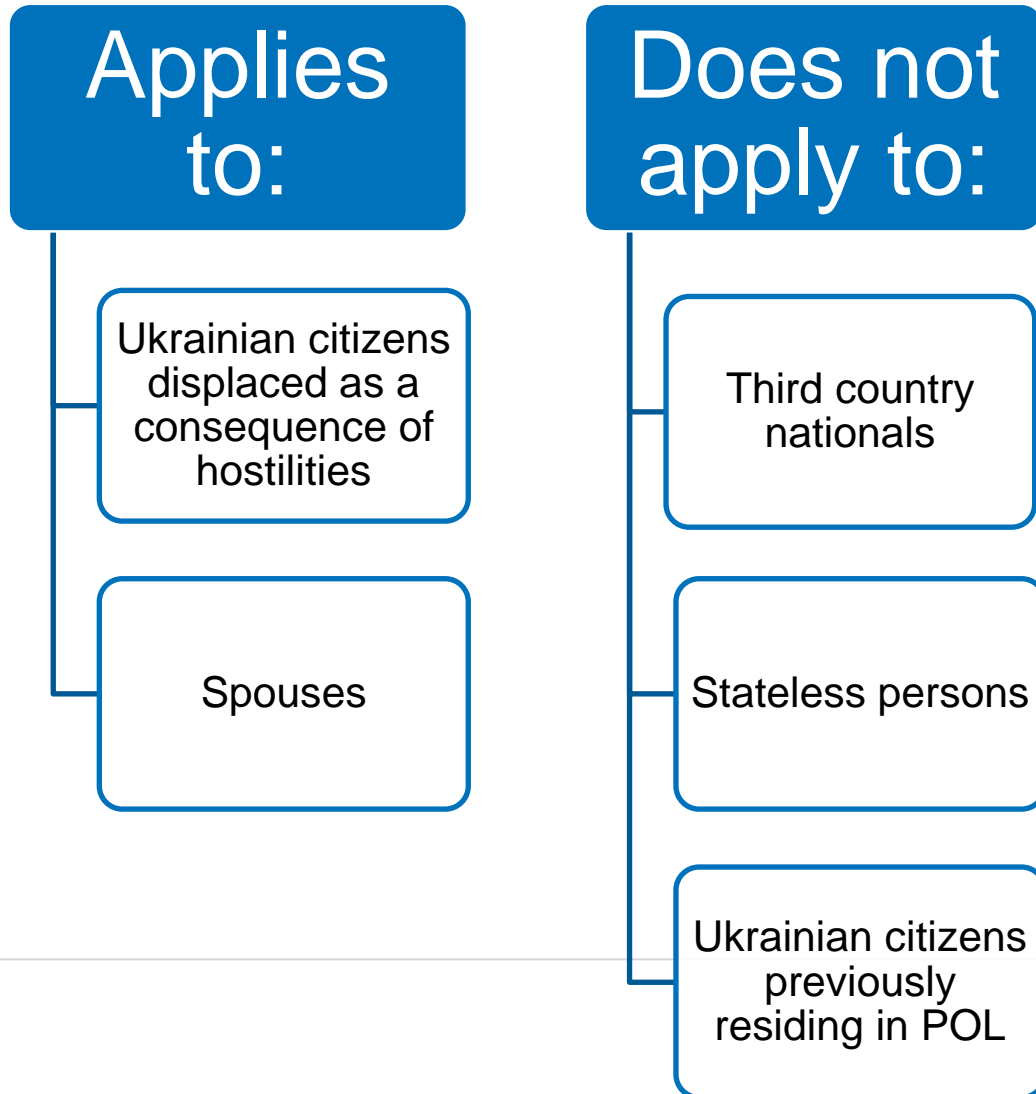

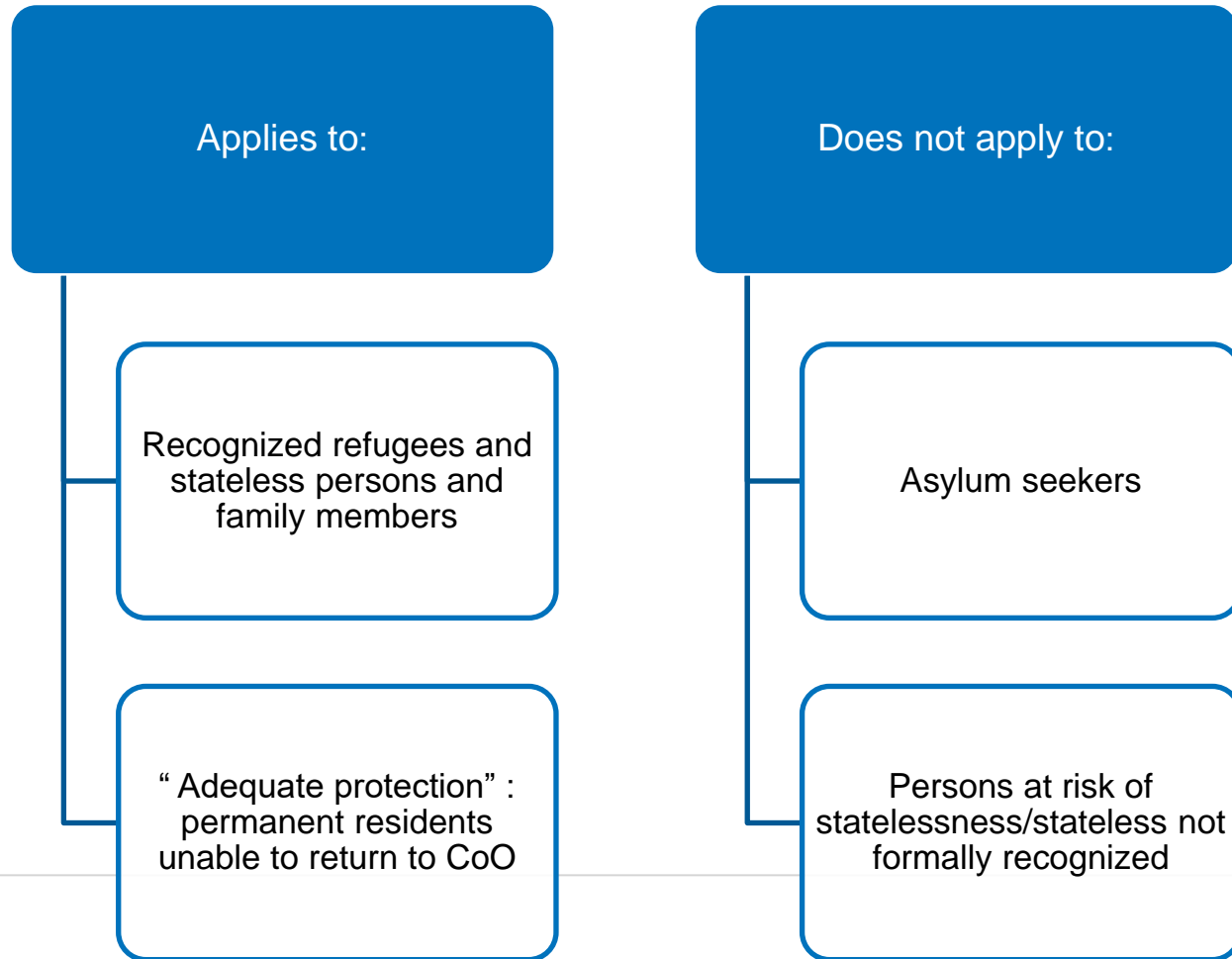

Scope – TPD/ Special Act



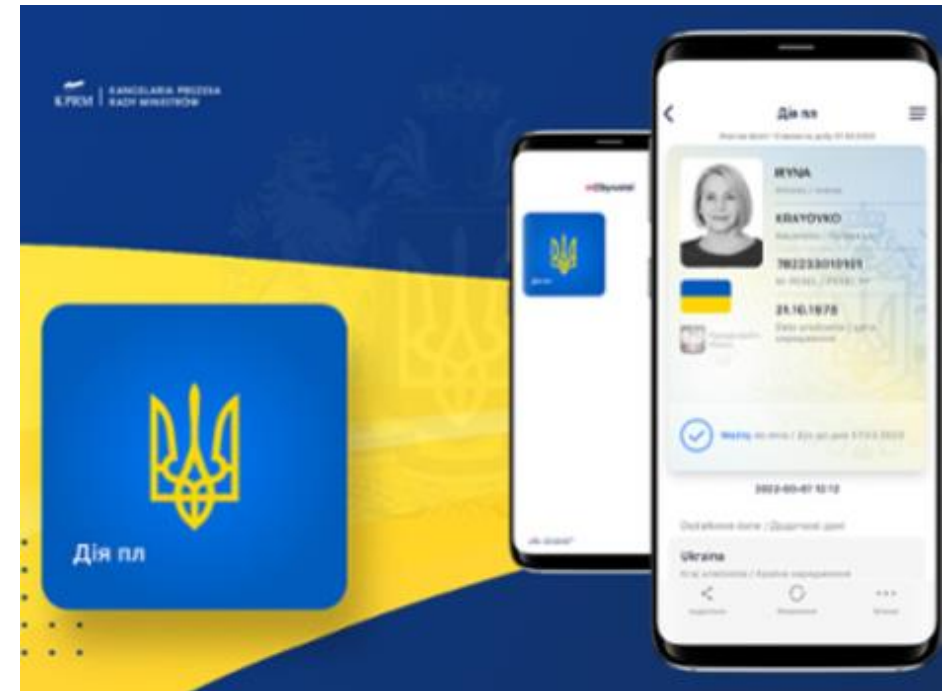
Scope – Temporary Protection Certificates

Act on granting protection to foreigners within the territory of the Republic of Poland of 13 June 2003



Status & Documentation

- **Status:** Temporary Protection holders
- **Duration:** stay is legal in Poland for 18 months from 24 February 2022 (until 24 August 2023)
- **Registration and documentation:**
 - PESEL Number – “UKR”
 - Diia.pl :
 - Digital travel document
 - Residence permit – Schengen Border’s Code Annex 22.
 - **Residence permit:**
 - 9 months after issuance of PESEL
 - Responsible authority: voivodships
 - Validity: 3 years



Confirming eligibility for TPD

Flexible requirements

- Travel document, and/or other documents with a picture enabling confirmation of identity
- In the absence of documents, the identity is confirmed based on a declaration.
- Date of entry: communication between Municipality and Border Guards



Return to Ukraine

- **Departure for over 30 days:** deprives TPD holders of the right to legally stay in Poland on the basis of the Act, unless persons are directed to perform work or services outside Poland by entities operating in Poland.
- **The UKR status can however be restored:**
 - ✓ if the person to whom the PESEL number was assigned confirms that his/her residency outside Poland did not last longer than 1 month;
 - ✓ **upon arrival on the territory of Poland** from the territory of Ukraine in the context of hostilities.
 - ✓ This entry should then be documented or registered in the register of Ukrainian nationals kept by the Commander-in-Chief of the Border Guard.
 - ✓ If this entry has occurred across the Polish border the re-establishment of UKR status is automatic;
 - ✓ as a result of a **renewed application for a PESEL number.**

Before issuance of a residence permit

- Right to move freely within the Union after being admitted into the territory for a 90-day period.
- Ability to choose the Member State in which they want to enjoy the rights attached to temporary protection and to join their family and friends across the significant diaspora networks that currently exist across the Union.

