

**SITUATION OVERVIEW**

- Nigerians make up 3.5% of the world's 117 million forcibly displaced persons, including both internally displaced individuals and Nigerian refugees, primarily in the Lake Chad Basin.
- Conflict, insurgency, and communal violence have displaced millions, with the North-East experiencing the highest displacement.

**REFUGEES AND ASYLUM-SEEKERS IN NIGERIA**

- Nigeria hosts refugees & asylum-seekers from over 45 countries, with majority from Cameroon
- Most refugees are concentrated in border states across the North East (Borno, Adamawa, Yobe), North Central (Benue), and South South (Cross River) regions of Nigeria.
- 13,071 individuals are awaiting registration.

**INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS**

- 2,333,190 individuals displaced in the North East, primarily due to insurgency (92%) and communal clashes (6%).
- In the North West, 793,534 individuals are displaced, while the North Central region has 584,590, driven by various conflict dynamics.

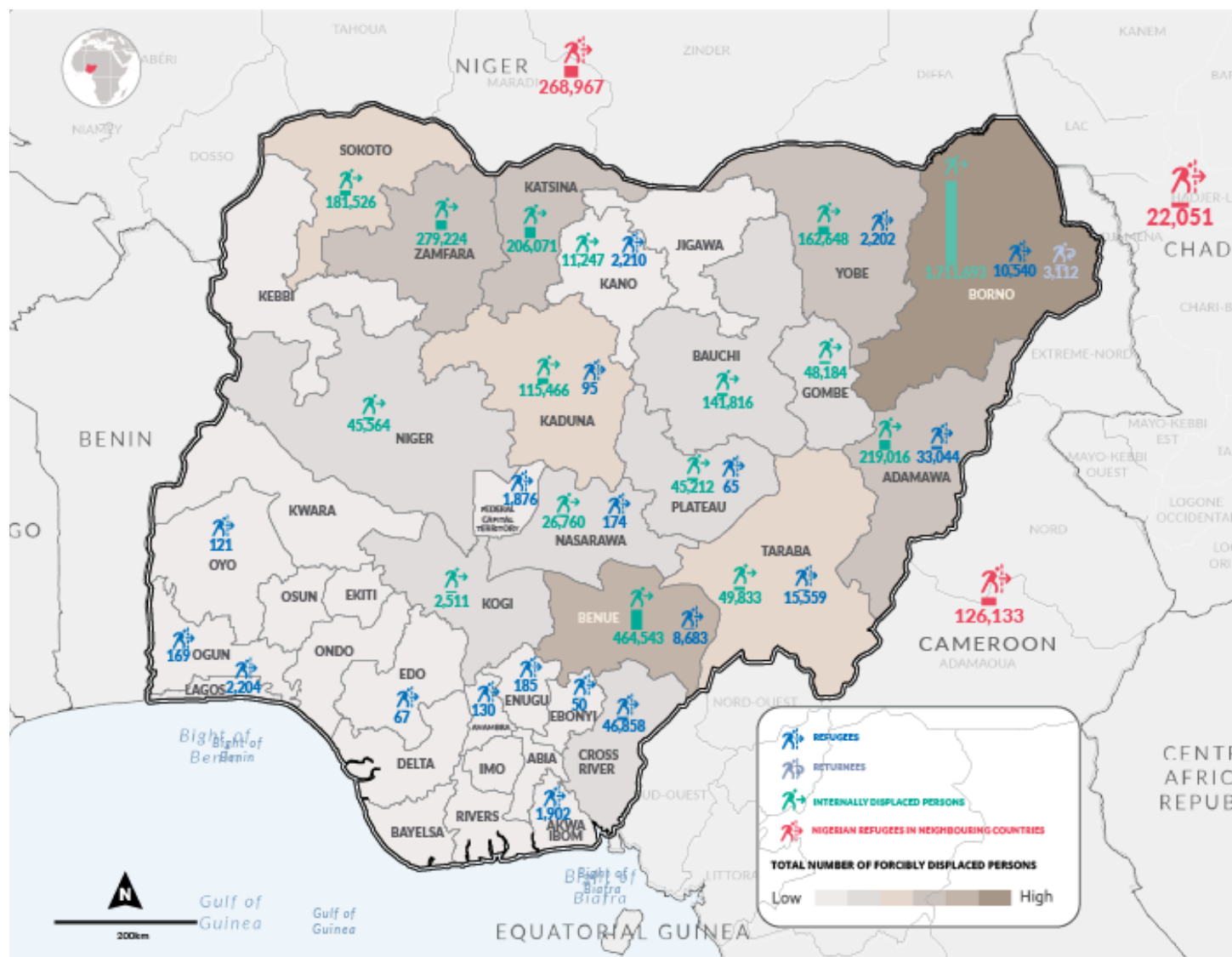

**REFUGEE RETURNEES**

- Under the tripartite agreement, 3,083 Nigerian refugees were voluntarily returned to their areas of origin in Borno State.
