The incentive-based volunteer scheme (IBV) aimed at providing refugees living in Azraq Refugee Camp with basic means to enhance their resilience and self-reliance due to the lack of livelihood means in the camp. The Incentive- Based Volunteering Scheme (IBV) has been a key aspect of refugee participation in the delivery of humanitarian assistance and other services in the camp. The factsheet contains information shared by the different humanitarian actors engaged in the IBV scheme.

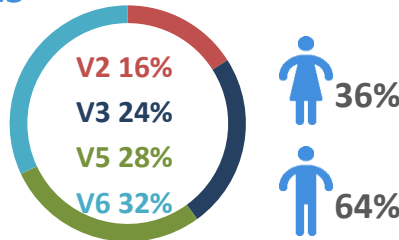

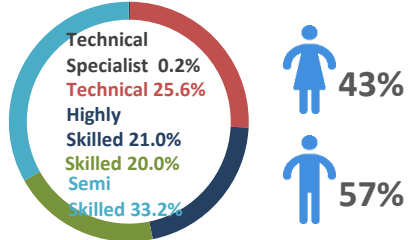

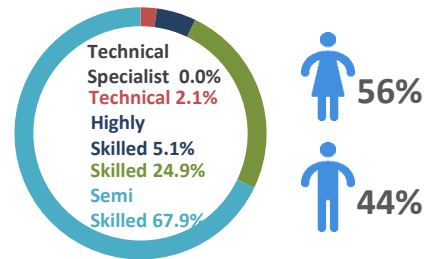

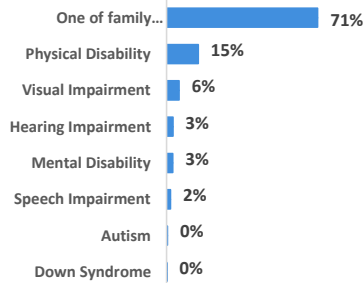
1,791 Total number of beneficiaries currently engaged with IBV program



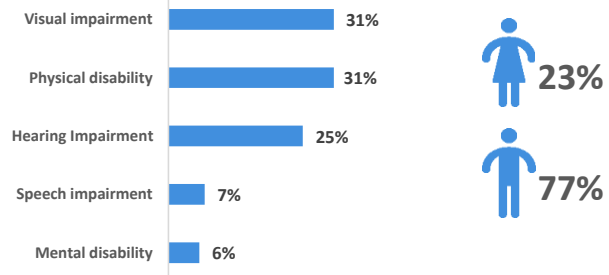
433 Total number of IBV cases rotated during February representing **24%** of total engaged with IBV

Feedback by community members:

- Community members were dissatisfied on IBV mechanism, due to the long period of several volunteers in some NGOs without rotation.
- Elderly and PwDs community members are requesting support to consider their cases on regular rotation in IBV opportunities.
- Community members requested to increase the number of IBV opportunities all over the camp.
