

## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 350,100 last week to 361,000 this week.

In Bago (East), 500 people were displaced to Taungoo Township from Thandaunggyi Township in Kayin State, due to indiscriminate shelling, tight security checks and arrests of local civilians from 27 and 29 January.


In Kayin State, about 8,300 people from Kawkareik and Kyainseikgyi Townships were displaced within the townships because of fighting, shelling, and airstrikes in the area.

In Tanintharyi Region, 600 IDPs were verified in Dawei and Palaw Townships. They moved within the townships to nearby jungles to avoid heavy weaponry. However, about 310 IDPs returned to their place of origin in Dawei Township. In Mon State, approximately

1,700 people were displaced to Mawlamyine and Kyaukmaraw Townships from Kawkareik Township in Kayin State due to the fighting, shelling, and airstrikes in the area between 21 and 26 January.





