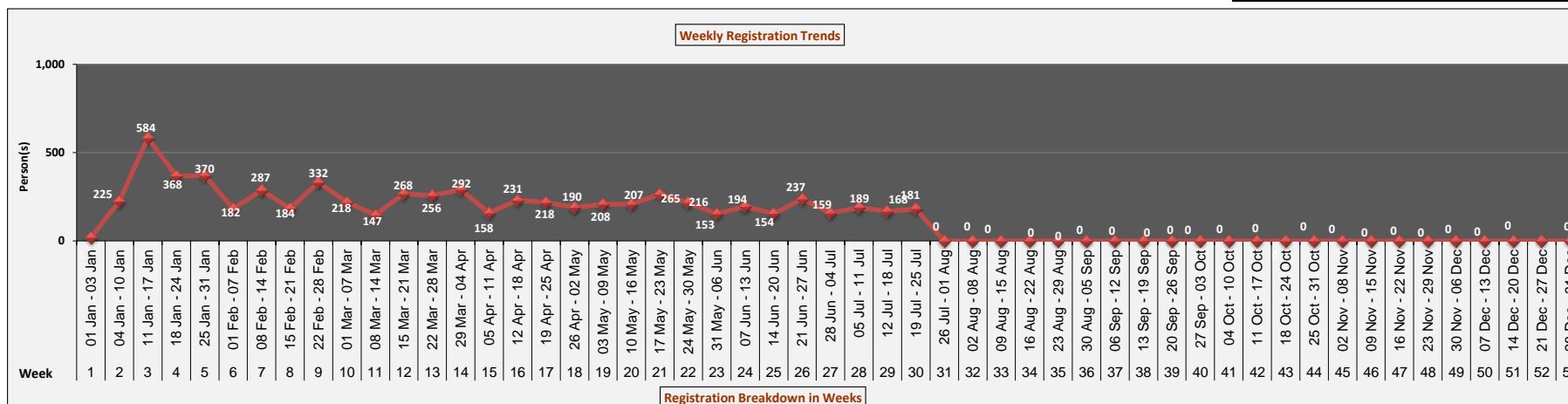
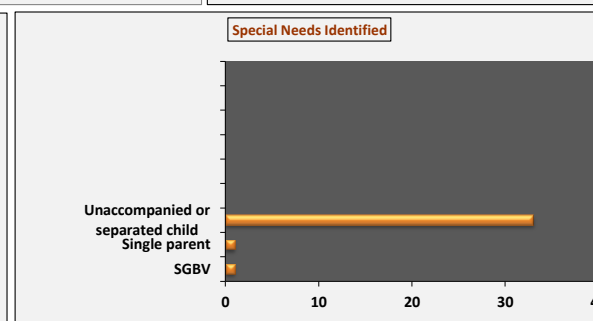
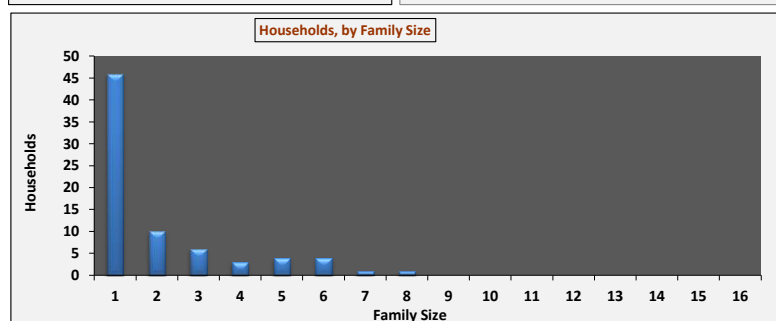
NOTES:

A total of **6,860** new arrivals have been registered since the start of 2015; with 419 arriving from Burundi, 484 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 123 from Ethiopia, 16 from Rwanda, 203 from Somalia, 4,733 from South Sudan, 805 from Sudan, and 77 from Uganda. In addition, the Sub-Office has received **34** South Sudanese 'returnees' and their records reactivated; bringing the total arrivals figure to **6,894**

The total new born babies so far registered in 2015 is **2,436**.

181 individuals were registered during the thirtieth week of 2015 [**19th - 25th July 2015**]; 15 from Burundi, 18 from Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), 1 from Ethiopia, 8 from Somalia, 124 from South Sudan, 14 from Sudan and 1 from Uganda. As of 26th July 2015, the overall registered population in Kakuma Refugee Camp stood at **181,175** (a slight reduction from the end of June 2015 figure which is attributed to the inactivation of HR1 individuals who did not show up for the SIM equipping exercise during the 1st Cycle of July '15. The individuals may be re-activated once they present themselves at the registration desk upon return to Kakuma R. Camp).

The average family size registered during the reporting period stood at 2.4 individuals. Family size 1 households represented **61.33%** of all newly registered households.



NB: This report reflects registration trends. In addition to new arrivals reported here, the overall population in Kakuma also increases through new births, in-situ registration (of persons who arrived in a previous period but reported for registration later), family reunification, and various other data adjustments. Analysis and projections are based on actual persons registered in the UNHCR registration database (proGres)
