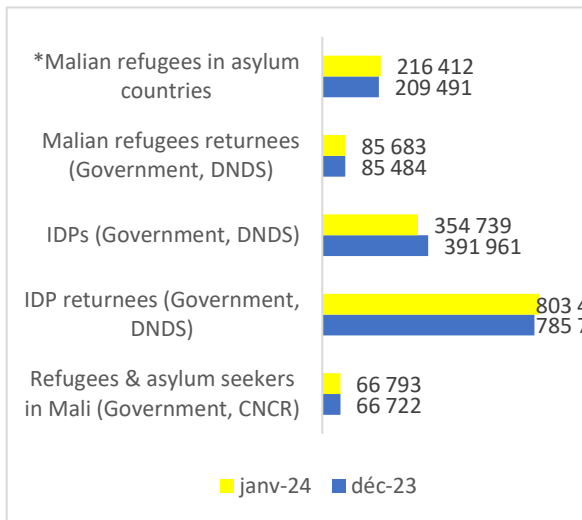
22 Burkinabè refugee households of **74** people in Mopti received non-food kits (NFIs).

18 cases of GBV victims including 11 women and 7 girls were treated.

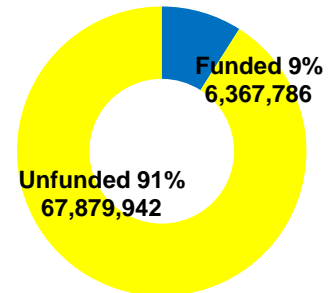
29 awareness sessions on themes relating to refugee status, migration, documentation, education, etc. were organized in several regions of Mali.

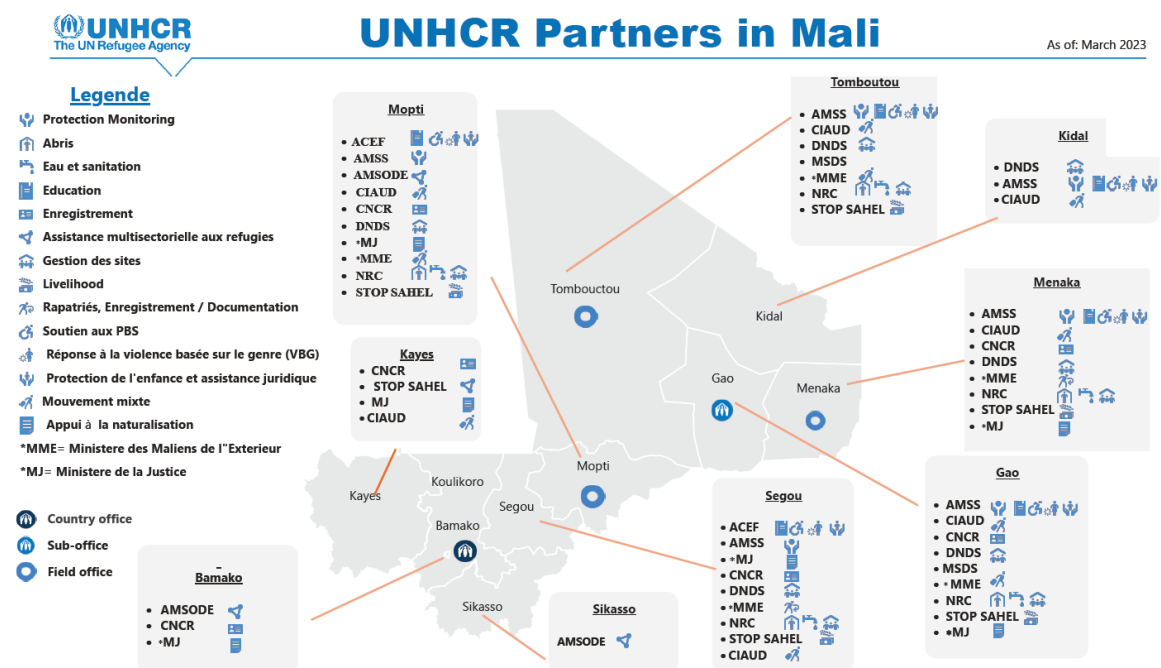

PROTECTION

Legal protection

- Some asylum seekers and refugees were received, advised, and guided on questions related to the asylum application procedure in Mali, resettlement, documentation (TVC), and financial assistance.
- Some refugees who received support from a Bioforce training grant obtained travel documents to travel to Dakar for their training.

