- UNHCR has been present in Czechia since 1992, working in close coordination with state entities, UN agencies, and national partners. The UNHCR Office in Czechia is located in Prague as part of the UNHCR Representation for Central Europe based in Budapest, Hungary.
- In support of the Czech Government’s response, UNHCR’s protection interventions are aimed to ensure a favourable protection space for Ukrainian refugees as well as refugees from other countries, by providing assistance, protection, and access to services to individuals under Temporary Protection.
