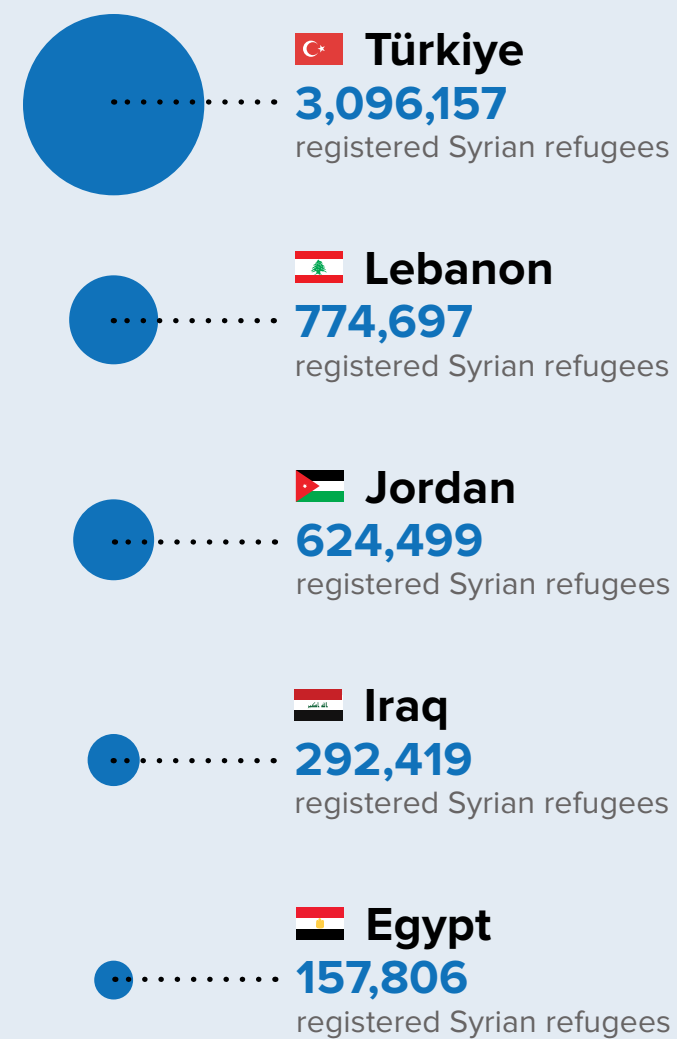
Durable solutions for refugees from Syria are based on a comprehensive protection and solutions strategy which seeks to: 1) support host country and community resilience; 2) enable refugee self-reliance, including access to services, legal work opportunities and livelihoods; 3) expand access to resettlement in third countries and other complementary pathways, and; 4) plan for the return of refugees to Syria, on a voluntary basis, when conditions for a safe, dignified and sustainable return are in place.

