

13.4 MILLION FORCIBLY DISPLACED & **STATELESS PERSONS**

UNHCR protects and assists forcibly displaced and stateless persons across the West and Central African region. UNHCR works with and for refugees, asylum seekers, internally displaced persons (IDPs), refugee and IDP returnees, stateless and of undetermined nationality persons. Protection and assistance is extended to additional groups, based on humanitarian and other special grounds.



Internally displaced persons represent the vast majority of the forcibly displaced population in the West and Central Africa region. With Nigeria, Burkina Faso and Cameroon respectively hosting 44%, 25% and 13% of the total IDP population.

The current number of 2.2 million refugees and asylum seekers marks a substantial 36% increase from the number reported in October 2022, mainly as a result of the ongoing crisis in Sudan and the deteriorating security situation in the Central Sahel. The largest hosting refugee country in the region is Chad with 48% of the total population, followed by Cameroon with 22%. Sudan, the Central African Republic (CAR), and Nigeria are the main countries of origin, collectively representing 80% of the region's refugee population.

West Africa hosts over 931,000 stateless persons and people of undetermined nationality, reported mainly in Côte d'Ivoire and Cabo Verde. Millions of people are reported to be at risk of statelessness across the region.



MAIN COUNTRIES OF ORIGIN






