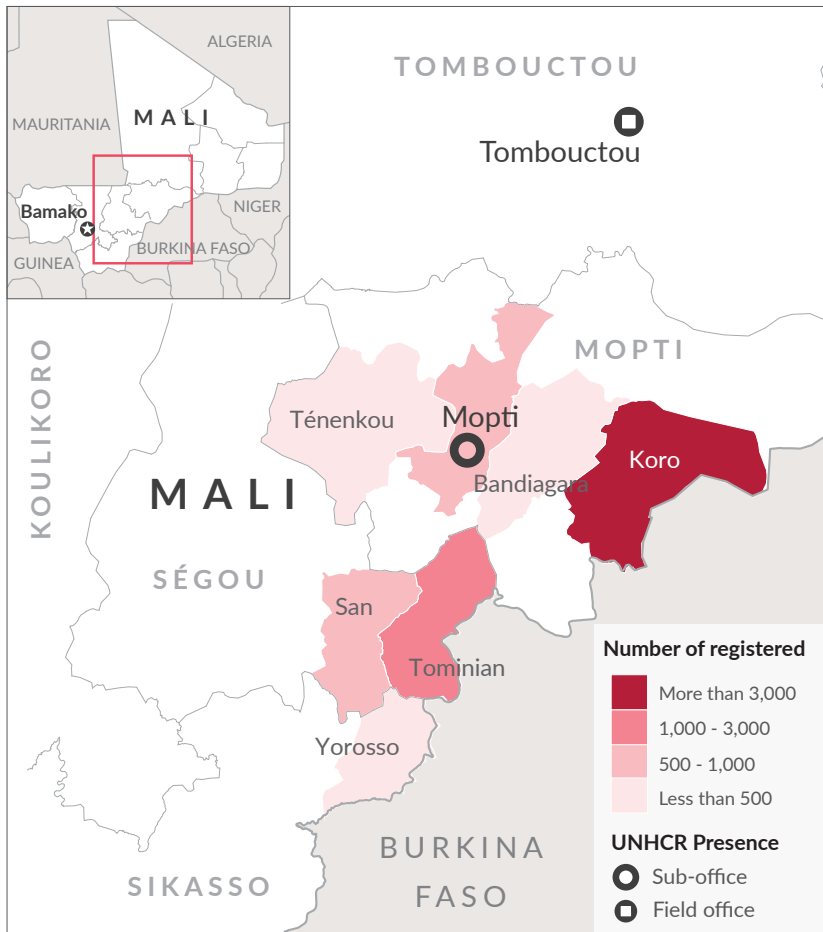


### Context


Since the end of October 2023, there has been a massive influx of refugees and asylum seekers from Burkina Faso, mainly from the Sahel region. They are fleeing because of fear, insecurity and the effects of attacks and incursions by radical non-state armed groups, as well as military operations, including airstrikes by national forces (FDS) on the positions of armed groups. As of September 2024, 82,125 burkinabe refugees are registered (of these, 47,568 have been registered since the beginning of the year) and 50,972 are unregistered in Mali.

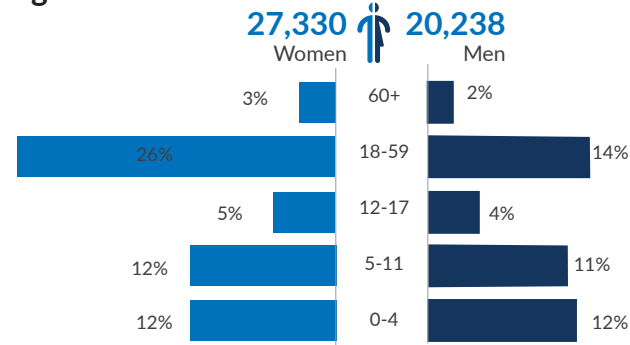

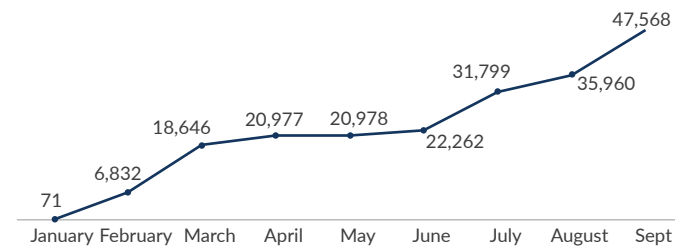

### Evolution of registration

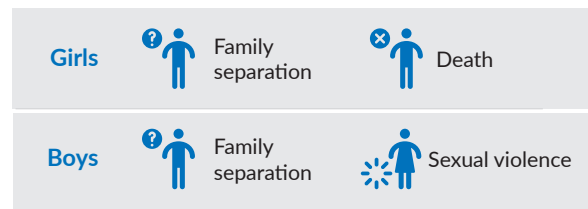

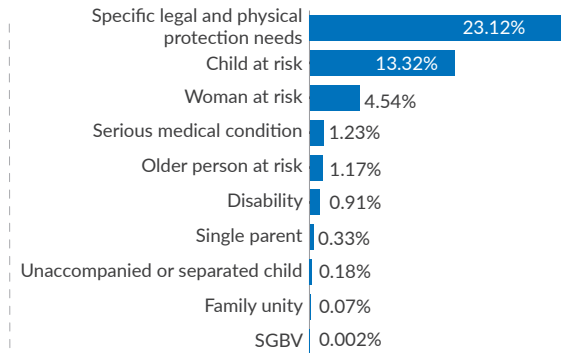

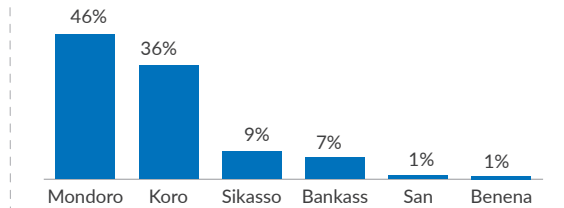

**Multi-sector assistance**

- Wash**  10 private boreholes with water tower
