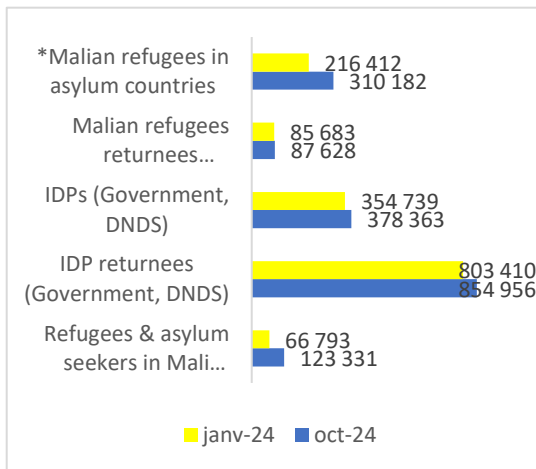

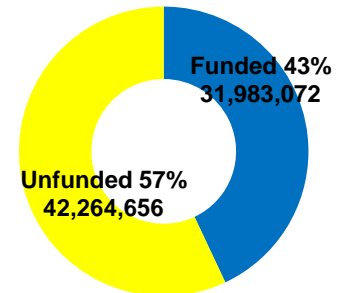

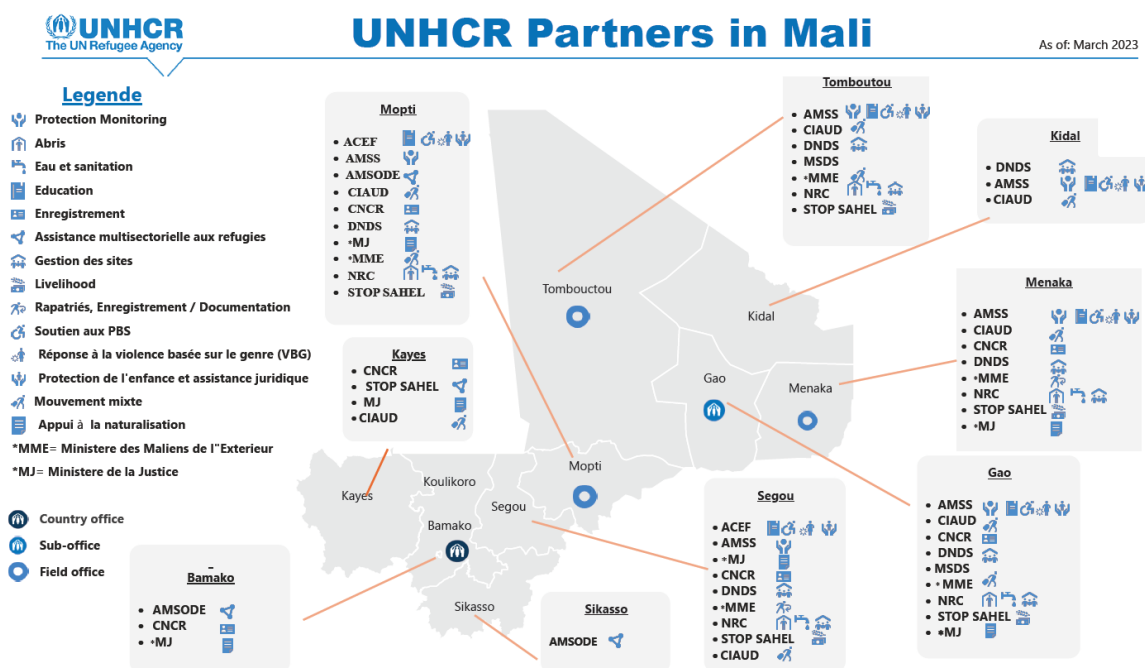

MAIN ACTIVITIES

PROTECTION

Legal protection

- With the support of the UNHCR, 06 refugees obtained Convention Travel Documents (TVC) to meet their travel needs. This will allow them to travel outside Mali to conduct their professional activities, visit relatives, and begin a family reunification procedure.
- In October, in Bamako, 05 refugees (04 men and 01 women) and 06 asylum seekers were received, advised, and oriented on issues related to health, Income-Generating Activities (IGA), resettlement, housing, food, and the asylum application procedure in Mali. All the necessary information and advice was given to them.

Community Mobilization

- As part of its accountability to forcibly displaced persons, the UNHCR Mali free Blue Line received 9,094 telephone calls for the month of October 2024, of which 46% were requests for information on UNHCR and its partners, 27% concerned assistance queries, and 27% concerned GBV awareness and Education.

Mixed Movements

- In October, mixed movement monitoring activities recorded 2,976 (1,682 men, 856 women, 254 boys, and 184 girls), i.e. 1,836 people (38%) more than in September 2024, and 1,391 people (47%) more than in same reporting period (October) in 2023.
- Also, 203 awareness sessions on various themes including the process of determining refugee status, the consequences of irregular migration, the importance of registering civil status documents, the importance of children's education, and the mandate of UNHCR and GBVs were organized in several regions of Mali.

