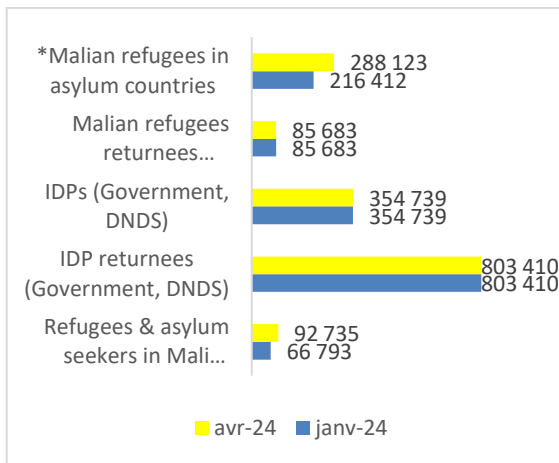
**1031** households of **2347** individuals were registered. **1031** refugee certificates were issued to households by the CNCR.

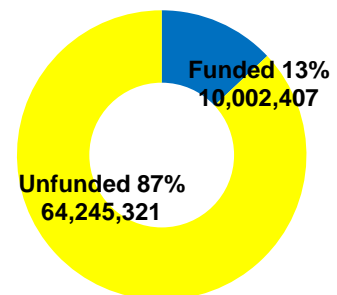
**114** refugee households made up of 491 individuals in Gossi, in the Timbuktu region, benefitted from multi-purpose cash assistance

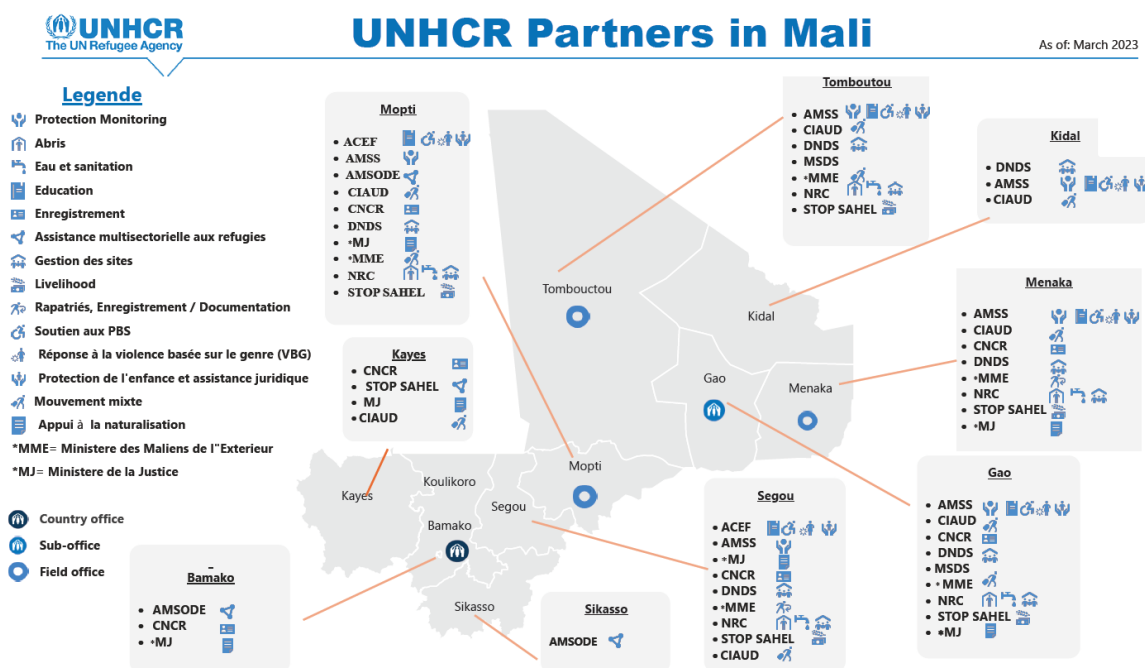

MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION

Registration and documentation

- As of April 2024, 1031 households of 2347 individuals were registered. 1031 refugee certificates were issued to households by the National Commission in Charge of Refugees (CNCR).
- Note that the registration operation launched in February 2024 in collaboration with the CNCR made it possible to register 24,698 Burkinabe refugees in the Central regions and 1,858 Nigerien refugees in the Northern regions of Mali at the end of April.

