Coordination updates (Updates from the field)	<p><i>Azraq:</i> The meeting took place on the 21st of August with the following agenda items: International Youth Day (12 August) feedback, Walking to School Initiative - Sexual Harassment on the way to the school, Children Travelling Alone, Sexual incidents among children and EJC updates (NHF&TDH). ARDD also conducted an awareness session on several legal topics. There will be an ad hoc meeting organized at the end of August on the identification of child marriage cases and on prevention activities.</p> <p><i>EJC:</i> The meeting took place on the 19th of August with the following agenda items: International Youth Day (12 August) feedback, Community Engagement, Child Marriage Cases, CPGBV Safe Referral and PSEA trainings targeting Zone leaders and volunteers in EJC, Agency updates.</p> <p><i>Irbid:</i> The meeting took place on the 14th of August, it included updates from sub-sectors and it was attended by 10 organizations. One training was conducted on BIP organized by UNHCR for 25 child protection case managers, and another one was conducted by World Vision on inclusivity.</p> <p><i>Zaatari:</i> The meeting took place and focused on updating the mailing list, discussing the Child Marriage strategy, challenges to the reporting of activities from partners, and the issue of child labour and minors travelling alone outside the camp.</p>	MoM will be uploaded on UNHCR’s Data Portal

<p>JOHUD presentation on “Salam Charity Innovation”</p>	<p>JOHUD presented its work, geographical scope and main departments, and focused on the project Salam Charity Innovations, which is conducted in coordination with the GOOD WELL campaign and the JOHUD’s Case Management department. It supports host communities and refugees with PSS, medical needs, in kind aid, financial assistance, educational opportunities, as well as with small loans to initiate business for vulnerable communities, including GBV survivors based on their wishes and the local labour market needs. JOHUD welcomes referrals for complex cases that need immediate response.</p>	<p>Presentation available here</p>
<p>Inter-Agency presentation on the GBV Dashboard</p>	<p>An improvement has been registered and needs to be sustained. A total of 26.89 million were appealed, with only 5.86 million received - more needs to be investigated on the reason for the 20 million gap. The bulk of the funding was received by UN Agencies, however this does not match with reality and the reporting from other entities needs to be checked. Some glitches are also due to the multi-year programmes which are not reported in the right period. As of Q2 still 6 organizations have not reported, and the Protection sector is ranked second for funding received in Q2. ActivityInfo also registers gaps in reporting.</p>	<p>Presentation available here</p>
<p>Presentation on Guideline for developing success stories</p>	<p>UNHCR presents tips and recommendations on how to draft compelling stories to showcase the work of organizations. It is in particular important to focus on the impact and the change obtained through the support - it is not always necessary to show figures but to focus on describing quality work. Organizations must differentiate between the progress of an activity and the achievement, focussing on the human aspect and remembering that when shared in the right channels stories can also inspire and give strength to other survivors.</p>	<p>Presentation available here</p>
