Foundation Towards Dialogue

Foundation Towards Dialogue, in partnership with IKEA Retail in Poland, launched the pilot program "Path to Employment: Strengthening Professional Competences of the Roma Community". This initiative includes Ukrainian Roma refugees alongside the Polish Roma community, promoting inclusive access to the labor market. Through vocational training, soft-skills development, job application support, and cultural sensitivity workshops for employers, the programme equips participants with the tools needed for sustainable employment.

The collaboration with the private sector underscores the critical role of businesses in fostering integration and highlights the valuable contributions refugees can make to the economy when given equitable opportunities.

"Safe Haven," established in Warsaw, provides support for those forced to flee their country due to the war in Ukraine. The initiative aims to support refugees' integration by enhancing their language proficiency and promoting their mental well-being. Through regular educational and therapeutic activities, the Foundation helps refugees build a new daily life in Poland — without fear, with a greater sense of security and dignity.