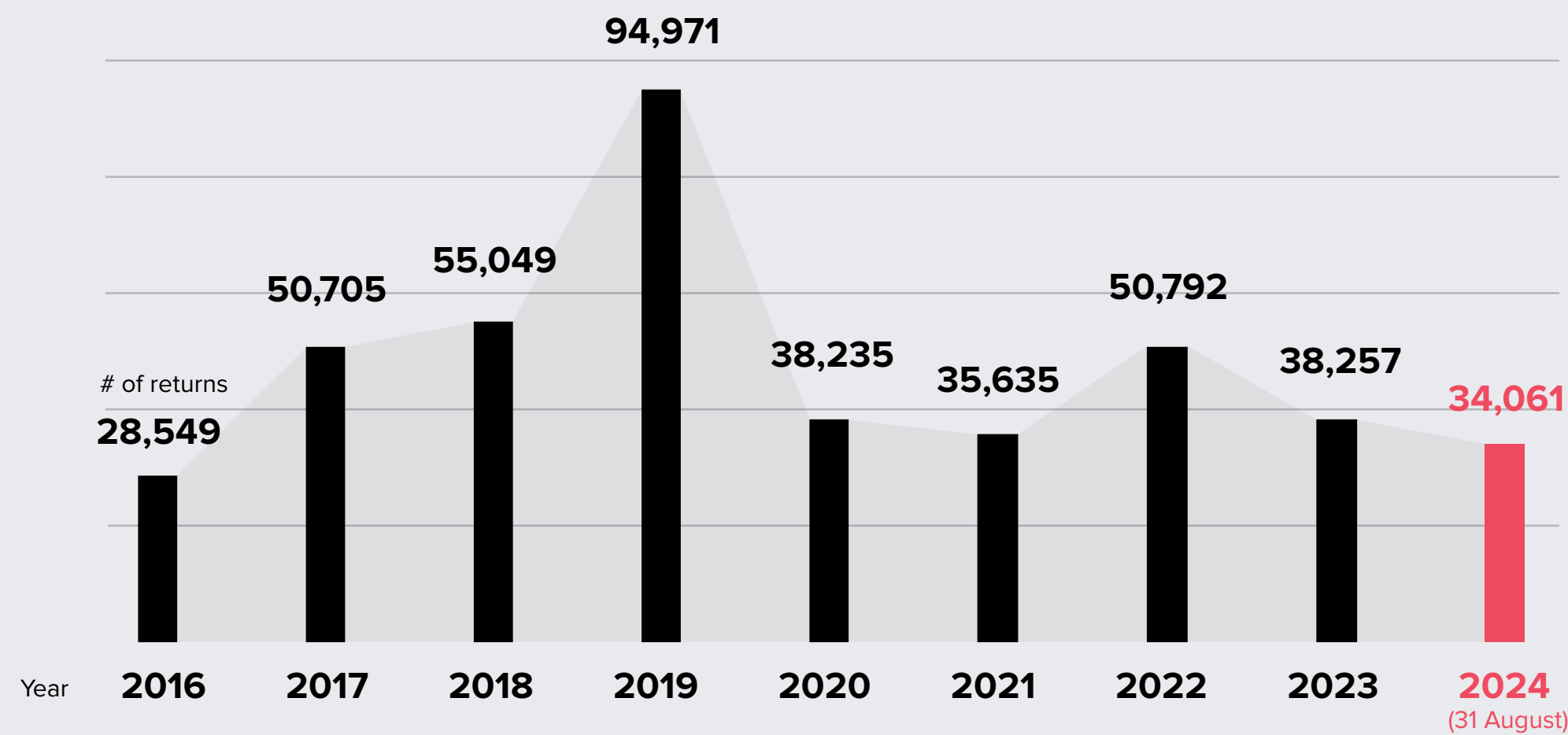

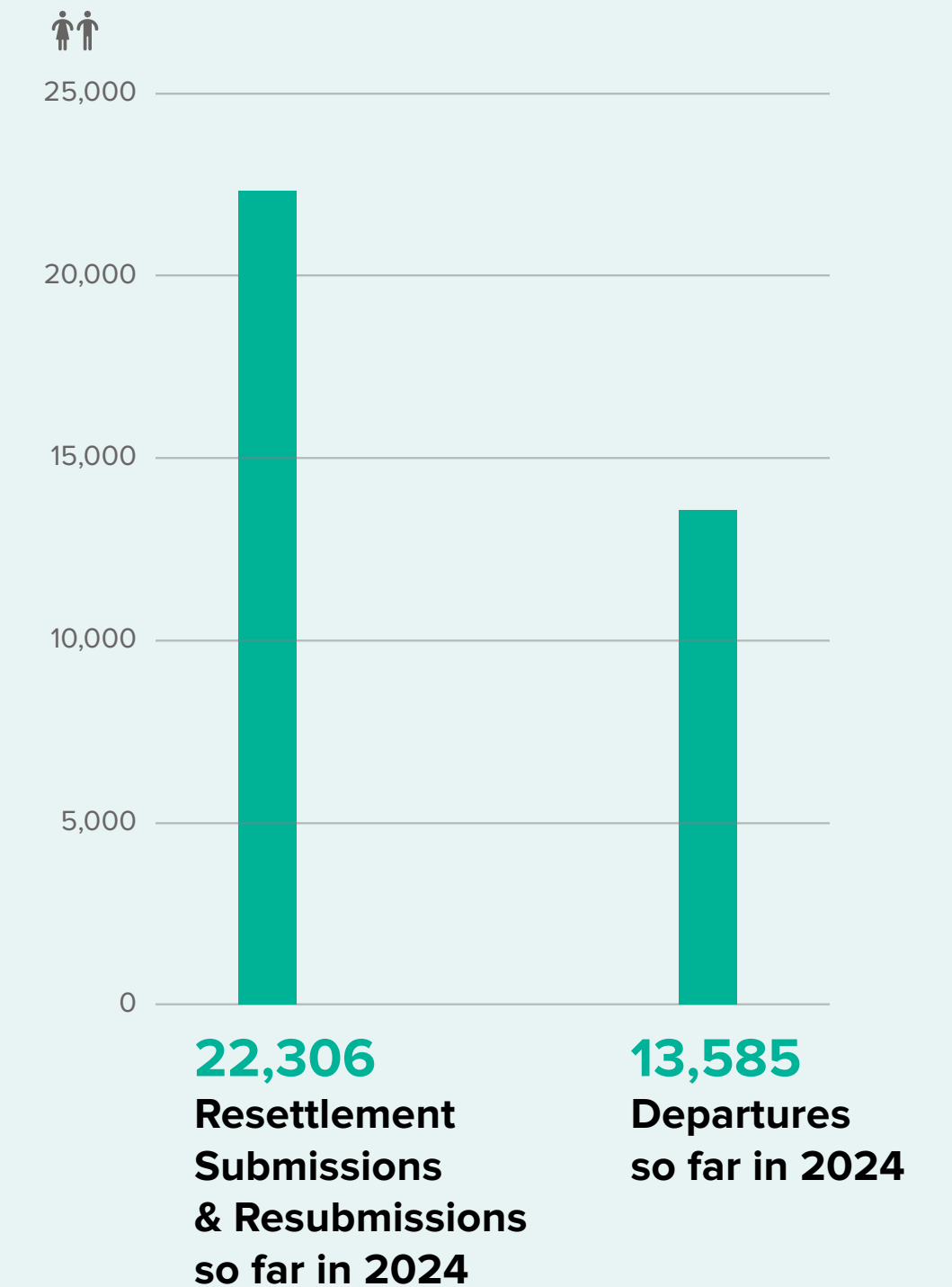

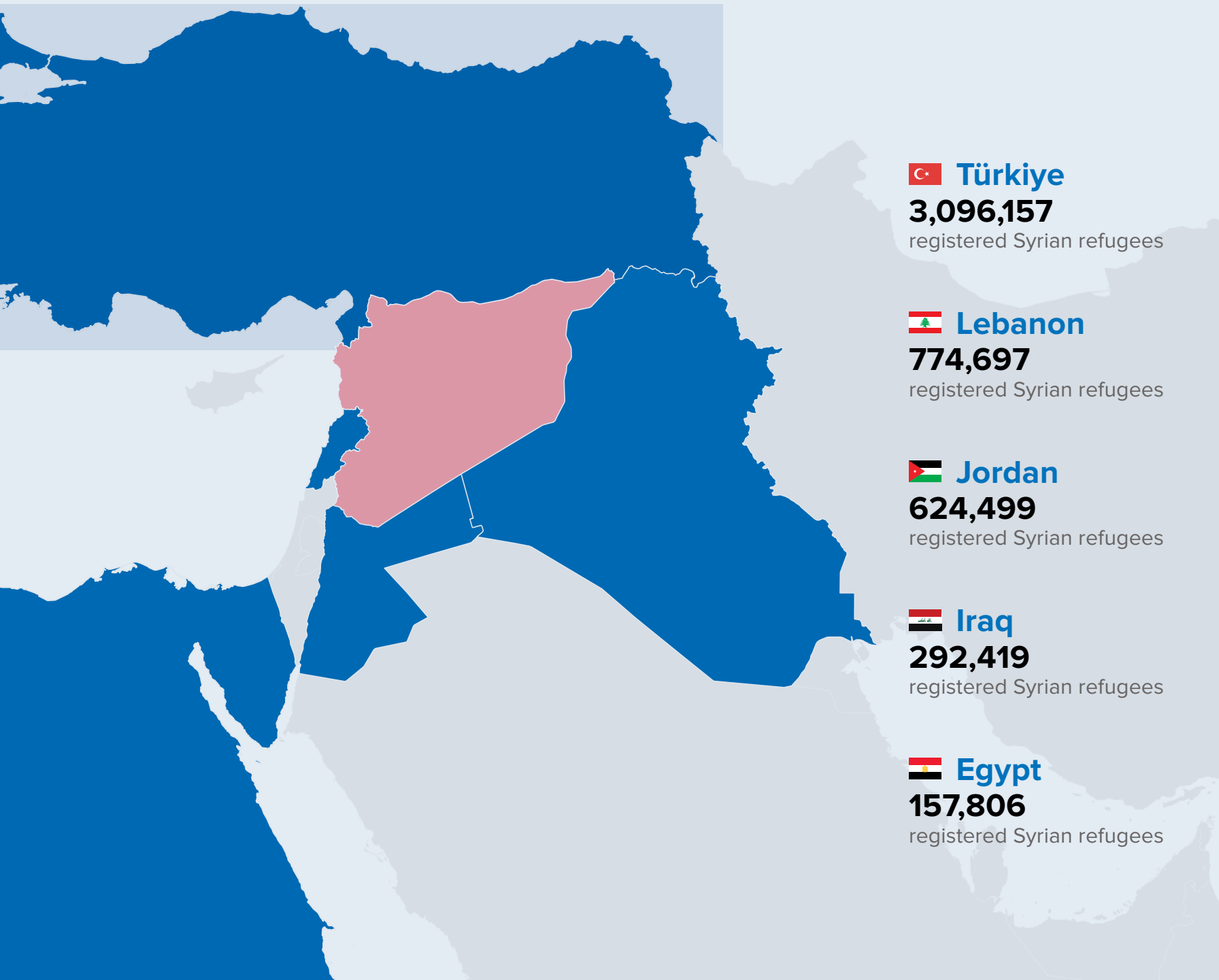

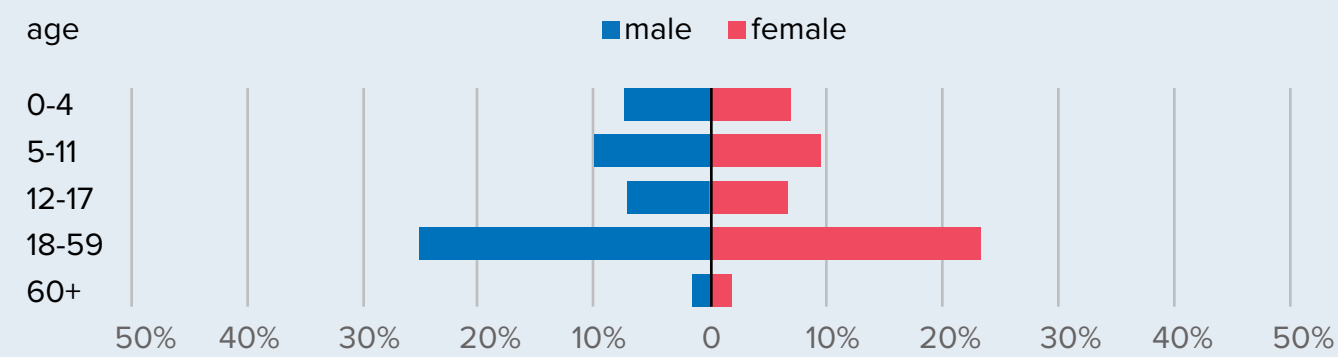

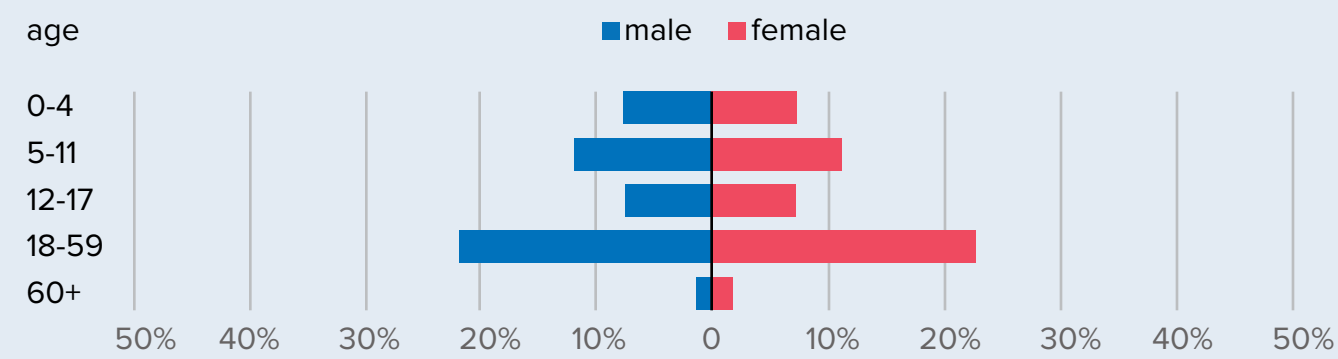

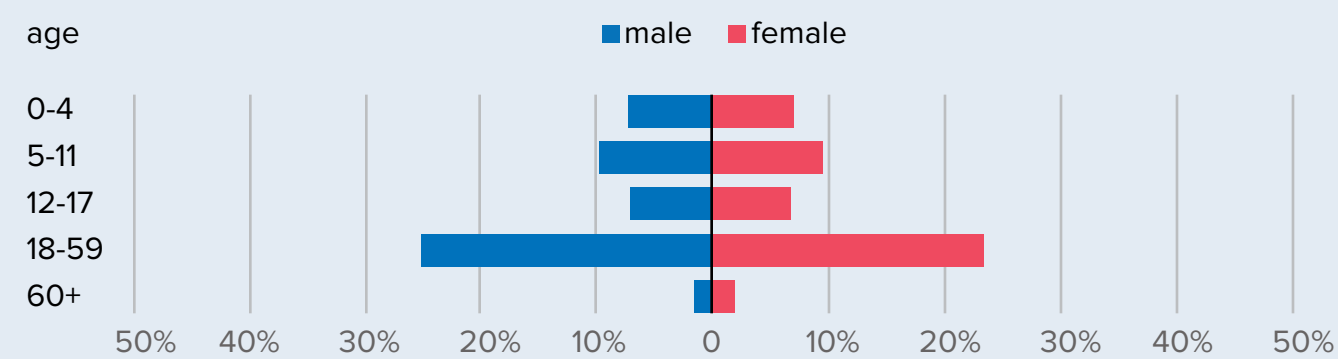
Registered Syrian Refugees (in-camp)

48% of the registered Syrian refugees are children under the age of 18.

94% of Syrian refugees across the region reside within the host community, mainly in urban areas; **6%** reside in camps.

Syrian refugee youth aged between 15 and 24 years old constitute around **20%** of the total registered Syrian population in the five countries.

Over 900 thousand people of the registered Syrian refugee population are estimated to be people with disabilities.

