In October 2023, in support to the Government, a joint humanitarian funding appeal, the Armenia Refugee Response Plan (RRP), was launched. It covers a six-month period from October 2023 to March 2024. The plan outlines coordinated and inclusive interventions to support urgent lifesaving needs and the resilience of both the refugee and hosting populations. This inter-agency operational update reflects the work of RRP partners and RRP-aligned partners as reported in ActivityInfo for the period of October to November 2023. Overall, 23 partners reported, representing five sectors and three sub-sectors. Partners reported on 30 activities, tracked by 42 indicators, and covering 11 regions. Detailed data can be found in the interactive dashboard online.

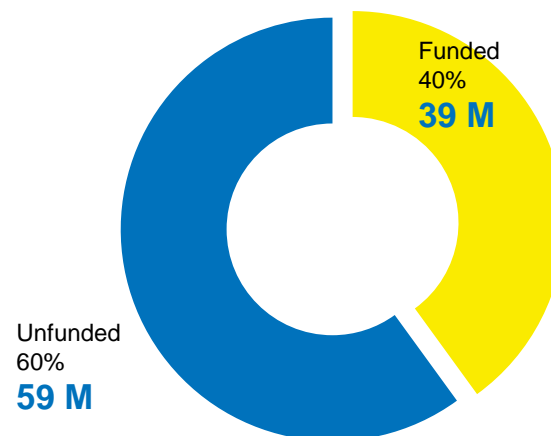
