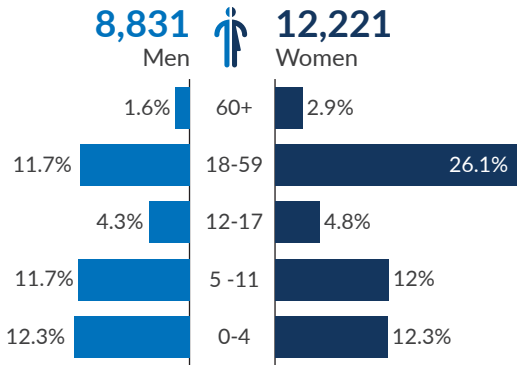


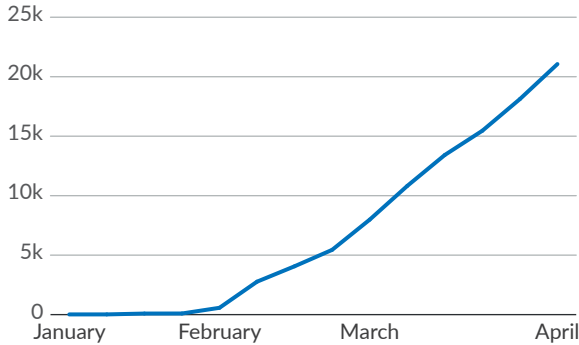
Context

Since the end of October 2024, as the crisis in the Sahel regions continues to deteriorate, Mali has been receiving a significant influx of refugees and asylum seekers, mainly from Burkina Faso. Most are fleeing the violence and instability caused by non-state armed groups activity and targeted military operations. Since January 2024 over 21,000 new arrivals from Burkina Faso were registered, bringing the total estimated number of arrivals to 94,000 (53,800 registered and 40,200 pending registration).

Age and gender



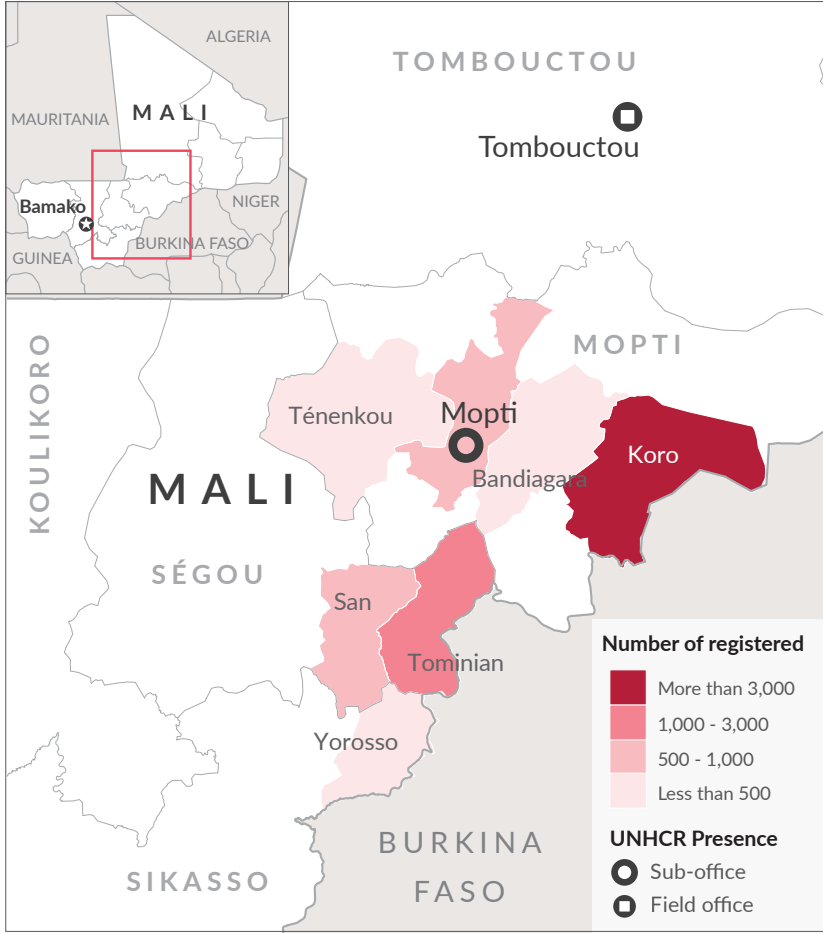
Evolution of registration

In February 2024, Action Research and Development (AMRAD) conducted a multi-sector needs assessment in Mopti region.

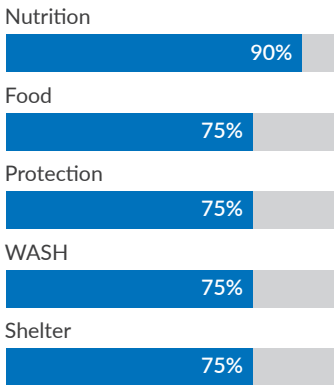