Special Act Poland

Before issuance of a residence permit

- Does not prohibit settling in another MS with a view of obtaining TP there

Move onwards into other EU MS

EC TPD Implementing Decision & Operational Guidance

After issuance of residence permit:

- Once a Member State has issued a residence permit, the person enjoying temporary protection has the [right to travel to other Member States](#) than the one issuing the residence permit for 90 days within a 180-day period.
- If such a person subsequently moves to another Member State, where s/he receives another residence permit under temporary protection, [the first residence permit issued and its ensuing rights must expire and be withdrawn](#),

Special Act Poland

- In that case, the Temporary Protection Status will be deactivated (beyond 30 days)

Winterization Planning

with consideration for contingency influx

Background and Purpose

Warsaw Winterization Workshop held on 24 August 2022

- Focus on winterization response
- Aim to bring together the GoP with sector leads and operational partners
- Results include a generalized national level narrative and actions listing 3W
- Next step, target priority area to develop more precise and area-specific plan

Rationale for combining winterization and contingency

- Probability that conflict-related influx will overlap with winter season
- Similar scenario figures
- Streamline the planning exercise

Key Considerations for Planning

Climate:

- Winter temperatures may reach sub-zero at night from September until March / early April.
- Border Guard processing capacity may cause waiting lines on both sides of the border.
- Transportation services for onward transportation may cause waiting lines on Polish side.

Areas of Displacement:

- Displacement mostly directed to the main urban centres.
- Access to existing community networks, services and employment are major pull factors for refugees to move to large cities and urban areas in Poland.

Initial Points Raised by GoP in Winterization Workshop:

- Support to vulnerable Poles and host communities in addition
- Use of cash as a modality for providing financial support; encourage PESEL registration for GoP support
- Provide interventions in small-medium cities and rural areas; promote decongestion

Winter/Contingency Scenario

Operational Assumptions:

- Disruption/limitations of heating supply networks may push persons during winter conditions.
- Large-scale displacement is highly likely due to significant intensification of armed conflict.
- 2.2M IDPs within Ukraine and up to 1.8M new asylum seekers/refugees in neighbouring countries.

Estimated Number of New Arrivals (Total Poland):

- **Xxx** estimated asylum seekers/refugee new arrivals (in 3 months)

Estimate Number of New Arrivals (Only Podkarpackie):

- Approximately 56% of total inflow

Duration of Expected Stay:

- Potential up to 50% remain in Poland, others continue onward journey to neighboring countries.

