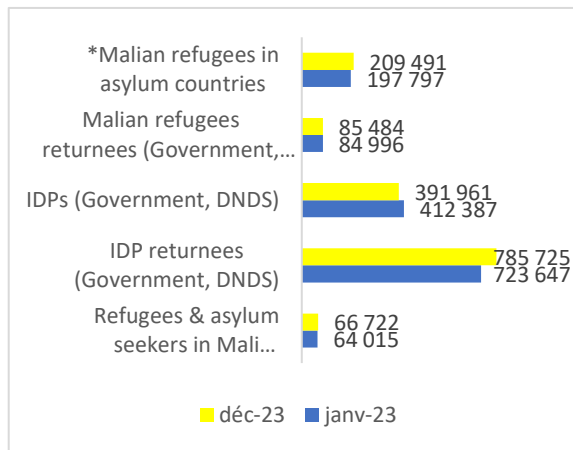
40 agents from the National Repatriation Coordination (CNR) were trained on international protection in Ségou.

98 households of internally displaced in the Timbuktu region, and **16** households in the Mopti region received cash multipurpose assistance.

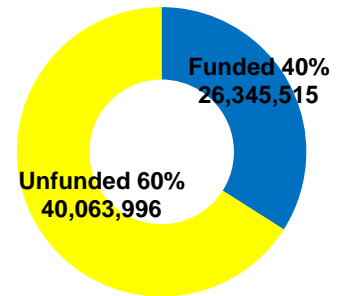
1,799 individuals were recorded in mixed movement monitoring activities.

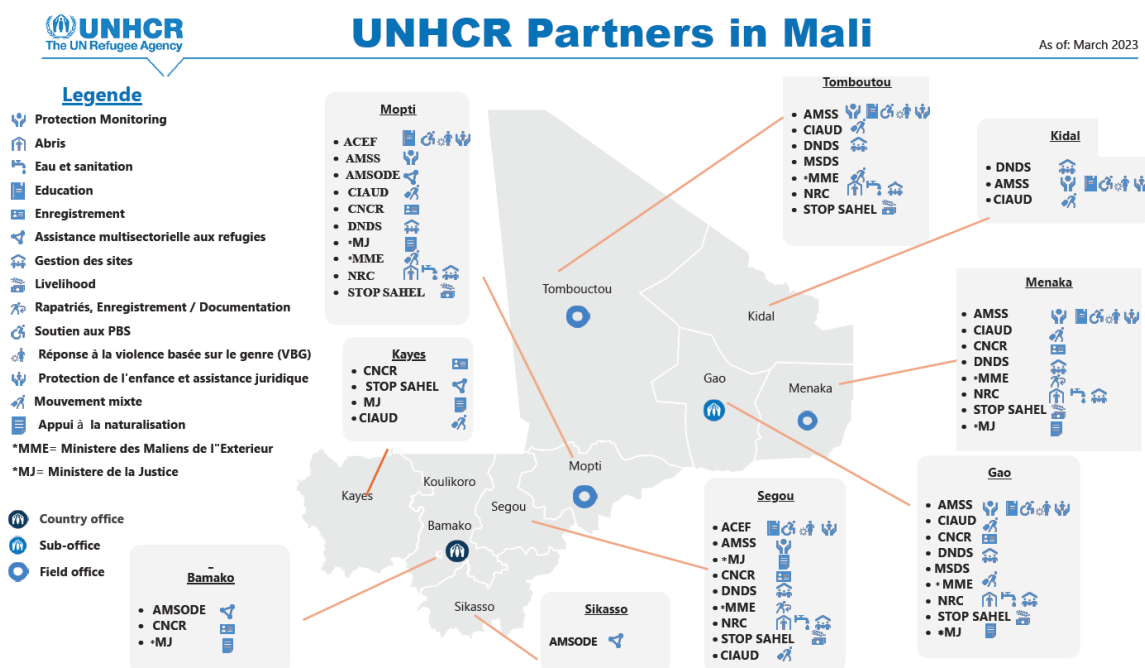

MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION

Legal protection

- From December 18 to 22, 2023, 40 agents and trainees from the National Repatriation Coordination (CNR) were trained on international protection in Ségou.
- A total of 03 refugees (02 men and 01 woman) and 03 asylum seekers (02 men and 01 woman) were received, advised, and guided on questions related to documentation, health, resettlement, and the DSR procedure.

