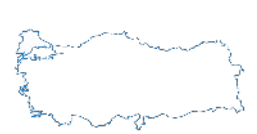

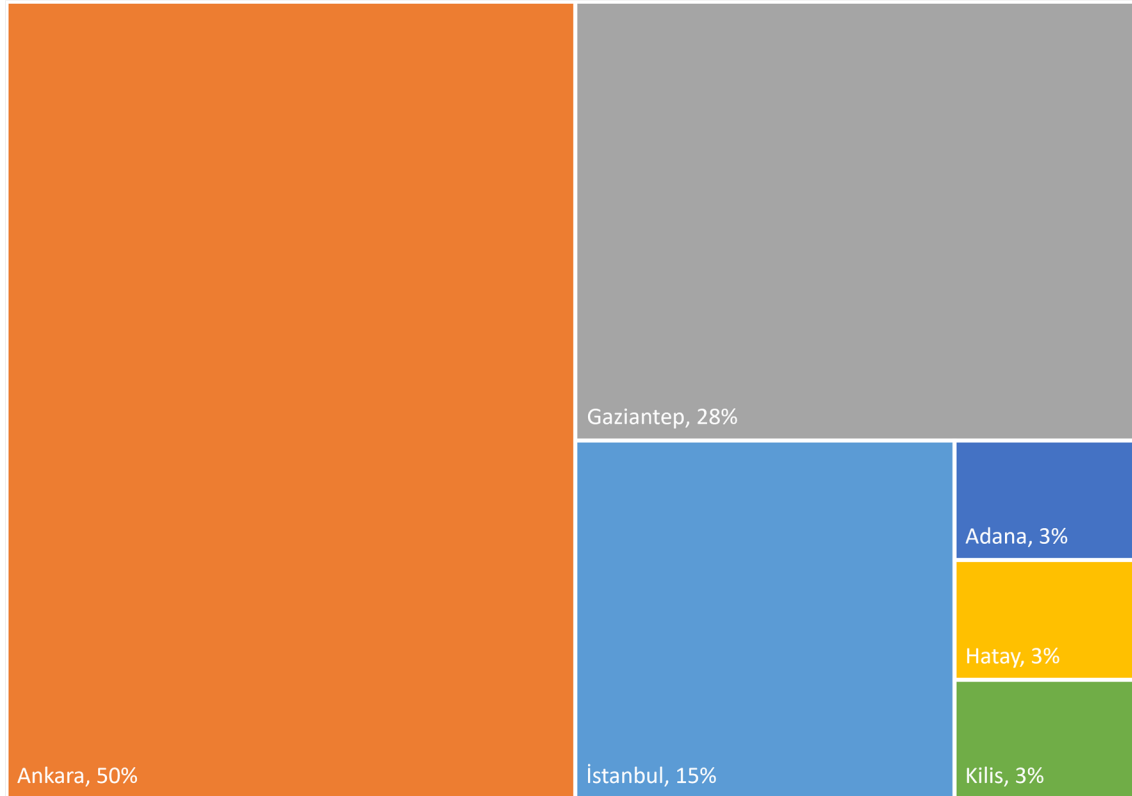

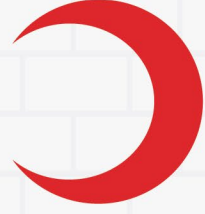

Minimum Expenditure Basket (MEB)



