


A total of **45,995** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2014; with 995 arriving from Burundi, 1 from Cameroon, 5 from Congo Brazzaville, 975 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 11 from Eritrea, 519 from Ethiopia, 1 from Pakistan, 1 from Russia, 63 from Rwanda, 2 from Saudi Arabia, 1205 from Somalia, 39,738 from South Sudan, 1,490 from Sudan, 105 from Uganda and 1 from Yemen. In addition, the Sub-Office has received **815** South Sudanese 'returnees' and their records reactivated; bringing the total arrivals figure to **46,810**.

The total new born babies so far registered in 2014 is **3,988**.

**285** individuals were registered during the forty ninth week of 2014 [30th Nov - 6th Dec 2014]; 5 from Burundi, 13 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 5 from Eritrea, 3 from Ethiopia, 6 from Somalia, 233 from South Sudan, and 20 from Sudan. As at 9th Dec 2014, the overall registered population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **177,821**.

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at **4.5** individuals. Family size 1 households represented **45.6%** of all newly registered households.

**Additionally, we have so far received approximately 44,492 individuals arriving from South Sudan en masse as a result of the ongoing conflict.**



**Registration Breakdown in Weeks**

NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
