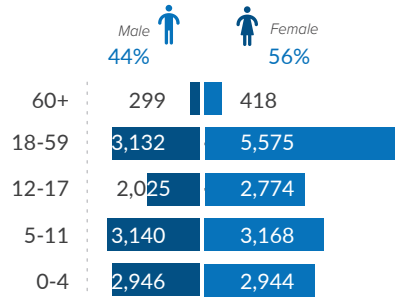

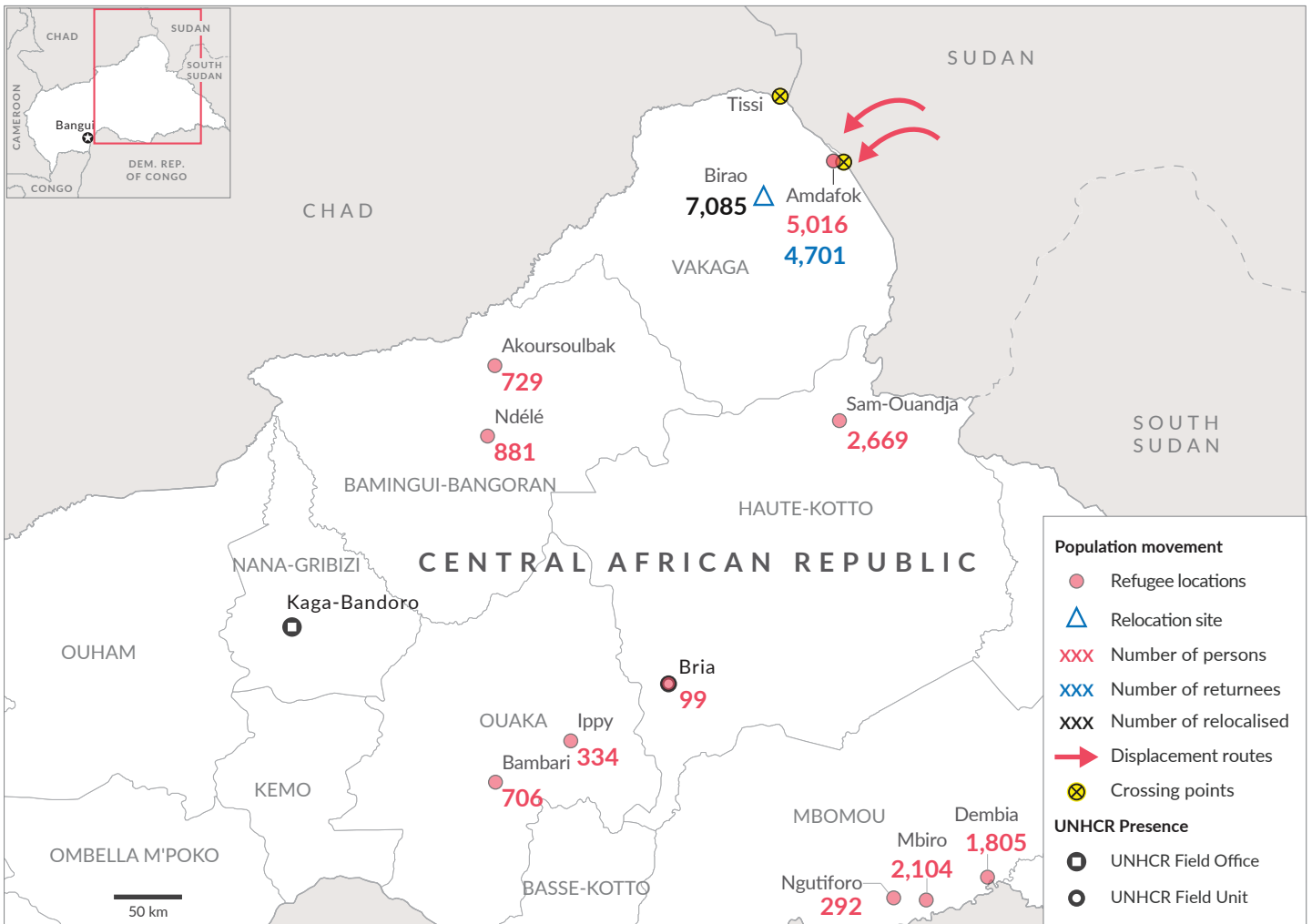
**Breakdown of total number by age group and gender**

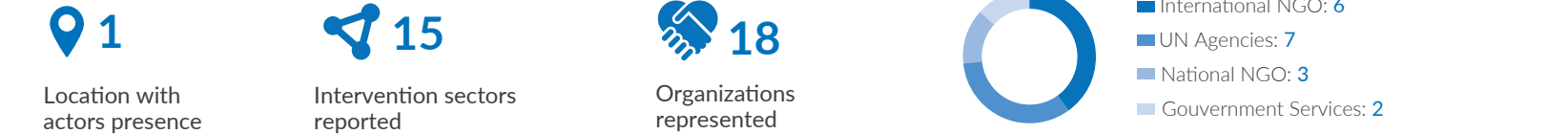
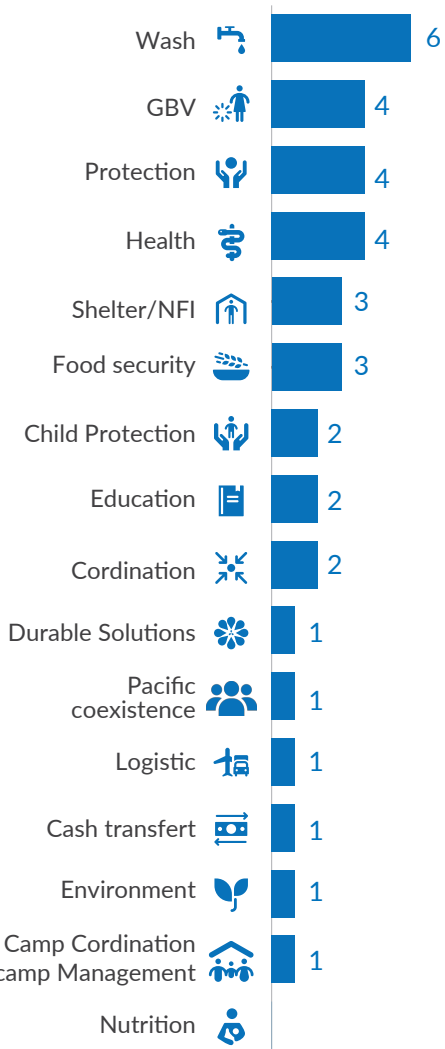
**Situation map**
