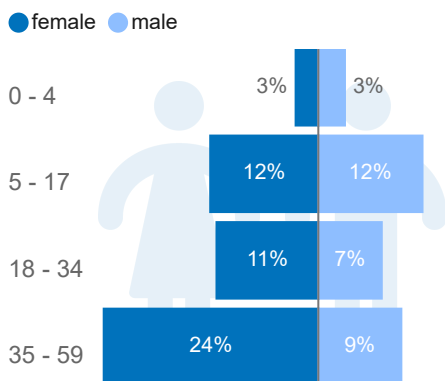

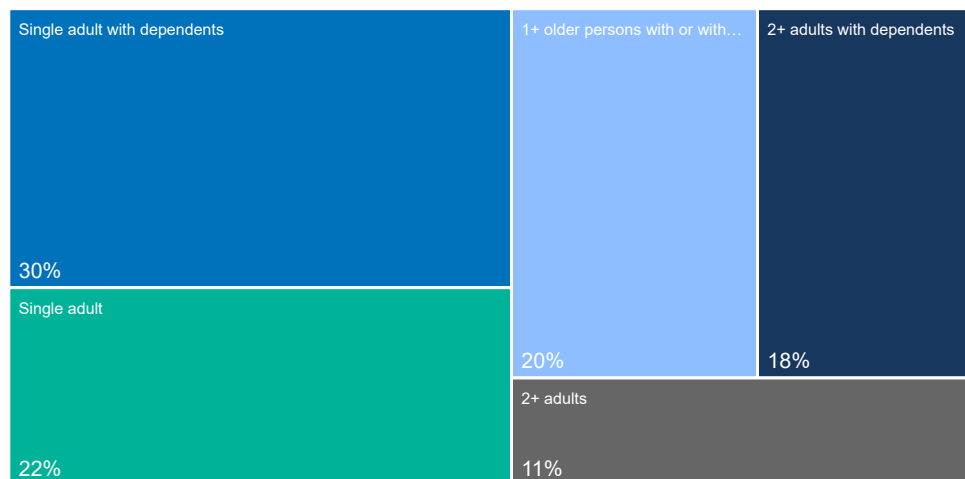
HOUSEHOLD CHARACTERISTICS

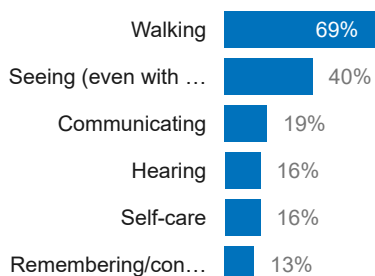

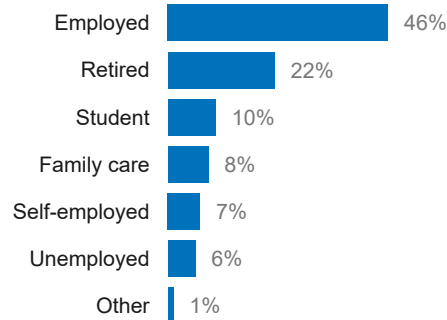

IDENTITY DOCUMENT

16% of respondents have at least one household member missing documentation or whose documents have expired

REGISTRATION OF VITAL EVENTS

10% of respondents reported changes in family composition since their initial departure from Ukraine