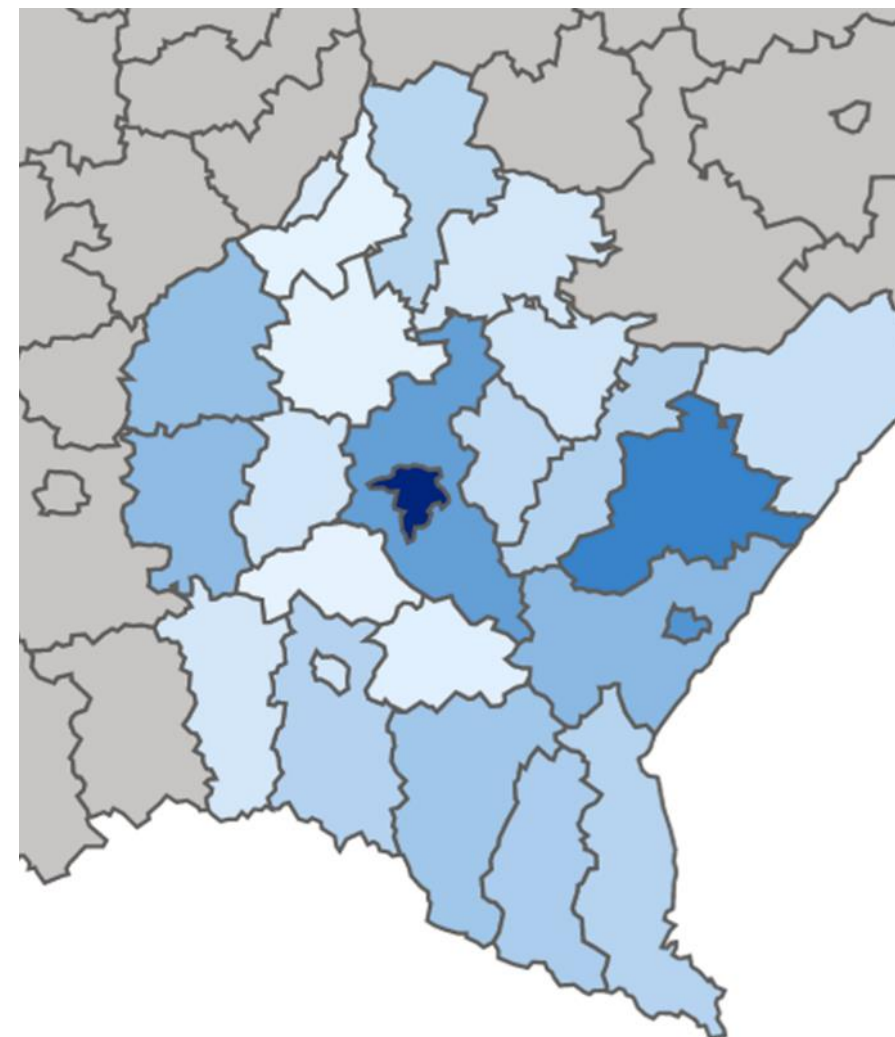

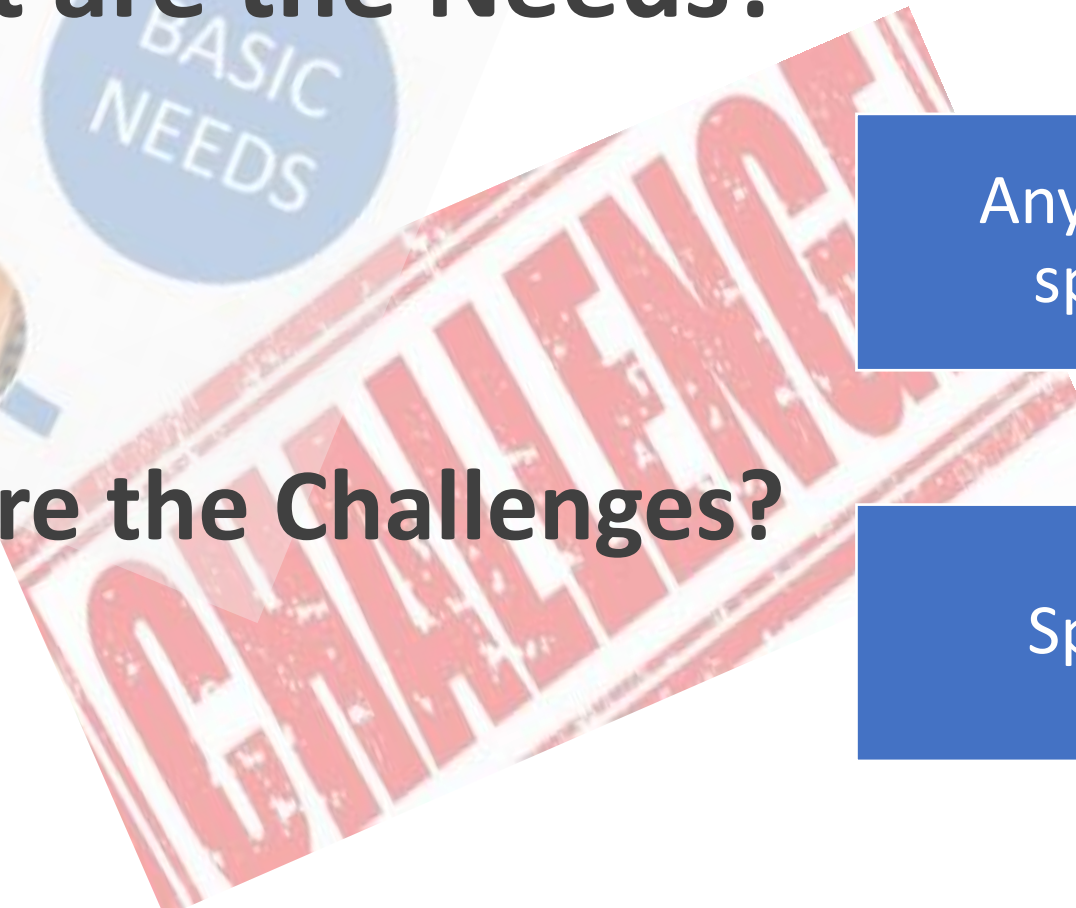


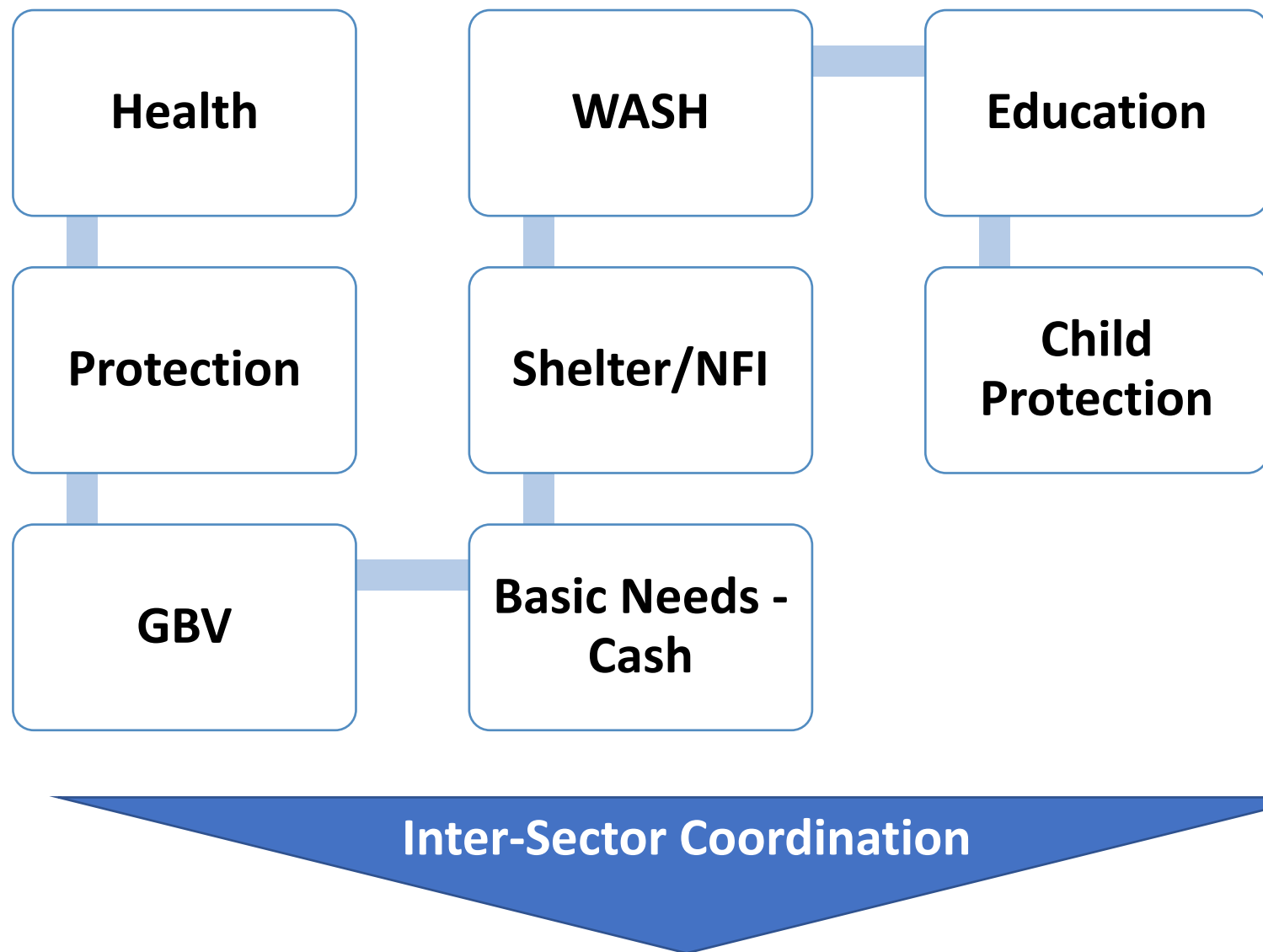

Protection Activities

- Profiling or protection monitoring
- Information provision and orientation
- Legal aid or counselling
- Identification of PSNs and case management
- Cash for protection needs

