Guidance Sheet on Sector Activities and Indicators | Moldova

Following the Refugee Coordination Forum (RCF) Sector Consultations, each sector has developed a framework with sector objectives, prioritized activities, and indicators. These have been informed by information shared by the Government of the Republic of Moldova on its national priorities, as well as existing gaps and challenges.