FAMILY REUNIFICATION

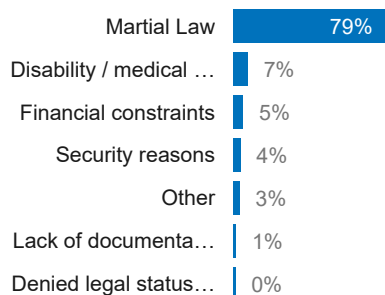

Factors preventing reunification*



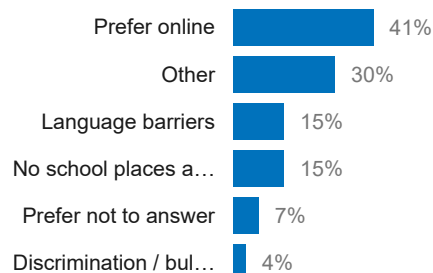

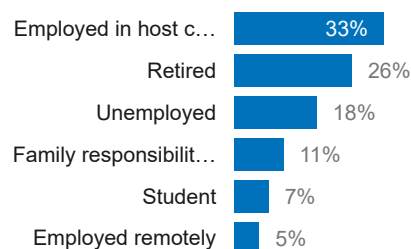

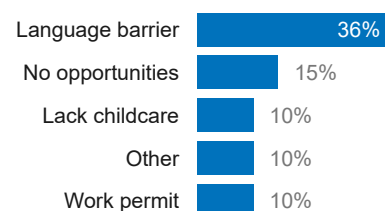

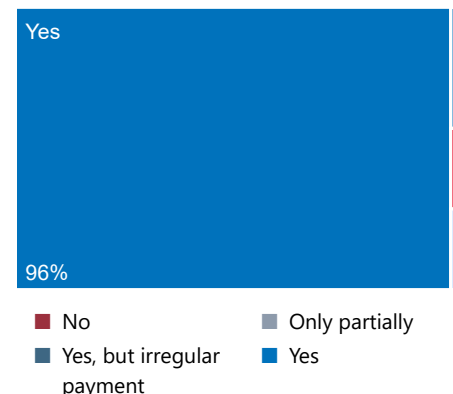

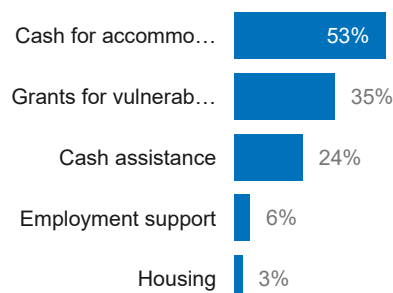

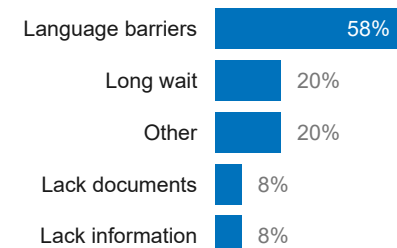
Types of social protection benefits*

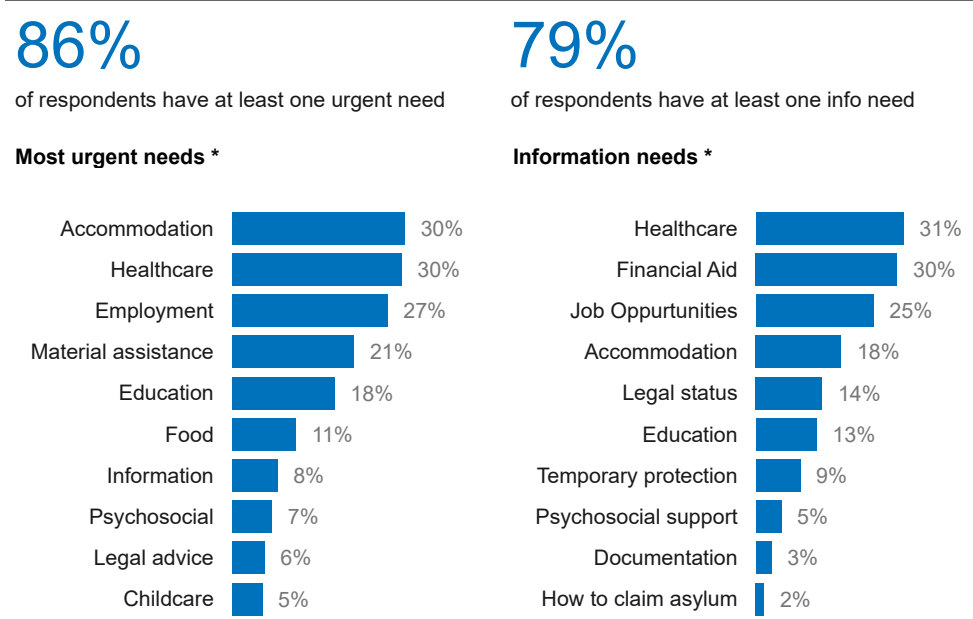

ACCOMMODATION

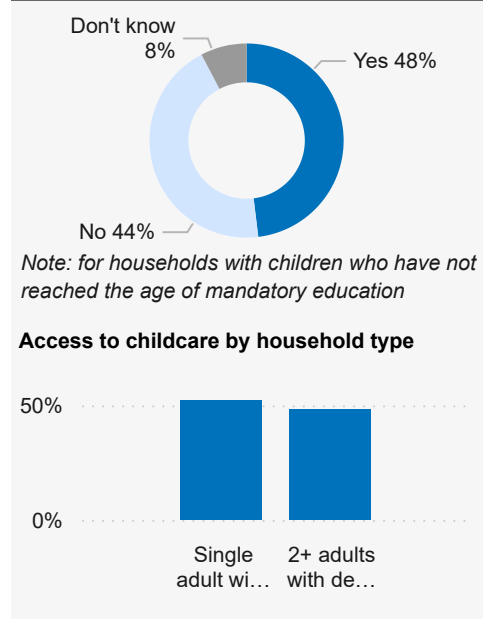
