Refugee returns

UNHCR estimates some **371,900** Syrians¹ have crossed back to Syria via neighboring countries since 8 December 2024. Of this figure, some **123,328** are estimated² to be Syrian individuals returning from or via Lebanon including up to 50% Syrians from abroad transiting through Lebanon or those with residency in Lebanon engaging in temporary or pendular movements.

Movements are currently occurring through both official crossing points and unofficial crossing points where UNHCR border monitoring indicates a substantial proportion of pendular or temporary movements. As a result, accurately tracking the full number of individuals crossing is challenging.

While precise figures of returns are pending returnee registration, UNHCR, together with the Government of Lebanon, will make this information available once voluntary return programmes are implemented. Voluntary return programmes will track detailed records and demographic information, including areas of intended return of Syrian refugees known to UNHCR in Syria and will facilitate cross-border checks and deduplication.

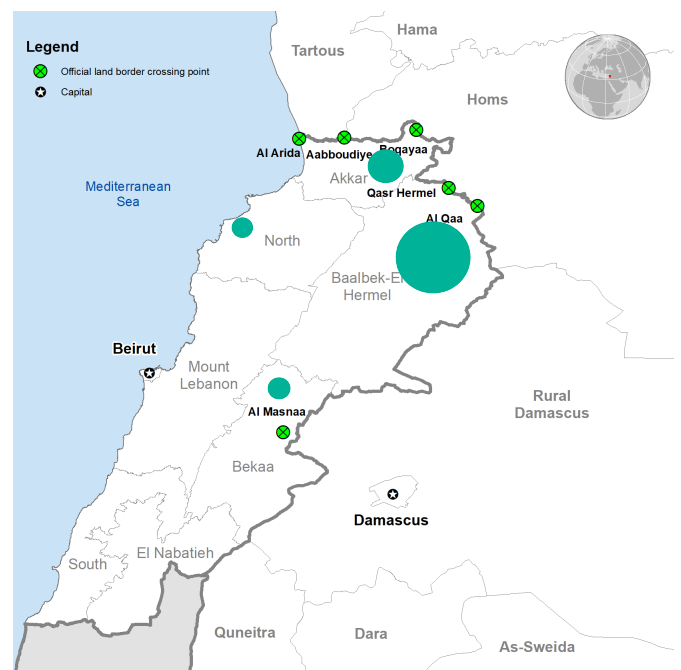
Inactivations due to verified or presumed returns of Syrian refugees registered in Lebanon

UNHCR in Lebanon regularly verifies reported returns of Syrians against its records. So far in 2025, 97,021 individuals³ have been inactivated from UNHCR's registration records in Lebanon due to verified return or presumed return, including 65,417 individuals who fled during the escalation of hostilities in Lebanon in 2024 and who remained in Syria.

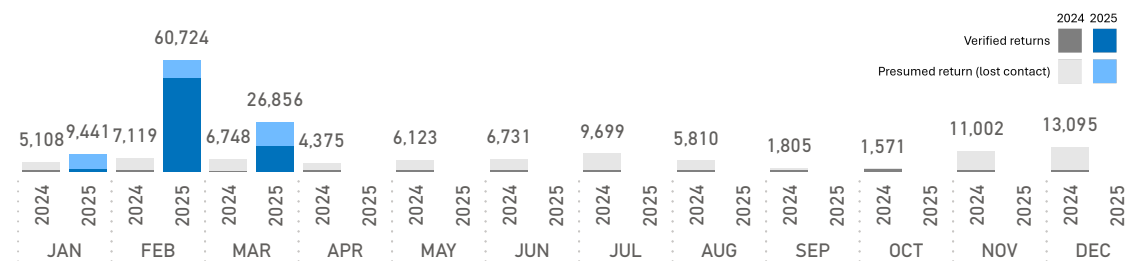
New arrivals

New arrivals of some 98,988 Syrians have been recorded since 8 December 2024 including 71,068 in Bekaa & Hermel in late 2024, and 24,045 in Akkar and North governorates in March 2025⁴.

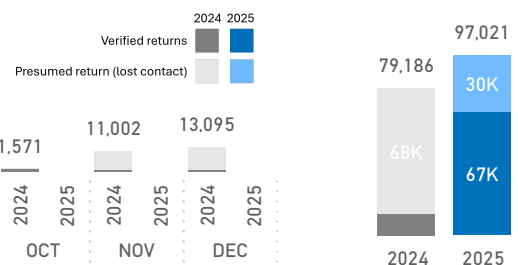
Illustrative map* of new arrivals by governorate
