| Dumitru Drumea   | <ul> <li>Since the start of the war in Ukraine, the organization distributed humanitarian aid for Ukrainian refugees:</li> <li>Approximately 90% of the beneficiaries of the projects are women and children.</li> <li>In 2022, Speranta 87 reached 33,000 refugees with food items.</li> <li>In 2023: <ul> <li>The organization reached 1,500 refugees with a project funded by ADA and implemented in collaboration with the Gender Center.</li> <li>Approximately 5,000 women benefited from psychosocial support provided by the Gender Center.</li> <li>1,000 hygiene packages, and over 2,000 school bags will be distributed to Ukrainian children that will start their education in Moldova in September.</li> <li>Two manuals focusing on the mental health and trauma of refugees, with focus on teenagers and parents, are being published.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |  |

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| Presentation by UN<br>Women on the<br>specialized services<br>for victims of sexual<br>violence, developed<br>within EVA project,<br>financed by EUD and<br>implemented by UN<br>Women and UNICEF,<br>Laura Grecu | <ul> <li>The Ministry of Labour and Social Protection's approval of a methodology and work instructions for intervention in cases of sexual violence has been essential to ensure the interaction services and the need for them to be centered in the victim, which was developed in collaboration with UN Women and UNICEF within the framework of the EVA project.</li> <li>The integrated specialised services for victims of sexual violence was established in Ungheni, and will function based on a multidisciplinary and cross-sectoral approach providing a package of services for adult victims of sexual violence, based on their specific needs. The service aims to be easily accessible to victims and in line with confidentiality standards and a do-no-harm approach to prevent re-victimization and re-traumatization.</li> <li>The services include case management, medical examination, foresic examination, psychological evaluation, assitance and rehabilitation, legal aid and support for procedural legal actions. An essential element is the protection of the victim of sexual violence when their safety is compromised, and continuous provision of information to the suvivor during the process.</li> <li>The core team of professionals providing the services include a psychologist, a social worker and a lawyer, the services will be overseen by the Manager. |                               | <ul> <li>professionals who collaborate are doctors, judges, police officers, prosecutors, medico-legal experts and other speciaists depending on the needs of the survivor.</li> <li>Q&amp;A and additional info about the project: <ul> <li>Transportation to the center for the victims is provided.</li> <li>In terms of data, it is believed that the number of cases of sexual violence is higher than those reported.</li> <li>The integrated services have the capacity to support between 70-90 survivors yearly.</li> <li>In line with the procedures of the interdisciplinary teams, victims of sexual violence have the right to be accompanied by a police officer to the medical institutions, which would involve accompanying them to the integrated services.</li> <li>The integrated services will cover Ungheni, Fălești, Sîngerei, Călărași, Nisporeni and Telenești.</li> <li>The Ministry of Labour and Social Protectoin indicated that, according to the data of the General Police Inspectorate, 323 violent sexual crimes were registered in 2022.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> |  |
