The Incentive- Based Volunteering Scheme (IBV) has been a key aspect of refugee participation in the delivery of humanitarian assistance and other services in the camp. 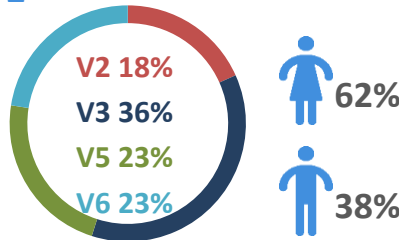

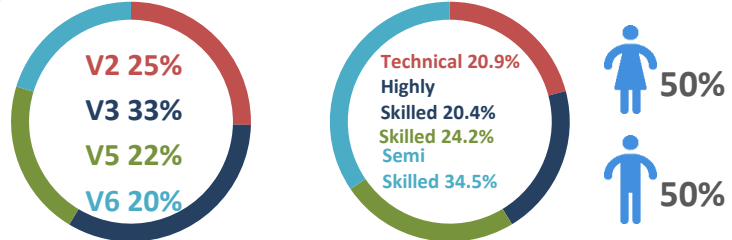

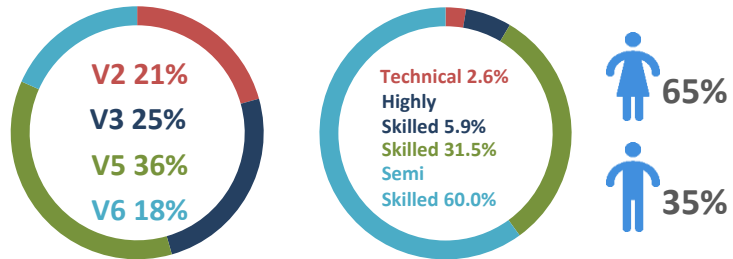

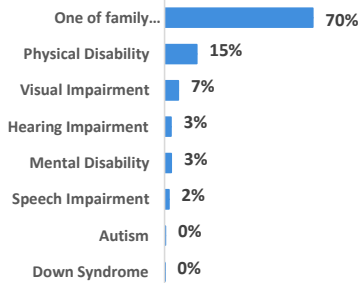

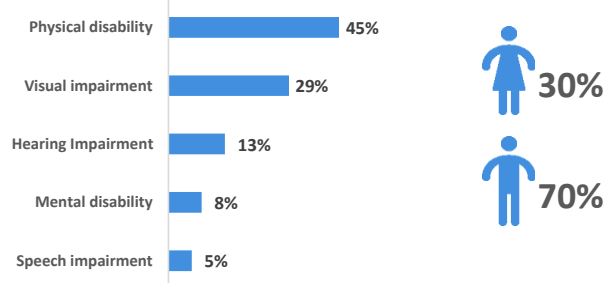
305 Total number of IBV positions rotated during August representing **19%** of total engaged with IBV
