





**WEEKLY STATISTICS**



**Weekly registration: 13-19 May.-2013**

- 1 During the current week (13 - 19 May), 60 individuals have been registered; 10 are active. With the introduction of the new GoSS resolution, 50 individuals have been registered and not provided with ration cards in Yida.
  - 2 0 out of 60 are newborns.
  - 3 45% of new arrivals are minors and 55% are above 18 years.
  - 4 53.33% are female, 46.67% are male;
  - 5 **Rejections:**  
7 individuals have been rejected this week:  
- 7 South Sudanese women and children.
  - 6 **Transfers:**  
- 178 individuals were transferred from Yida to Ajoung Thok and 195 individuals were transferred from Pariang to Ajoung Thok. 25 individuals were spontaneous arrival to Ajoung Thok. As of May 19 Ajoung Thok camp host 844 refugees.
  - 7 Majority of new arrivals come from Heban and Al Boram.
- INACTIVATION/RE-ACTIVATION:**
- 81 individuals were inactivated during the week (back to Nuba Mountains)
  - 2 active combatants have been de-registered
  - 1,342 individuals inactivated because they missed the two last GFDs
  - 6 individuals have been re-activated.
  - 0 individuals who missed verification were rejected following interviews
  - 9 individuals were closed, they died.
