


# South Sudanese new arrivals in Gambella - Post 15<sup>th</sup> December 2013 (as of 22-May-2015)

## Gambella Region Map



\*- This figure does not include the old caseload of 58,135 South Sudanese refugees registered pre 15th December 2013 [Breakdown: Pugnido = 44,024; Okugo = 4,111, Wanthowa- estimated 10,000]

In addition to 205524 South Sudanese refugees in Gambella region, there are 9,264 refugees at the camps in Assosa [Breakdown: Pre 15th Dec 2013 = 6,129; Post 15th Dec 2013 = 3,135]

\*\* - This figure does not include the old caseload of 10,000 South Sudanese refugees living in Wanthowa Woreda who arrived pre-15 December 2013.

\*\*\* - The figure includes 12,496 refugees in Leitchour and Nip Nip refugee camps are being relocated to new locations due to flooding concerns.
