

**Overview**

Out of 1.2 million people\* who have fled their homes, many thousands have crossed the border from Lebanon into Syria to escape the airstrikes, including Syrians, Lebanese and others. Jdaidet Yabous remains the primary entry point for most of the individuals crossing into Syria.

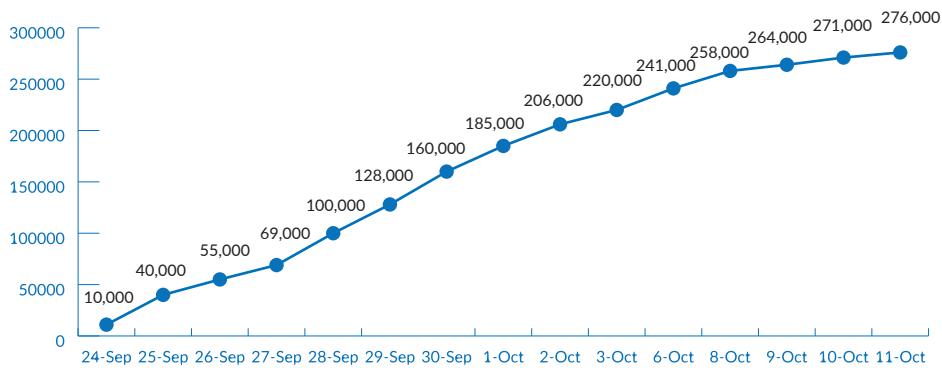

**Arrivals in Syria (estimated percentage)**

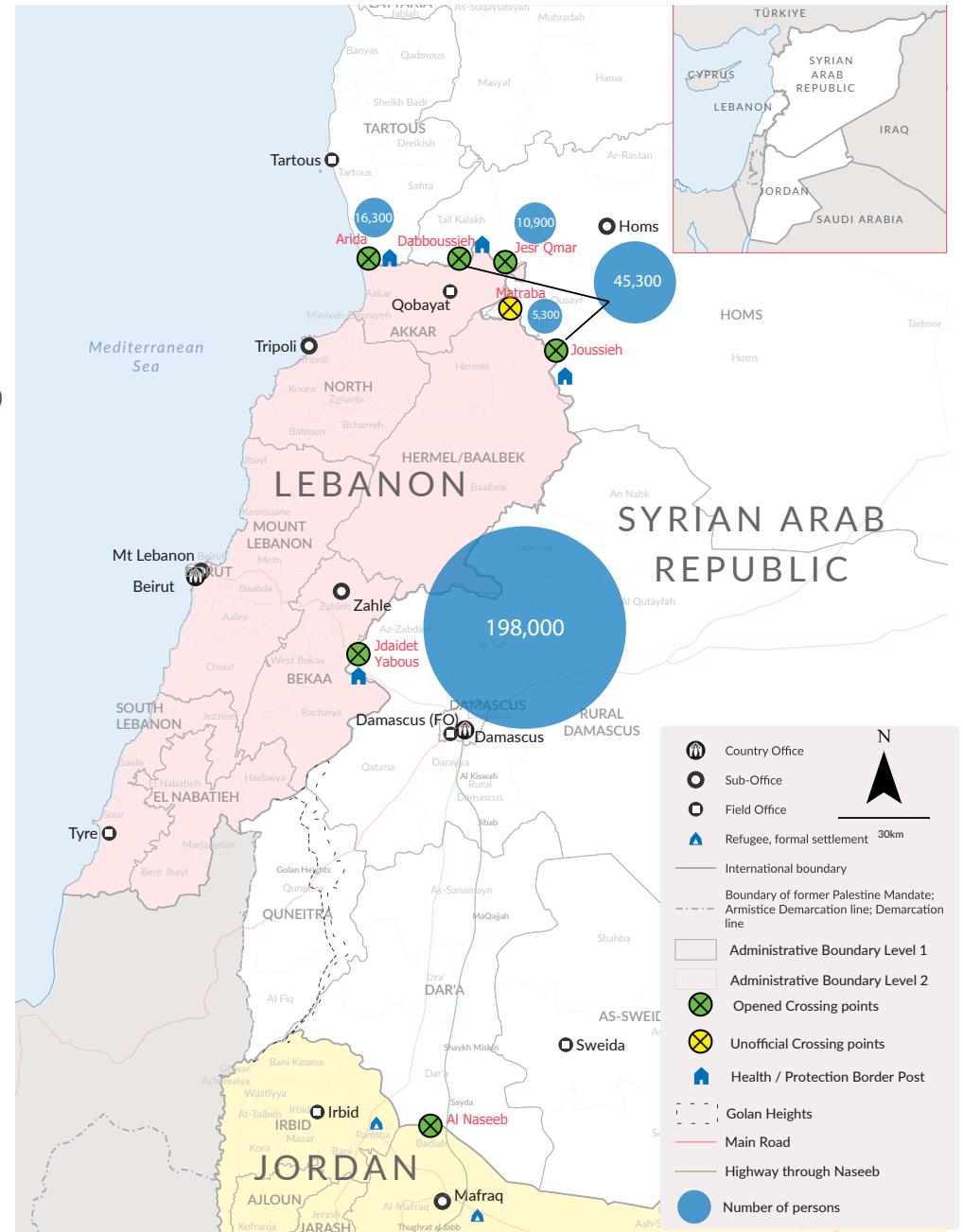


**Cumulative arrivals trend in Syria since 23 Sep 2024**