Definition and Purpose of MEB



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Definiton



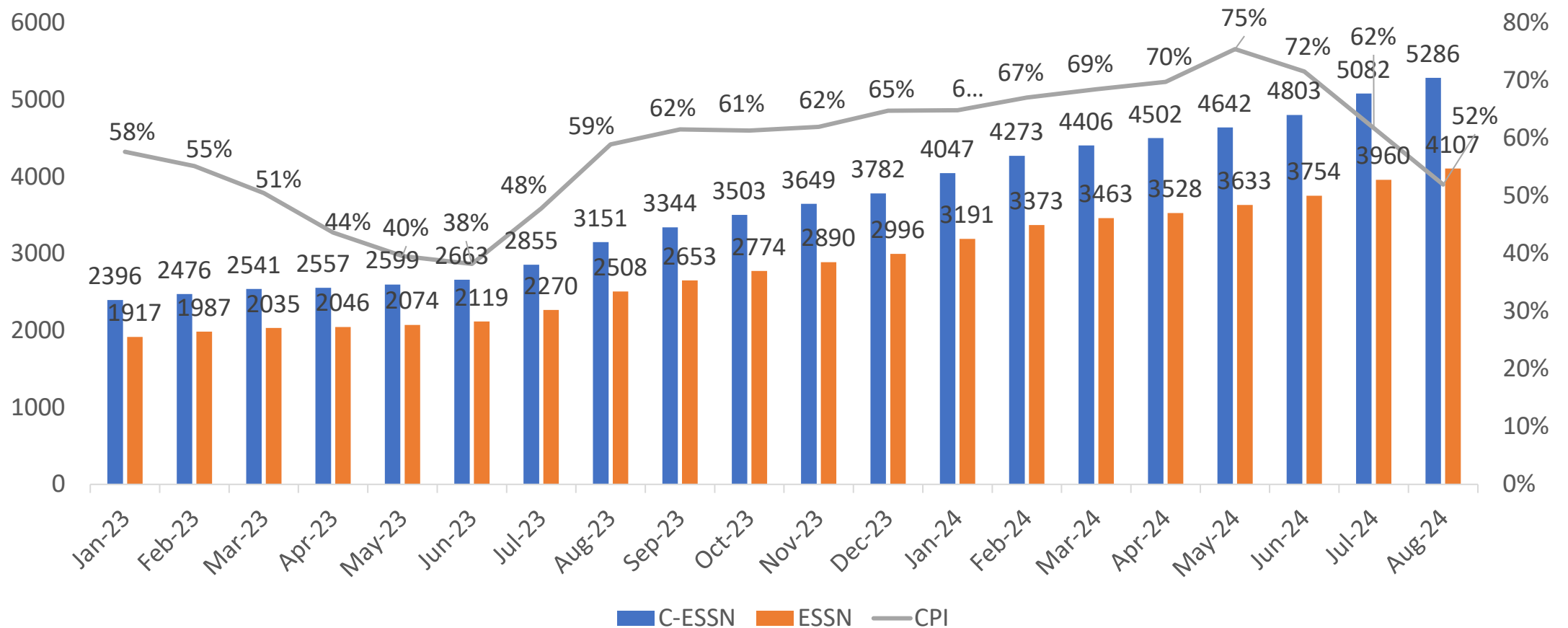
- Tool that captures **basic household needs** met through market transactions.
- Focuses on **average household** costs, excluding one time expenditures.
- Provides insight into **household priorities and sector-specific** benchmarks.
- Calculated according to **Sphere Standards**.

Purpose



- Used in humanitarian aid to design **multi-purpose cash (MPC) transfers**.
- Helps target aid to **essential needs**.
- **Customizable** based on country context, consumption patterns and market structures.

