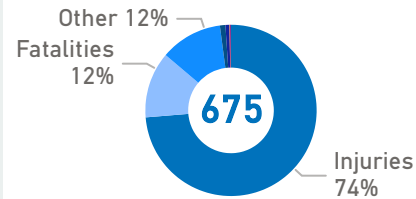


Overview: The Uganda National Conflict Mapping Dashboard (January 2026) presents a comprehensive analysis of 2,821 reported conflict related incidents from January 2021 to January 2026 across 8 Refugee settlements and surrounding host communities. The dashboard highlights key trends in conflict types, parties involved, and geographic distribution, with most incidents reported in Rwamwanja, Kyaka II, and Rhino Camp. Major categories include GBV (28%), crime (25%), and Child Protection (13%), with domestic violence, animal theft, and child neglect being the most reported sub-types. The data sourced primarily from community members police and local structures, reveals that refugee-refugee conflicts account for 73% of all incidents. The dashboard serves as critical tool for humanitarian actors, offering insights into conflict dynamics, casualties (4,689 injuries and 322 fatalities).

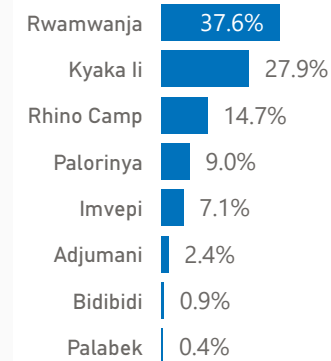
