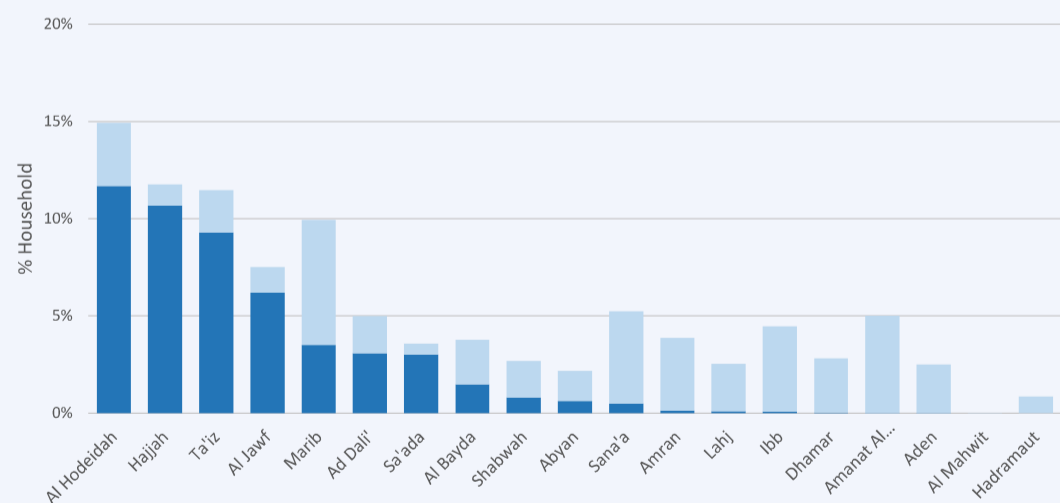

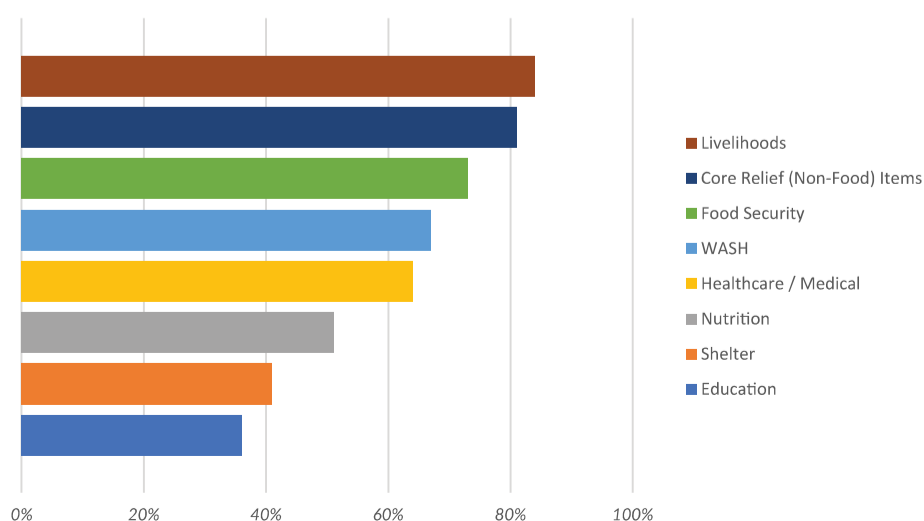
