This Indicator Report provides a monthly snapshot of the regional response to the South Sudan Situation. The indicators included report on the Post 15 December 2013 South Sudan caseload only. The report is prepared through collaboration with the reporting country and the Regional Support Hub, Nairobi.

The notes below provide further contextual information on various sector indicators:



POPULATION

Due to limited access by UNHCR and partners in the most affected areas in Blue Nile, White Nile and South and West Kordofan states, estimates provided are collations of various Government of Sudan agencies (Humanitarian Aid Commission, HAC, and Commission of Voluntary and Humanitarian Work, CVHW), local partners (Sudanese Red Crescent Society, SRCS, AORD, and ASSIST) and IOM. HAC and SRCS provide new arrivals estimates from border points mainly at Joda, Al Kueik, Gedeid and El Leri.

The sharp increase of population figures in West Kordofan state is due to recently available verified data. For over half a year, a constant figure of nearly 4,000 had been reported due to lack of verifiable information of the population in the state. Following several inter agency missions to the state, the figure of nearly 18,000 has been confirmed (the figure does not include pre-2013 caseload estimated at about 10,000 individuals). This figure may change when forms of registration are conducted. In South Kordofan, a further revision of population sites and numbers per site led to a reduction of nearly 4,000. It is reported from UNHCR and Government sources from the state that a significant onward movement occurs from the Kordofan states to other areas in Sudan, mainly to White Nile state. In Khartoum state, about 405 families (2,005 individuals) were relocated to Jabal Aulia (also known locally as Bantju). This adds to about 1,228 families (7,368 individuals) that were relocated from Shagara open area to Jabal Aulia. About 104 Nuer families, who declined to be moved to Jabal Aulia, still remain in Shagara as preparations to move them to White Nile continue.

Individual registration with bio-metrics began in Jouri camp on the 15th April. It is projected that the individual registration would be completed in the four camps of Al Redais 1 and 2, Jouri and Al Kashafa before the end June. A significant reduction in the population compared to the one identified during household registration.

The figures for the number of children are available only in locations where household registration has been conducted.



CHILD PROTECTION

Child specific information and services are only available for the White Nile camps where over 90% of refugees have undergone standard UNHCR Level 1 registration and basic camp facilities have been developed. Information is available for the Jabal Aulia population relocated from Shagara and Andalus (the relocation was preceded by household registration conducted in November 2014). For the rest of the locations, information will be available once some forms of registration are conducted and enhanced UNHCR and partners' presence is secured. BIAs and BIDs have not yet to be conducted in most locations partly because of limited access to the areas. UNHCR is working on partnerships with the Ministry of Social Welfare, MOSW, so as to ensure that BIAs and BIDs assessments are conducted and targeted assistance is provided.

In the White Nile state, child friendly spaces (CFS) information is available only for four camps, (Jory, Alagaya, Al-Redes 1 and Alkashafa). The current CFS only target children aged 3-6 years. The figures are based on reports from SRCS and Plan Sudan as of the end of February. No updates are available in March since the partnership agreement between Plan Sudan and UNICEF ceased in February 2015.

Preliminary data for separated/unaccompanied children is now available in (Jory, Alagaya, Al-Redes 1 and Alkashafa). More data will be available to be covering all 7 camps after finishing the individual registration.

Birth Registration:

An agreement between UNHCR and the Government of Sudan (Ministry of Health's Statistics department (MOH) and the Civil Registry) on birth registration was signed. Under the agreement, the MOH will issue birth notifications while the Civil Registry will subsequently issue birth certificates. To date, MOH Statistics Department has registered 482 children born between January and December 2014, who will be receiving birth notifications and subsequently birth certificates.

Capacity building:

245 participants represented CP partners, from INGOs and government counterparts Child Protection Network Committees, host community, teachers, and community leaders trained in different area of child protection



EDUCATION

Education figures for pre-primary and secondary school enrolment are unavailable in all locations. The number of children enrolled in primary schools is available for the settlements in the White Nile (Jory, Alagaya, Debat Bosin, Al-Redes 1 & 2 and Al-Kashafa). The figures are based on reports from SRCS as of the end of February. No updates are available in March since school are closed. The figures had fluctuated in the recent months due to the on-going relocation. A noticeable reduction in the number of children going to primary school was noted in January and February. This coupled with the sharp increase in the total of number of children has led to a significant reduction of the Gross Enrollment Rate, GER. The GER is calculated by obtaining the percentage of the yield of the total number of children enrolled in primary school divided by the number of children in the age cohort of 5-11. The more accurate representation of the age of primary school going children in Sudan (6-13 years) will not be available until individual registration is conducted.



SEXUAL AND GENDER BASED VIOLENCE

Information on SGBV in CoO, transit and CoA is yet to be systematically collected. This may be attributed to the sensitivity of the subject in these area.

Sanitary materials:

86% of women in the reproductive age (estimated to be 25% of the population) currently have been provided with sanitary materials to last until mid-2015. The remaining 14% will be covered shortly.



WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE



HEALTH

Health related information is obtained from WHO. The data is provided per disease per state, rather than per camp/site. When data is available per camp/site, it will be reported in the format of this report.



ENERGY

Datae is not available.



NUTRITION

Nutrition data for South Kordfoan and Khartoum states are only available at state level due to the manner it was compiled by UNICEF. In the coming reporting, data per population site, where available, will be reported.