Legal protection

- A Burkinabe household of 05 people (03 adults and 02 children) was referred to the partner CIAUD-CANADA to register and establish their refugee identity cards.
- 4 asylum seekers (3 men and 1 woman) were referred to the National Commission Responsible for Refugees (CNCR) to complete their asylum request.
- 06 refugees were received, advised, and guided on issues related to resettlement, health, housing, and documentation.

Durables solutions

Voluntary Repatriation:

- 48 spontaneous repatriations were recorded in April, including 37 from Burkina Faso and 11 from Mauritania, in the regions of Gao (19 people), Timbuktu (25 people) and Segou (04 people).

Gender-based violence

- In April, UNHCR treated 13 cases of gender-based violence GBV (4 girls and 9 women) in the localities of Koro, Douentza, and Menaka. Among these victims, 13 received psychosocial support and 7 received medical assistance.

- We can also note in April the holding of 10 awareness sessions on GBV with the participation of 637 individuals including 95 men, 421 women, 77 girls, and 46 boys as well as the distribution of 5 dignity kits.

**Statelessness**

- 100 supplementary judgments established by the Registry of the Kayes High Court were transmitted as birth certificates to the secondary state centers for transcription. This concerns documentation for 73 minors and 27 adults.
- The bill establishing the status of stateless persons, after its validation by the Interministerial Committee to combat statelessness, was presented and defended by the national statelessness focal point of Mali before the Permanent Legislative Commission (CPL) on 22 and 23 February 2023. The CPL validated it with the draft decree creating the national commission responsible for stateless persons and the procedural guide for determining stateless person status.
- Also, a system for archiving data from the naturalization project of people at risk of statelessness has been set up within the National Directorate of Judicial Affairs and the Seal (DNJAS). This system is taken into account in the budget of the Malian Ministry of Justice and Human Rights.

**Cash-Based Interventions**

- In April, UNHCR provided to 114 refugee households of 491 individuals in Gossi, in the Timbuktu region. This assistance of 60,000 CFA francs per household will enable refugees to meet urgent needs independently and contribute to the dynamism of the economic circuit of their host localities.

**Mixed Movements**

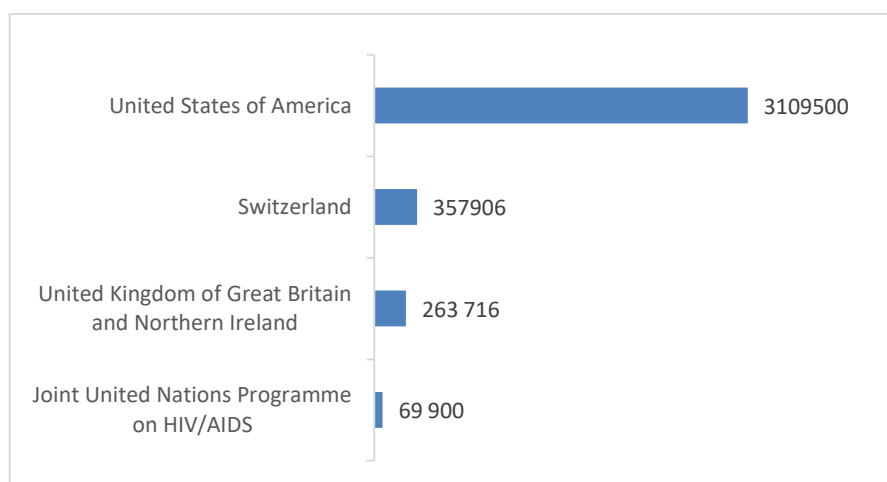
- In April 2024, 467 outgoing individuals were identified through monitoring of mixed movements, 67.2% of whom were Malian nationals. The rest of the people identified belong to various nationalities including 4.3% Burkinabé, 8.8% Nigeriens, 12.4% Guineans, 3% Ivorians, 2.4% Senegalese. Statistics show that these people left by 27 points, including 24% through the Ménaka region, 17% through the Timbuktu region, and 14% through the Gao region.
- 32 awareness sessions on various themes such as irregular migration, refugee status, and documentation, were organized in the regions of Gao, Kidal, Menaka, Mopti, Bandiagara, Douentza, San, Ségou, Kayes, Nioro, Nara, Sikasso, Koutiala, Timbuktu. A total of 797 people took part in these awareness sessions.