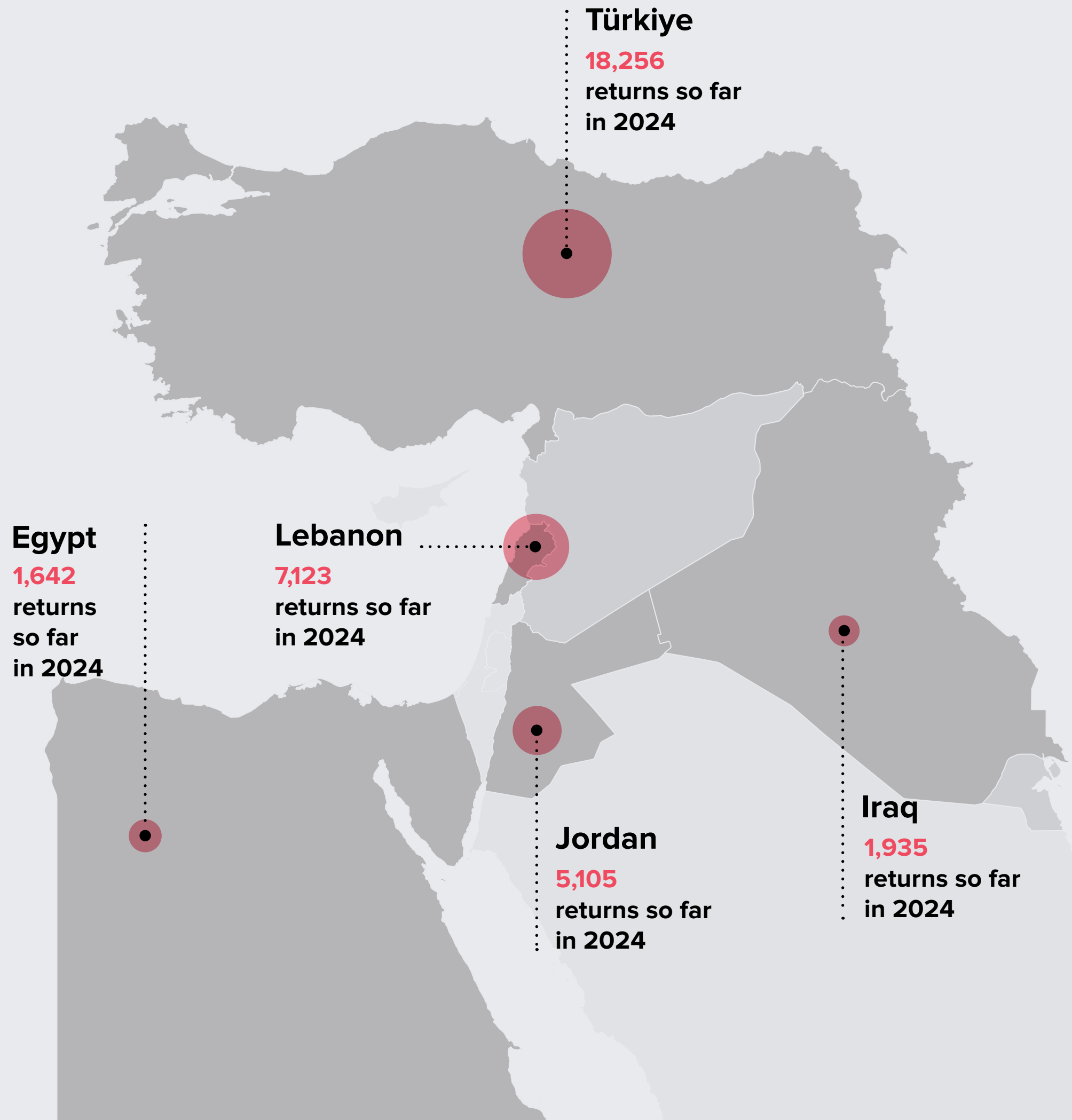

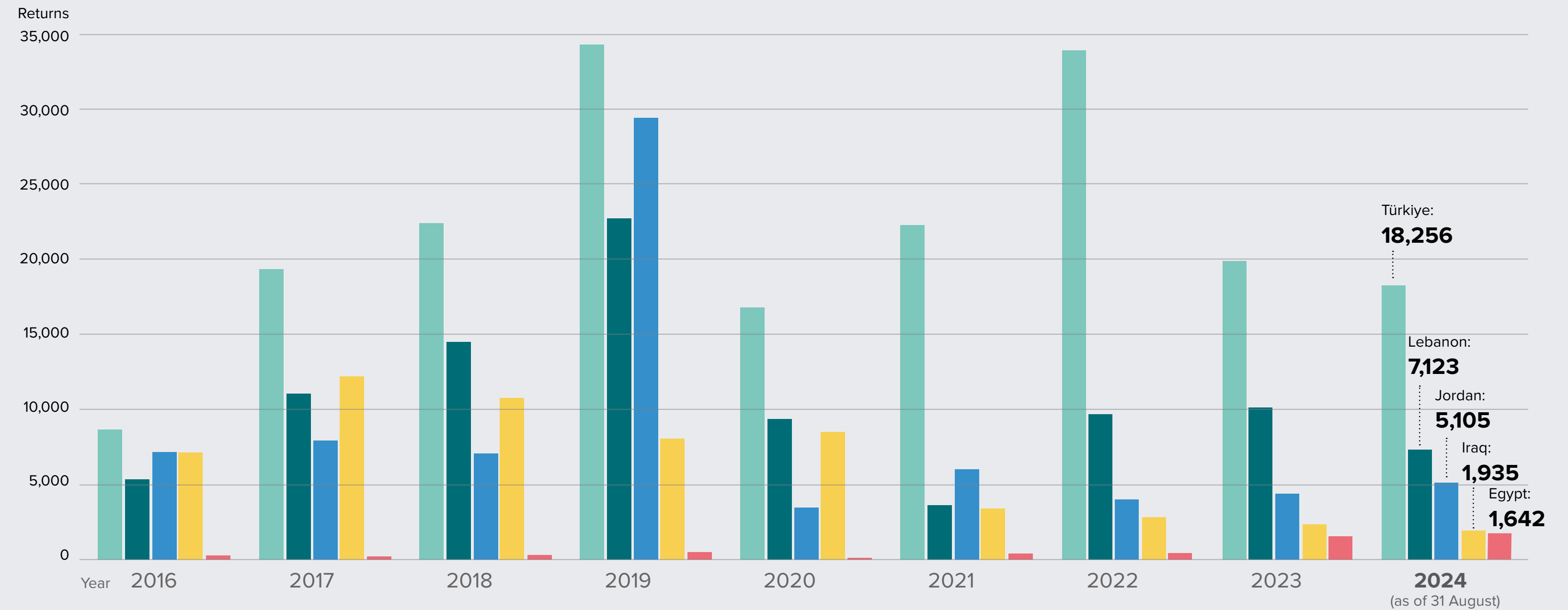