Community Mobilisation

- 300 refugee households in the Sikasso region were informed and made aware of the UNHCR blue line(hotline).
- The UNHCR blue line received 2,336 calls and 397 cases were resolved covering requests for food, health, and shelter support.

Gender-based violence

- During December, the One Stop Center in Ménaka recorded eight (08) new cases of GBV including two (2) cases of rape, one (1) case of physical assault, one (1) case of sexual assault, and four (4) cases of denial of resources. There are 7 adult women and 1 girl. They benefited from medical, and psychosocial care and support in dignity kits.

Mixed Movements

- In December 2023, mixed movement monitoring activities recorded 1,799 people including 1,182 men, 445 women, 95 boys, and 77 girls, i.e. 93 people (5.16%) more compared to the previous month. Among these 1799 people, 844 are entrants and 955 are exits. The regions most affected are Mopti, Gao, Ségou, Timbuktu, and Kidal followed by the regions of Koutiala, Ménaka, Nara, Kayes, Sikasso, and Nioro.
- Awareness sessions on different themes related to refugee status, irregular migration, documentation, education, and health were organized during December in several regions. There were 12 in Gao which reached 152 people, 13 in Menaka which reached 37 people, 39 in Mopti which reached 479 people, 36 in Timbuktu reaching 434 people and 20 in Kayes, which reached 315 people.

Statelessness

- From December 26 to 28 in Ségou, a workshop was organized by the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights in collaboration with the UNHCR, and the participation of the interministerial committee to combat statelessness, for the validation of the preliminary bill establishing the status of stateless persons. The preliminary bill comprising 5 chapters and 28 articles focused on the protection of stateless persons and the designation of a body in charge was validated by the assembly. The next step remains the Interministerial Meeting before the adoption by the National Council of the Transition in Mali.
- On December 29, a workshop chaired by the Chief of Staff of the Governor of the Ségou Region in the presence of the prosecutor of the Ségou Court and the mayors of the communes of the Ségou Region resulted in the creation of a formal framework for the fight against statelessness in the Ségou region like the regions of Mopti, Kayes, and Timbuktu.

Durables solutions

- Voluntary repatriation: From December 18 to 22, 40 agents and trainees from the National Repatriation Coordination (CNR) were trained on international protection in Ségou.
- Resettlement: A total of 5 refugees were informed and advised on the resettlement process and fraud-related issues to manage their expectations. From December 1 to December 14, 2023, a total of 06 households of 16 people underwent resettlement interviews by our Resettlement partner, Resettlement Support Center (RSC-Africa) based in Nairobi.

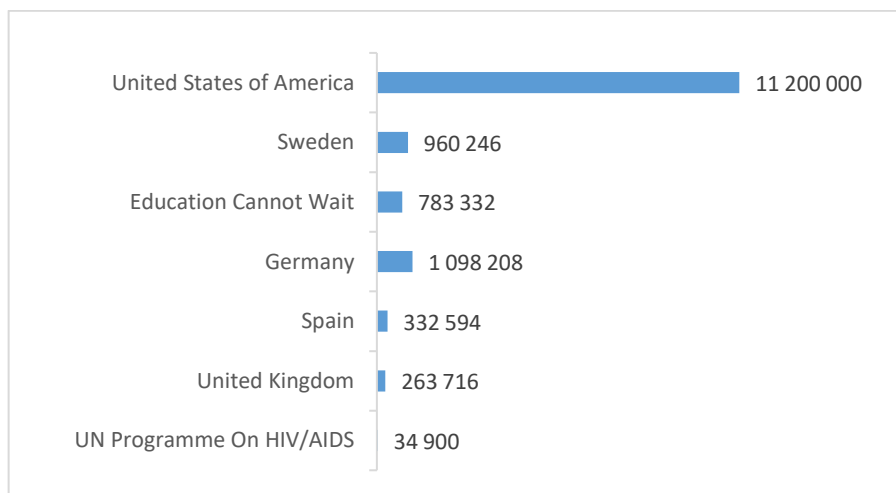
Cash assistance

- Over December 2023 in the Timbuktu region, CERF funding enabled 98 households of internally displaced people made up of 427 people to have cash assistance for multiple purposes. Each household received 128,000 FCFA. In the Mopti region, 16 households made up of 92 individuals including people with specific needs received this assistance.