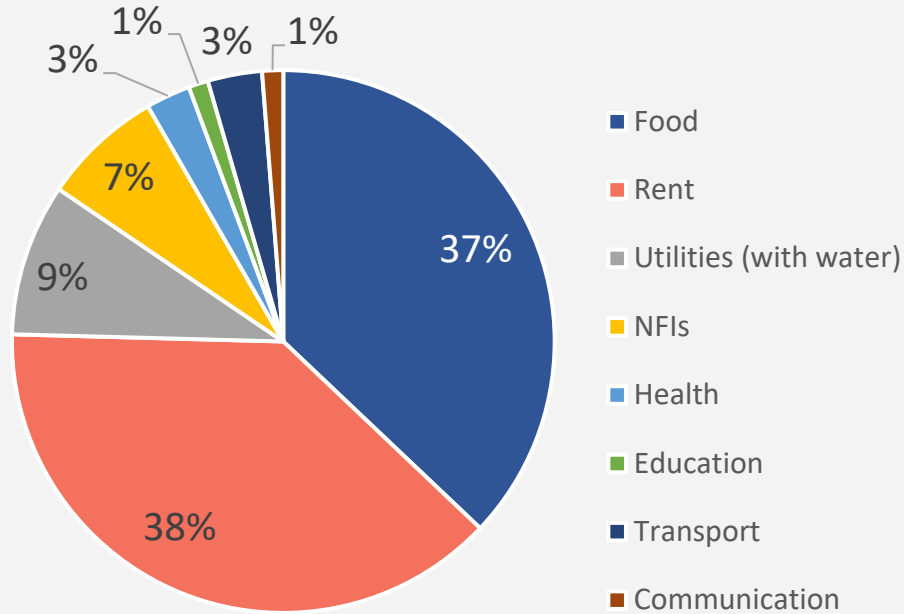

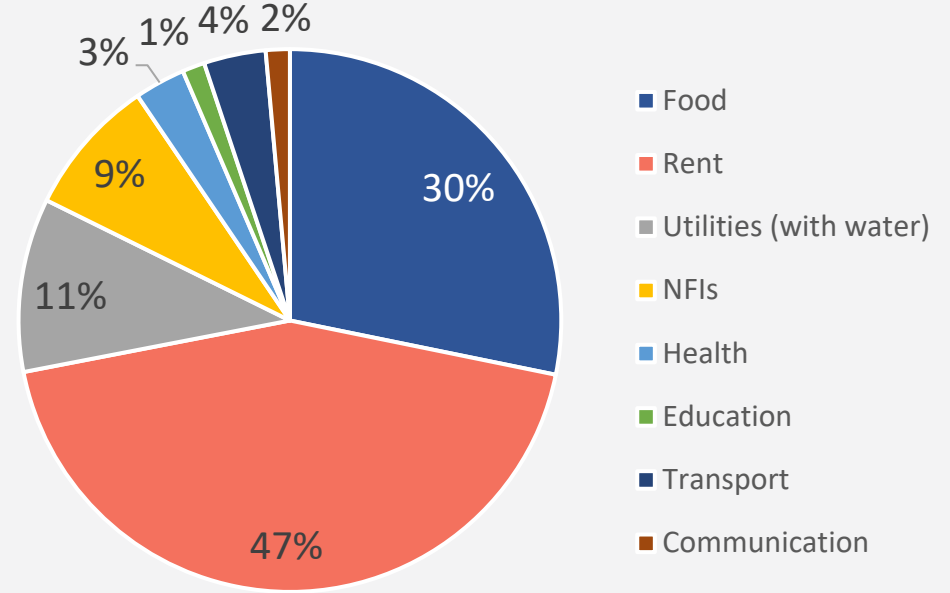
- Food basket is calculated on individual basis and other components are calculated on household basis.
- The MEB basket for ESSN and C-ESSN households is the same, the difference is due to their average household composition.

ESSN MEB Sectoral Share



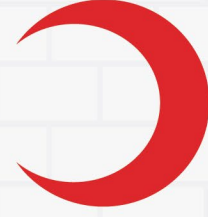
C-ESSN MEB Sectoral Share



- Food and rent comprise the bulk of the basket.
- Since the average household size in the C-ESSN is relatively smaller, the share of rent expenditures is much higher.
- In both projects, rent and food expenditures are followed by utilities and non-food expenditure items.

CASH FOR WINTERISATION



Inter-Agency

Target Population:

- 100,000 refugees (20,000 households, average family size: 5) in 5 heavily impacted provinces
- 20,000 Turkish households (60,000 individuals, average family size: 3) in the same areas
- Focus on urban, rural areas, and temporary settlements with harsh winter condition



End Date of the Implementation:
28 February 2024



Calculation of cash assistance's value:

The winter package accounts for the additional costs of essential winter items. Specifically, these include a fixed cost for heaters (TRY 3,500 per household) and variable costs for winter non-food items and utilities, calculated at TRY 488 per household member.

What is the 3RP?

- The **Regional Refugee and Resilience Plan (3RP)** responds to the **humanitarian, protection and assistance needs** of Syrians under temporary protection, and vulnerable members of the host community, and institutions in the five hosting countries of Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Egypt.
- The 3RP is **nationally-driven** and **government-led**.
- Since 2015, the 3RP has helped mobilise support to the Government-led refugee response in Turkey, with a focus on **public systems and services**.



Role of the 3RP?

- A multi-stakeholder **strategy** in support of Turkey's refugee response, helping to address the humanitarian and development needs of refugees, impacted host communities and affected institutions;
- A **coordination and collaboration** platform;
- A **resource mobilization** tool.

The 3RP has been recognized as a **global model** in line with the Global Compact on Refugees and the principle of "Leaving No One Behind" under the Sustainable Development Goals.



3RP Strategic Objectives 2023-2025

SO #1:

Contribute to the protection of Syrians under temporary protection and persons under international protection.

SO #2:

Promote inclusion and access to services, including health, education, social services, as well as municipal services and local solutions.

SO #3:

Promote harmonization, self-reliance and solutions.



3RP Timeline 2024-2025

September

Consultations at national and sub-national levels

October

Sector consultation with partners (by 15 October).

Revision of sector narratives and logframes (deadline 16 October).

Appeal IM workshop (22 October)

Partner appeals (22 October – 1 November)

November

Sector coordinators review appeals, amendments (15 November)

Sector appeals finalized by sector coordinators and shared with inter-agency coordinators (18 November)

National Stakeholder Consultation Meeting with Government of Türkiye (21 November)

December

Incorporation of GoT feedback into the 3RP narrative

Final Country Chapters due to be sent to Region