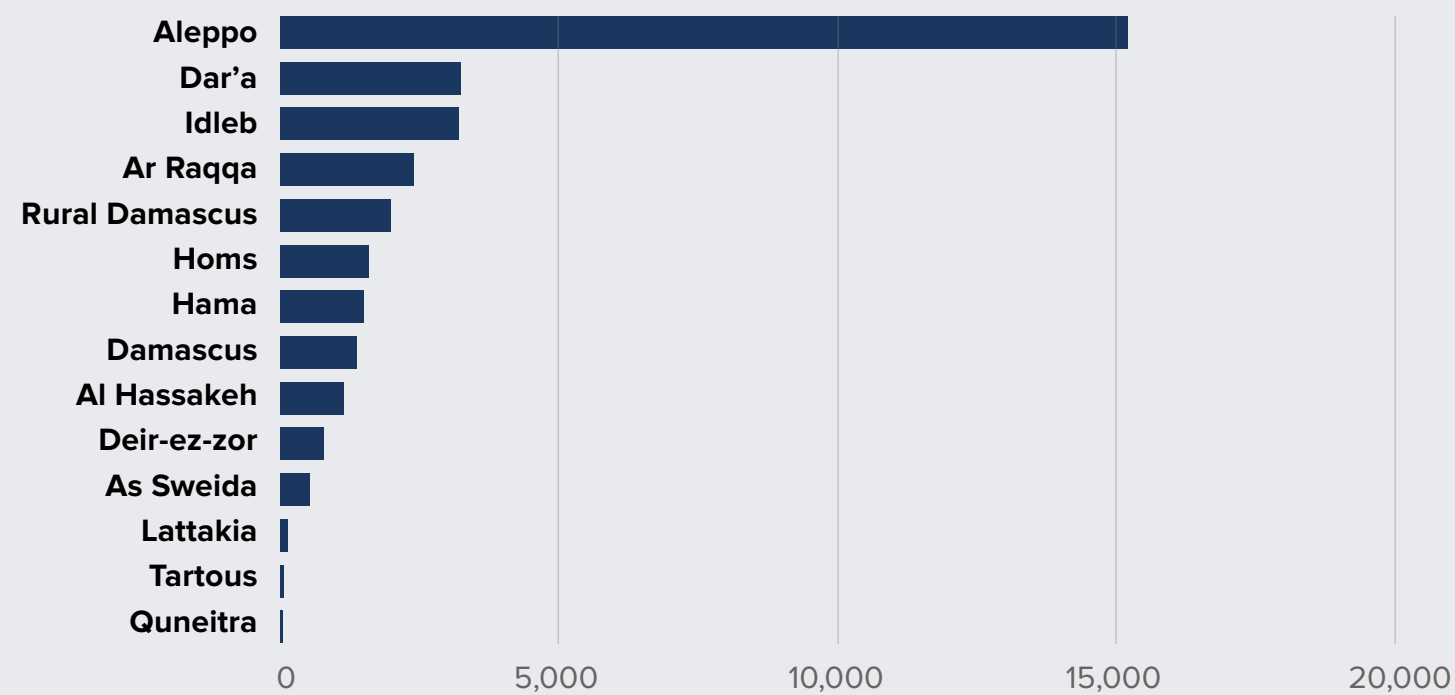

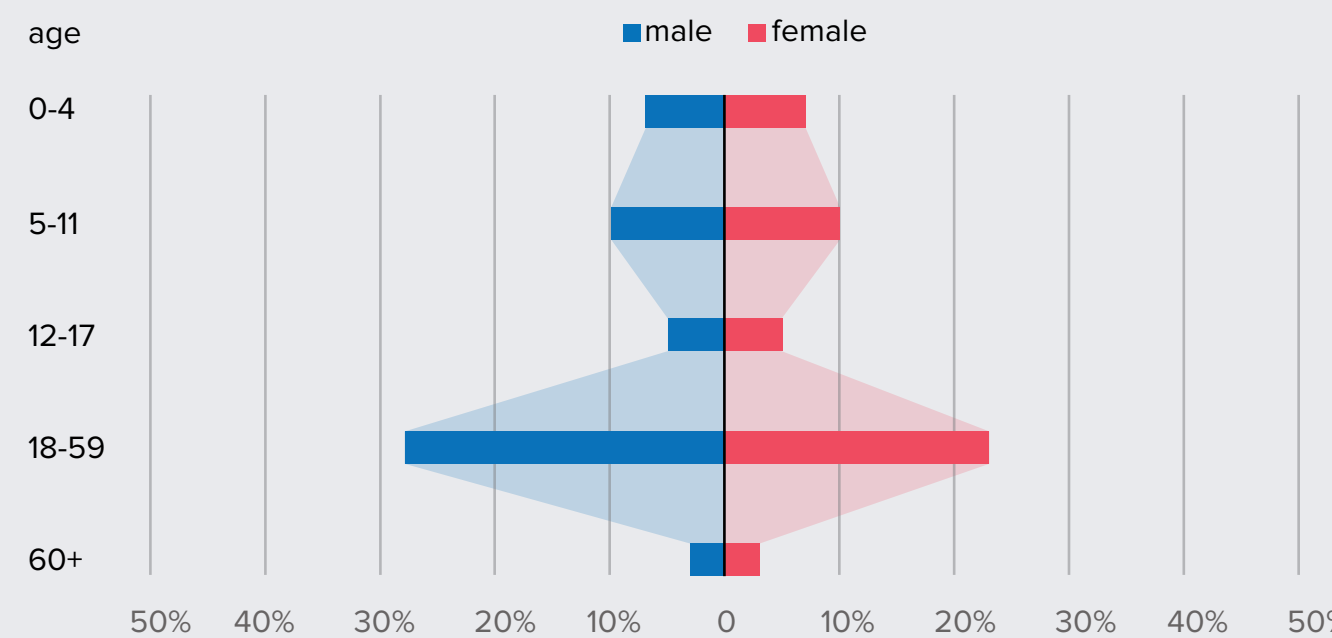
Return Trends per Country



