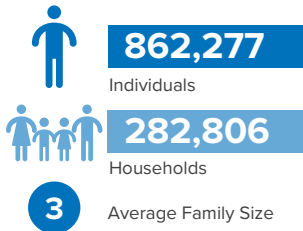


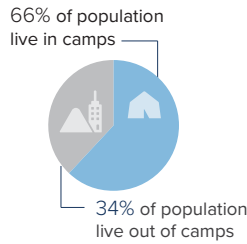
Overview of Refugees and Asylum-seekers in Sudan

Persons With Disabilities



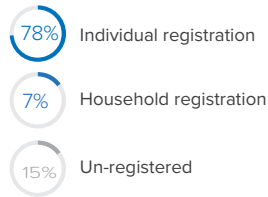

Despite the ongoing conflict that began in April 2023, Sudan continues to host a substantial number of refugees, totaling 862,277 as of 31 March, 2026. Most of these refugees are from South Sudan (74.1%), followed by Eritrea (15.7%), Ethiopia (8%). Among refugees, 273,000 self-relocated to safer areas within Sudan. While 3.6 million departed Sudan to neighboring countries, Sudan still remain a welcoming country of asylum, with 6,834 new arrivals in 2026, mainly from South Sudan, Eritrea and Ethiopia. 66% of the refugees are accommodated in camps, while the remaining 34% live outside of these facilities. 51% of the refugee population is female and 49% are male.

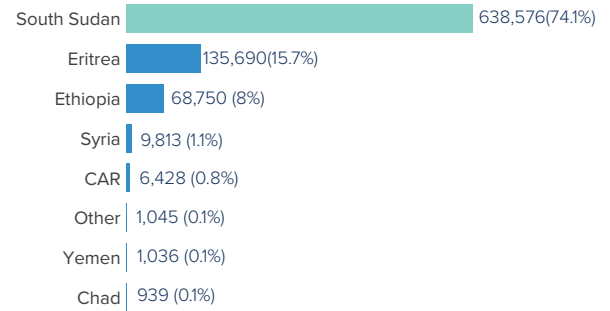

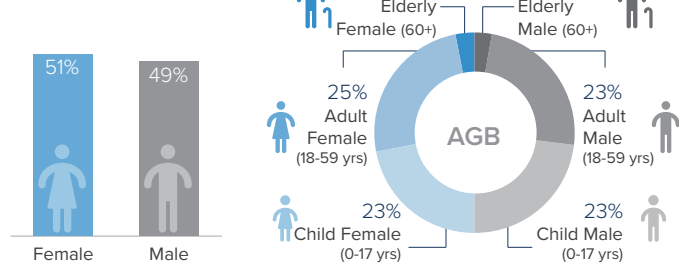
New Arrivals Per Month (2025-26)



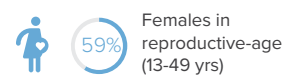
Country of Origin



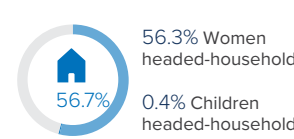
Age-gender Breakdown²



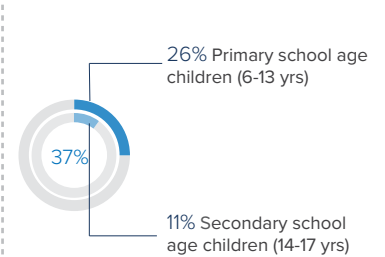
Reproductive- age Women/Girls²
