

In January 2025, approx 30,000 new internal displacements were monitored by the UNHCR-led Protection and Solutions Monitoring Network (PSMN). Major drivers include conflict and insecurity (20,489 - 68%), drought (8,268 - 27%), and other reasons (1,458 - 5%).

Overall, in January 2025, PSMN recorded the highest number of internal displacement in **Kismayo** (5,850) followed by **Banadir** (5,350) and **Qandala** (4,300) districts, respectively.

### Refugee Returnees (Since 2014)


Data presented in this report relates to returnees arriving in Somalia as of January 2025.

Since December 2014, UNHCR has supported **96,618** Somali refugees to return to Somalia. Additionally, a total of **44,276** Somalis were monitored as arriving spontaneously.


Somali returnees from Kenya by month



Assisted spontaneous returnees from Yemen by month





#### Returnees, refugee and asylum seekers map




Number of returnees (with assistance from UNHCR) by Year
