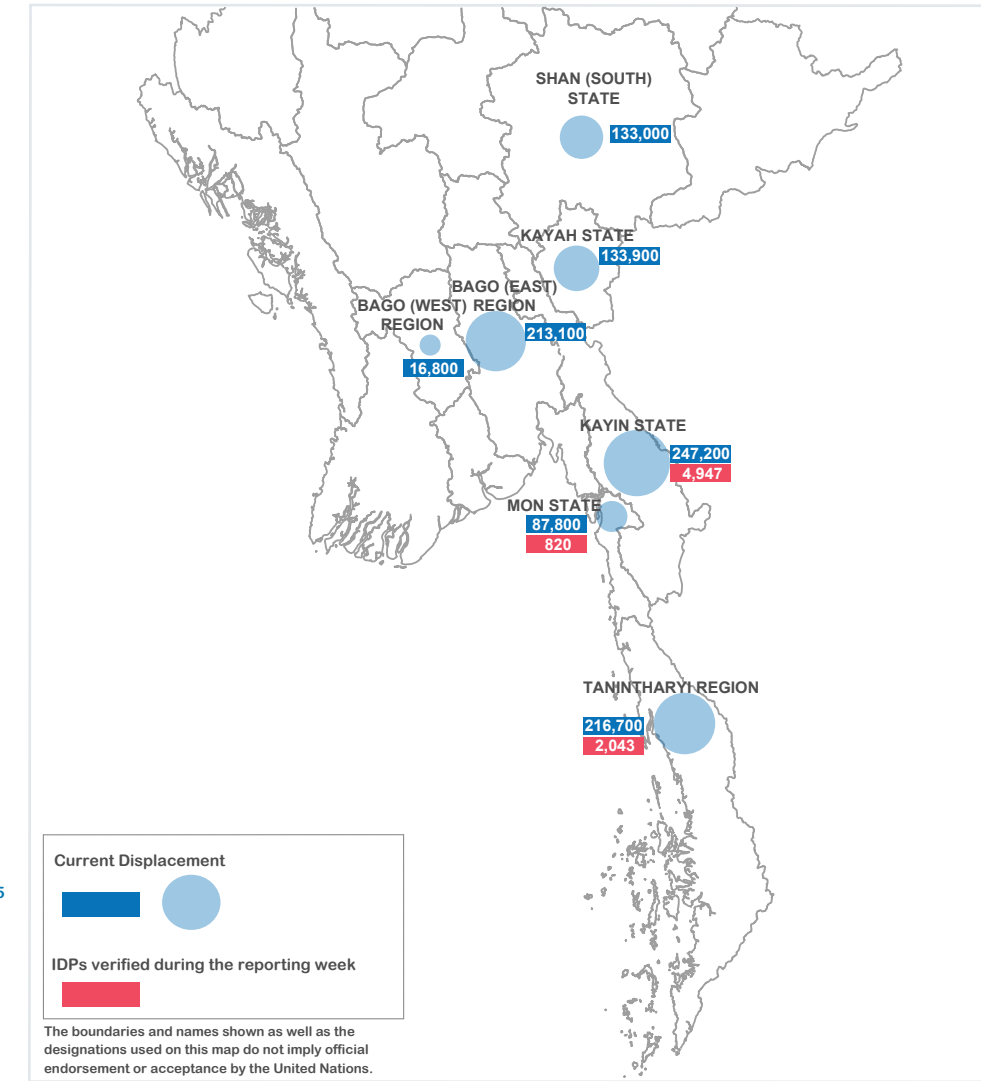

## WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

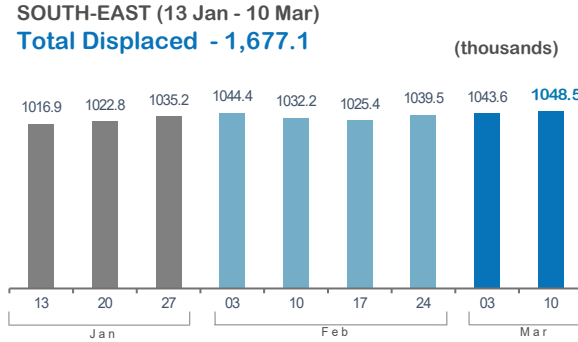
In the South-East, the number of IDPs increased from 1,043,600 last week to 1,048,500 this week.

In Tanintharyi Region, 2,043 people from War Kone and Par Ka Ri, Dawei Township, were displaced within the same township due to a Tatmadaw troop raid into the villages, resulting in the destruction of the village. Additionally, 1,450 IDPs returned to their place of origin, in Dawei Township, due to livelihood concerns.

In Mon State, 820 people from Kyaikto Township, were newly displaced within the same township. However, 1,500 IDPs returned to their place of origin in Pyin Ka Doe Kone, Kyaikto Township, Mon State, in December 2024 – the data was just recently verified.

In Kayin State, 984 people from Hlaingbwe Township, were displaced within the same township due to airstrikes, indiscriminate shelling by the Tatmadaw, and potential clashes in the area. Additionally, 16 people from Mei Ka Nei, Myawaddy Township, were displaced within the same township due to intensified fighting. Furthermore, 1,780 people from Mee Zaing, Hpa-An Township, were displaced to Myaing Gyi Ngu, and 2,128 people from War Kaw Kyay, Hpapun Township, were displaced to Myaing Gyi Ngu. Additionally, 39 people from Ka Taing Ti, Hpapun, were displaced to Kamarmaung Town due to potential clashes, indiscriminate shelling, and airstrikes.
