



# Aegean Islands Weekly Snapshot

This week, the Aegean islands saw 449 arrivals, a decrease from last week's 684. The average of the daily arrivals on the Aegean islands for this week is 64.






## Population in the CCACs


Currently, 8,891 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center(s).

Most of them are from Afghanistan (43%), Syria (26%) and Sierra Leone (5%). Men account for 53% of the population, women for 20% and children for 26%.




## Population on the Islands

There are 9,833 refugees and migrants on the Aegean islands. Out of this total, 8,891 reside at the CCACs and 290 are hosted in other facilities. UNHCR estimates that there are also 652 self-accommodated in the islands.

This week, 273 refugees and migrants departed from the Aegean islands to the mainland.



## Sea arrivals


This week, Lesvos saw 124 arrivals, an increase from last week's 61.




## Population in the CCAC


Currently, 2,866 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center.

Most of them are from Afghanistan (71%), Eritrea (8%) and Syria (7%). Men account for 41% of the population, women for 25% and children for 34%.




## Population on the Island

There are 3,251 refugees and migrants on Lesvos. Out of this total, 2,866 reside at the CCAC and 166 are hosted in other facilities. UNHCR identified 219 self-accommodated refugees in the island up to this date.




## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on Chios island for this week is 18.






## Population in the CCAC


Currently, 1,085 refugees and migrants reside in the Closed Controlled Access Center.

Most of them are from Afghanistan (34%), Syria (18%) and Somalia (15%). Men account for 46% of the population, women for 30% and children for 24%.




## Population on the Island




## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on Samos island for this week is 11.







## Population on the Island




## Sea arrivals

The average of the daily arrivals on the Dodecanese islands for this week is 18.






## Population in Kos CCAC and Leros CCAC


Currently, 2,409 refugees and migrants reside in Kos CCAC and Leros CCAC.

Most of them are from Syria (50%), Afghanistan (13%) and State of Palestine (11%). Men account for 66% of the population, women for 14% and children for 20%.




## Population on the Dodecanese Islands

There are 2,714 refugees and migrants on the Dodecanese islands. Out of this total, 1,359 reside at the CCAC in Kos, and 1,050 at the CCAC Leros. In Kos, an estimated 240 people are self-accommodated and an additional 15 are hosted in other facilities, while in Leros, an estimated 50 people are self-accommodated, with an additional 0 being hosted in other facilities.