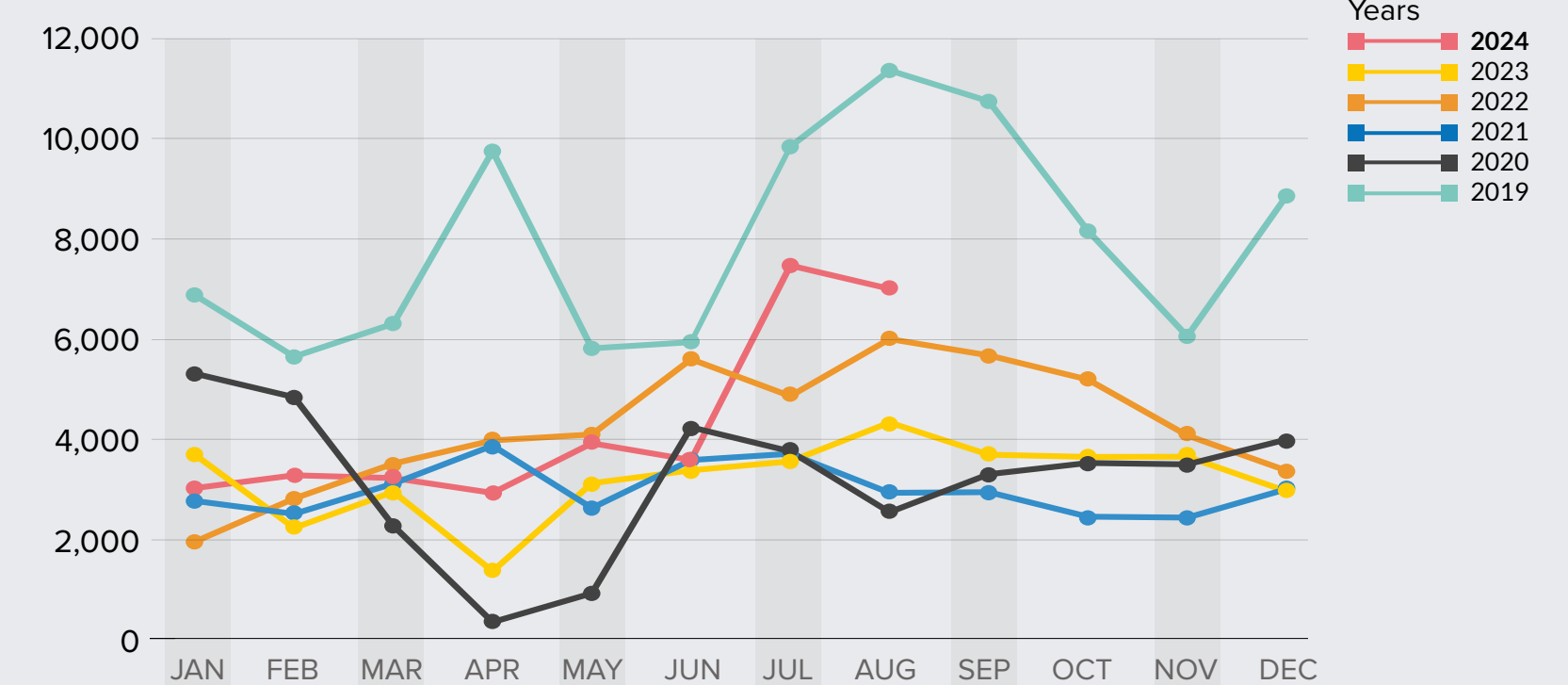
Return by Governorate of Origin (so far in 2024)