Education & Health

- In order to contribute to the success of the 2024/2025 school year, UNHCR has handed over a total of 3,000 school kits to the Koro education authorities in the Bandiagara region. These are 1,600 school kits for refugee students, 900 kits for internally displaced students, and 500 kits for students from host communities. These kits are intended to equip the recipient students and contribute to their good learning. Similarly, 500 school kits were distributed to students in Mopti, including 168 refugees (102 girls and 66 boys), 332 IDPs, and the host community.

- To synergize efforts with other humanitarian actors, UNHCR, through its partner ACEF, has referred 9 cases of illness, including 8 cases to Médecins sans frontières (MSF) and 1 case to the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) in Mopti. All the cases referred are refugees.

Persons with specific needs

- In October, a total of 114 beds, 55 mattresses, 126 pairs of sports shoes, 79 kettles, and 100 notepads were distributed to the elderly, women heads of households, and vulnerable children in Mopti.

Statelessness

- The launch of the project entitled Late Registration of 5000 births in the regions of Kayes, Mopti, Timbuktu, and Gao took place in Kayes in September. The entire month of October was devoted to the presentation of the project in the regions of Mopti, Timbuktu, and Gao. The missions to present the project in the localities concerned were carried out with the UNHCR, the National Directorate of Civil Status (DNEC), Stop Sahel, and AMSODE. The aim was to discuss the practical modalities of the activity, with on one side the mayors responsible for civil status and the general secretaries of the identified town halls, and on the other side the clerks and presidents of the courts concerned.
- It should also be noted that the interministerial committee for the fight against statelessness was invited by UNHCR in collaboration with the Ministry of Justice and Human Rights to a workshop in Segou from 11 to 13 September 2024. This workshop to review the national action plan for the fight against statelessness made it possible to take stock of the action plan initially established as part of the #JExiste campaign and develop a work plan for the next three years. This workshop was an opportunity for UNHCR to present to all members of the interministerial committee for the fight against statelessness the global alliance to end statelessness.
- A training session on the themes of "the rules governing civil status in Mali" and "statelessness" was held from October 29 to 31, 2024 in Gao. This workshop organized by UNHCR for mayors responsible for civil status and their general secretaries and members of the Gao civil documentation working group was opened by the Prefect of the Gao Circle in the company of the Head of the UNHCR Sub-Delegation and the Deputy National Director of Civil Status. 34 people took part in this highly appreciated workshop, the main recommendation of which was to reproduce it for the benefit of declaration agents.

Durable solutions:

Resettlement

- During October, profiles of 3 households of 12 people were established, for the purpose of assessing their need for resettlement.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD-ITEMS (NFIs) & WATER, SANITATION, AND HYGIENE (WASH)

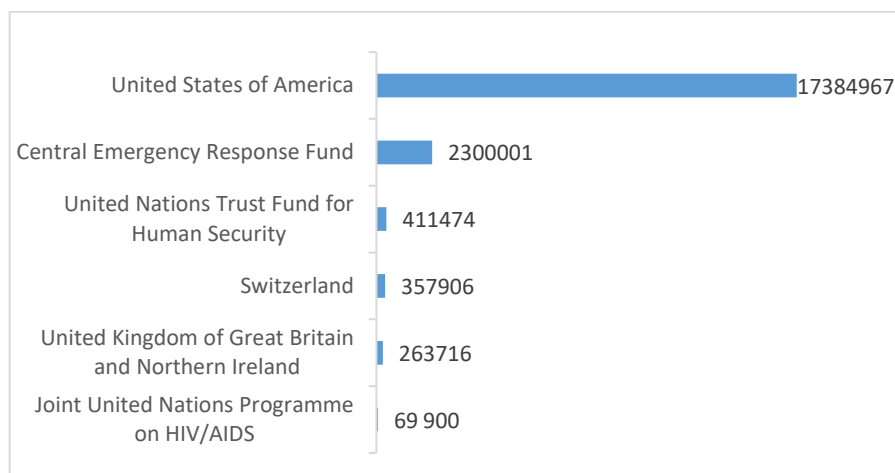
In October, UNHCR provided:

- Transitional shelter assistance to 599 families of 2,970 refugees in Gao
- Emergency shelter support to 332 refugees in Menaka
- Support for the rehabilitation of shelters for the most vulnerable households identified as part of the celebration of the month of solidarity and the fight against exclusion in the Menaka region. This support enabled 409 vulnerable people (149 girls, 116 boys, 85 women, and 59 men) from the host community to strengthen their shelters.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

UNHCR is grateful for the critical support provided by donors who have contributed to this operation as well as those who have contributed to UNHCR programs with unearmarked and broadly earmarked funds.