Gender-based violence

- During January 2024, 18 cases of GBV victims including 11 women and 7 girls were treated in the areas of Kayes, Mopti, Koro, Doeuntza, and Menaka. Among these victims are 5 refugees, 10 internally displaced persons (IDPs), and 3 from the host community. This involves psychosocial care for 17 survivors of GBV, and medical care for 14 cases as well as legal and judicial support for one case. 03 cases were referred to other structures.
- 21 awareness sessions on the prevention of GBV were organized with the participation of 613 people including 134 men, 372 women 55 girls, and 52 boys. In addition, 3 capacity building sessions on the prevention of GBV, sexual abuse, and exploitation benefited the telephone operators of the UNHCR Blue Line, the staff of the partner NGO AMSODE, the monitors of the partner CIAUD Canada, and the agents of registration of the National Commission in charge of refugees (CNCR).

Mixed Movements

- 642 people (386 men, 165 women, 55 boys, and 36 girls) were recorded in the monitoring of mixed movements. Among these people, 64 with specific needs (20 breastfeeding women, 3 pregnant women, 38 elderly people, and 3 elderly people with physical disabilities) were identified. It should be noted that the majority did not wish to be referred to support services, thus wanting to continue their journey.
- 29 awareness sessions on various themes including the process of determining refugee status, the consequences of irregular migration, the importance of registering civil status documents, the importance of children's education, and the mandate of UNHCR and GBVs were organized in several regions of Mali.

These awareness sessions reached 604 people in total in the regions of Gao, Kidal, Ménaka, Mopti, Bandiagara, Douentza, San, Ségou, Timbuktu, Kayes, Nioro, Nara, Sikasso, and Koutiala.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs) & WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

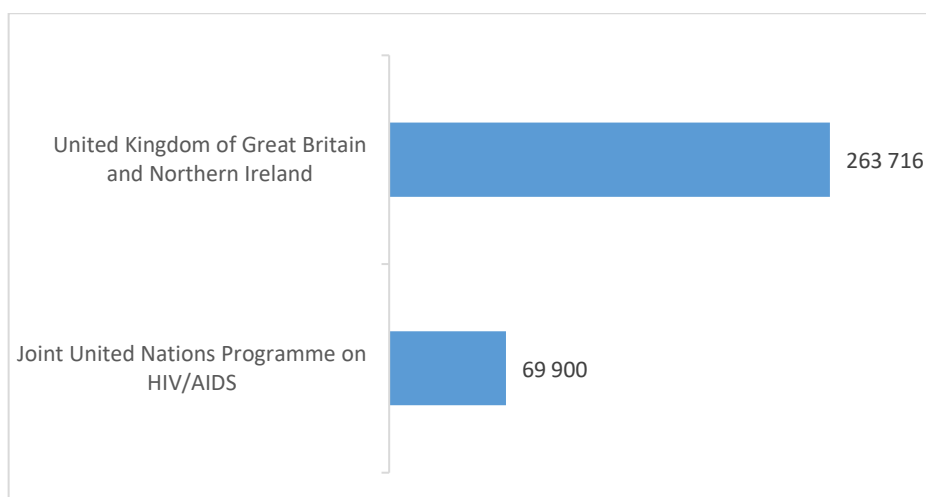
- Over January 2024, UNHCR was able to assist with essential non-food kits to 74 Burkinabè refugees. These are 22 households made up of 13 men, 19 women, 19 boys, and 23 girls in the commune of Mopti, Mopti region. This assistance aims to offer these new refugees, forced to flee their country without being able to take their belongings, functional domestic space, and means to facilitate their survival and well-being.