Child Protection

- Identification of UASC and case management
- Information provision on CP referral pathways
- Training and awareness raising on CP
- Establishing safe spaces

GBV Activities

- Information provision on GBV referral pathways
- Training on GBV and survivor's centered support
- PSS and life-skills sessions



Basic Needs and Cash Activities

- Multi-purpose cash distribution
- Cash for transportation needs
- Transportation assistance from border points

Shelter and NFI Activities



- Upgrades of thermal insulation to minimize fuel/energy consumption
- Shelter rehabilitation, maintenance or provision of basic items for shelter
- Provision of heating equipment or solid fuel support
- Cash specifically for rental assistance to families
- Cash specifically for utilities assistance in communal shelter or host families
- NFI distribution to new arrivals and/or vulnerable groups
- Prepositioning NFI material in strategic locations
- Distribution of winter clothes or winterization kits

Education Activities

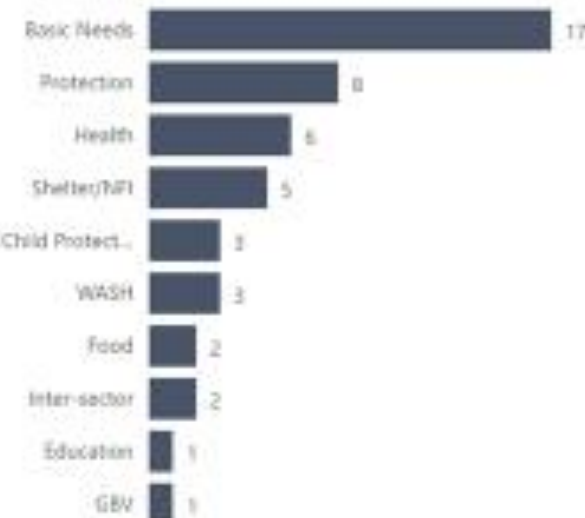

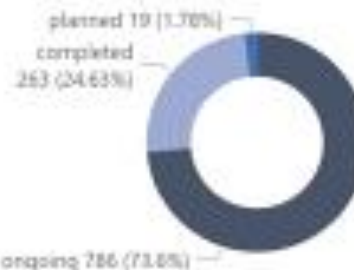
No. of Agencies per sector

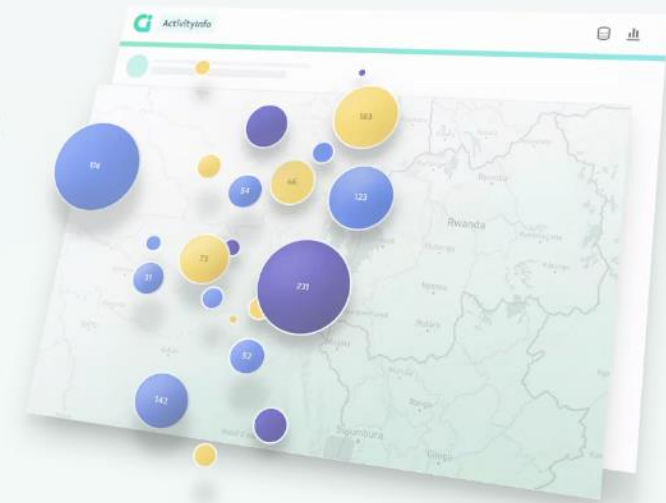

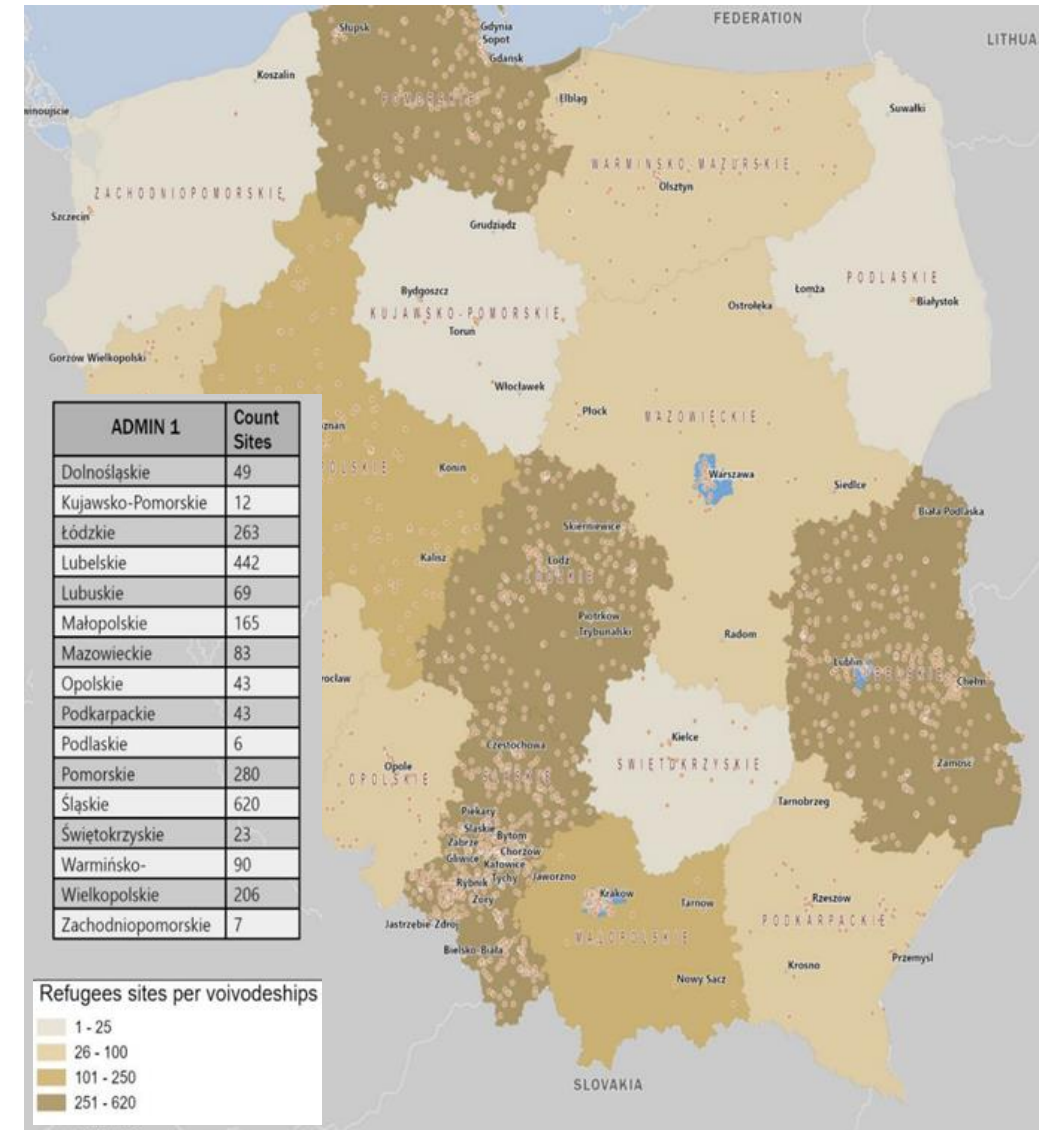

- REACH developed survey tool (Kobo Forms):
 - 20 Minute phone interview
 - 30 Minute on-site interview
- Information available on Dashboard with visibility for organizations supporting exercise.
- Currently **300** sites already surveyed
