Context

Inter-Agency coordination in support of the refugee response in Türkiye takes place within the Regional Refugee and Resilience Plan (3RP) framework. The 3RP is a regionally aligned framework addressing humanitarian and protection needs while also aiming to enhance the resilience of refugees, host community members, and Turkish public institutions.

Designed in close collaboration with the Government of Türkiye to facilitate cooperation between public institutions and civil society, the 3RP serves as a strategic planning and response management mechanism - ensuring responsibility sharing, effective use of resources, and delivery of services complementing each other. The 3RP has established linkages between humanitarian and development approaches. The plan also serves as a fundraising platform by identifying the financial requirements of partners to implement their response and creating linkages with private sector actors, donors, and partners. UNHCR is now finalising the 3RP Return Addendum that contains a response plan within the strategic framework for voluntary return to Syria as established by the Government of Türkiye as well as a revised 2025 appeal.

UNHCR's Role in the Coordination Structure

The activities carried out by the 3RP partners are coordinated primarily through sectoral groups at the national level, focusing on various key priorities of the response. In addition, sub-working groups and task forces focus on specific issues. Furthermore, sub-national coordination mechanisms operate at the provincial level.

The 3RP is co-led by UNHCR and UNDP. In addition, UNHCR chairs the Protection and Basic Needs sectors and the Information Management working group. UNHCR also co-chairs the Cash-based Intervention working group. In the southeast, UNHCR co-chairs the earthquake response coordination platform. Within the scope of the United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework, UNHCR co-chairs the results group on International Protection and Migration Management.

Key Coordination Activities

To ensure an evidence-based and coordinated response, UNHCR and partners regularly conduct coordinated and – where feasible – joint surveys and studies, such as the Inter-Agency Protection Needs Assessment, to evaluate the needs of refugees, host community members and public institutions. In addition, while developing the 3RP response strategy, widespread qualitative consultations are organized at sub-national and national levels. These consultations support the identification of priorities, approaches, and gaps from the perspective of state institutions, civil society, as well as – crucially – refugees and asylum seekers.

To ensure the most impactful support to refugees, sectoral working groups have developed programming standards and collective Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) where relevant. Furthermore, the 3RP sector coordinators, various agencies, and experts conduct capacity development initiatives, including participation of public institution staff. UNHCR has developed the Services Advisor tool that provides a live map of all services available for refugees and host community members across Türkiye.
