

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 344,400 last week to 350,300 this week.


In Kayin State, around 950 people from Kyain-seikgyi Township were displaced to Kawkareik and Kyainseikgyi Townships due to intensified fighting and shelling of villages in Kyainseikgyi Township on 4 January.

In Tanintharyi Region, 4,500 people were displaced to nearby villages within Tanintharyi Township due to conflict in the area.

In Shan State (South), 450 people were displaced following fighting and shelling in Moe Bye town, Pekon Township. Among them, 250 IDPs were confirmed as newly displaced within the township while 200 individuals were displaced to Loikaw Township in Kayah State. About 400 IDPs were instructed to leave from one collective shelter in Taunggyi Township by local authorities but unable to return to their villages of origin in Shan State (North). They were verified as secondary displacements in Hopong Township.