Monthly Regional Return Development (in 2024)



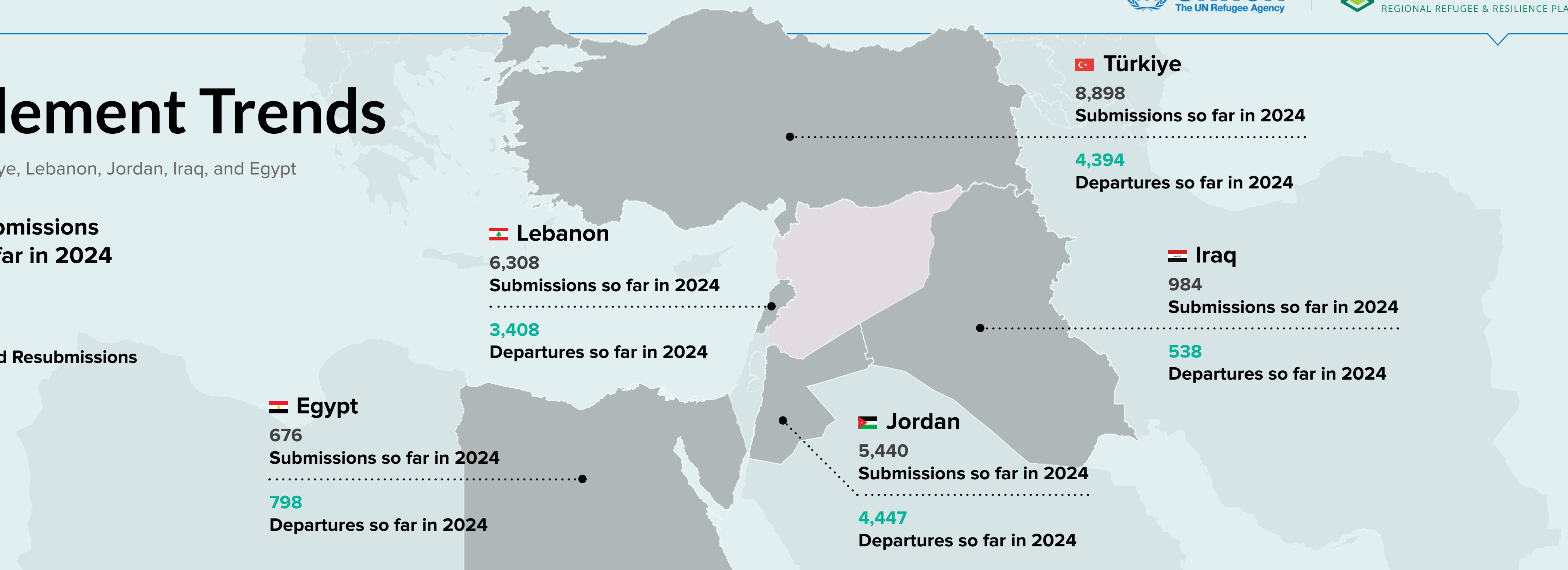

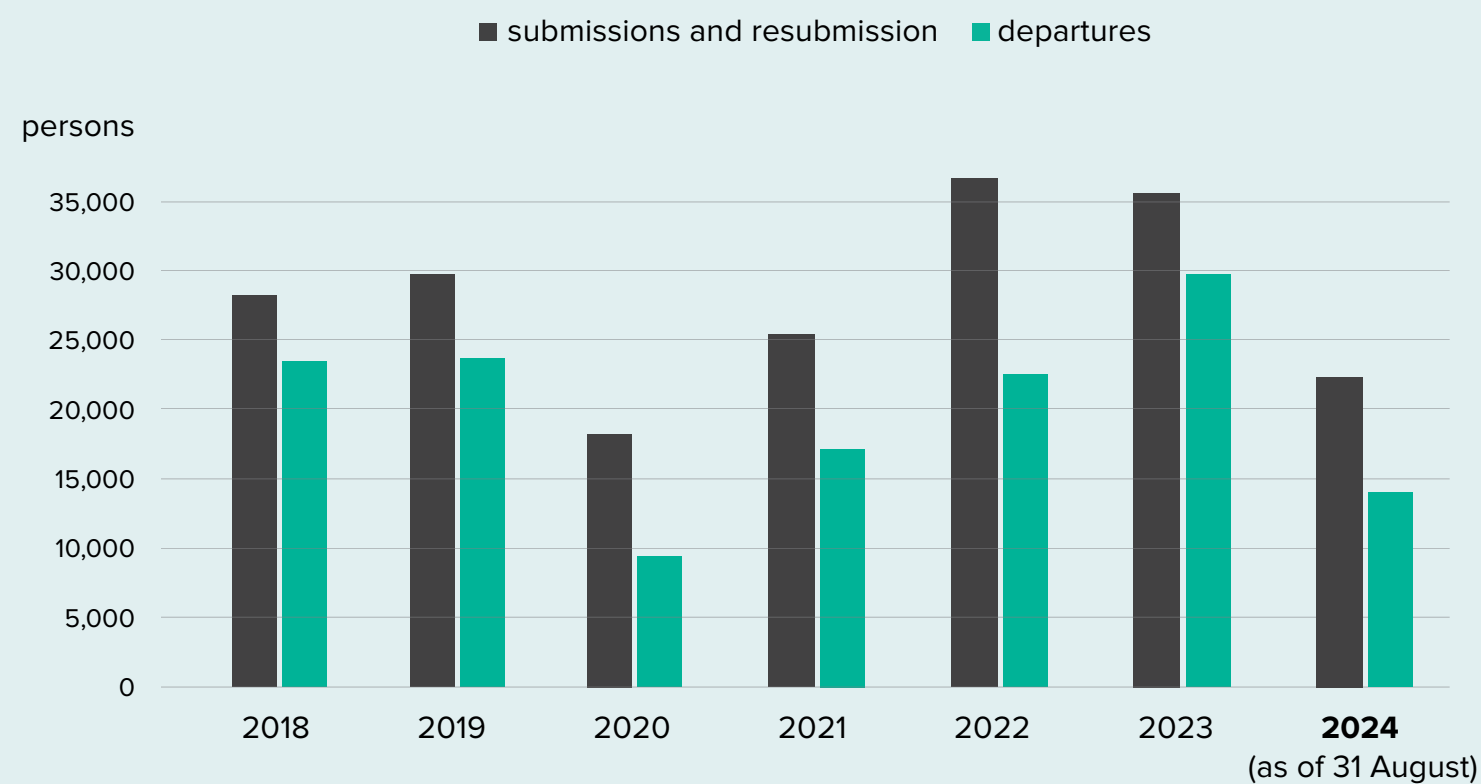

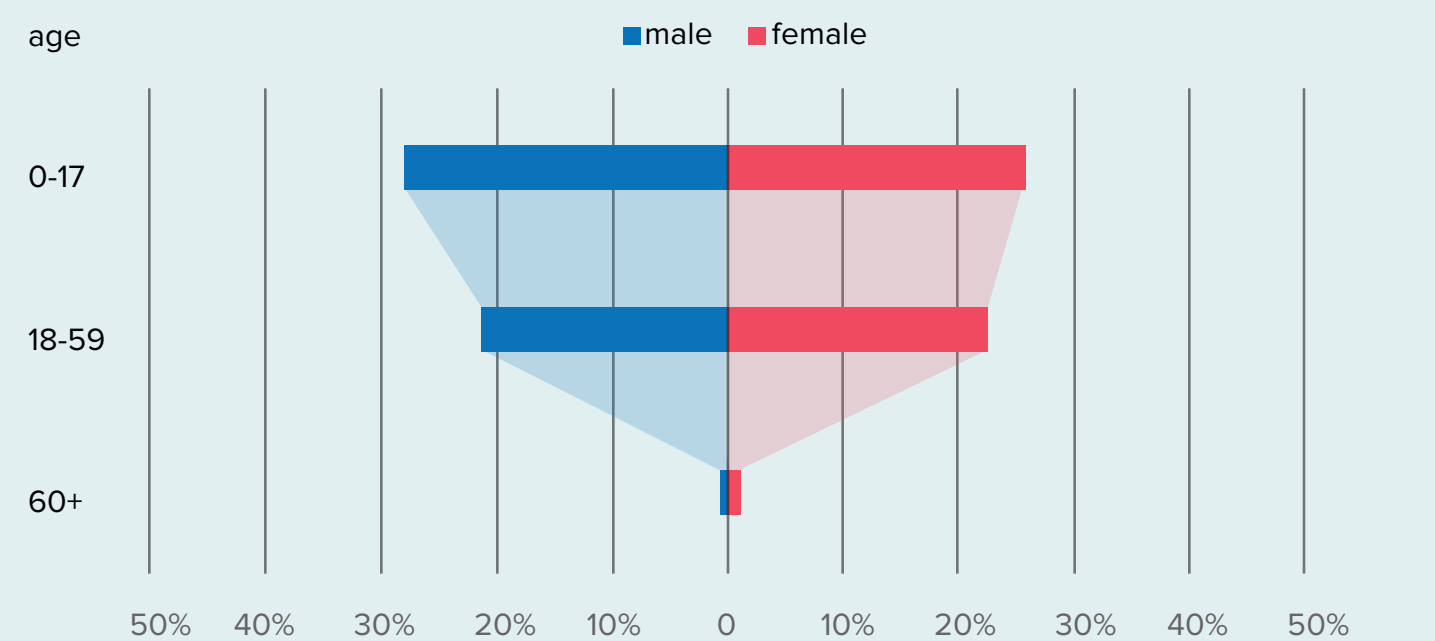


Resettlement in Previous Years
